Things to Know

- Max Homa becomes the fifth player to claim his first victory at the Wells Fargo Championship
- Justin Rose collects his third consecutive top-five finish at the Wells Fargo Championship
- Joel Dahmen claims career-best finish in his 64th PGA TOUR start
- Sergio Garcia posts a score in the 60s in each of the final two rounds for the first time since the 2018 Valspar Championship

- Offset a lone bogey at the par-3 17th with five birdies to claim his first career PGA TOUR win by three strokes at the age of 28 years, 5 months, 2 days
- The three-stroke win at 15-under 269 is the largest margin of victory on the PGA TOUR since Dustin Johnson won by five strokes at the 2019 World Golf Championships-Mexico Championship
- With the win, collects 500 FedExCup points and moves from No. 138 to 35th with 669 points. It took 377 points to qualify for the FedExCup Playoffs in 2018, 809 for the BMW Championship and 1,432 for the TOUR Championship
- With the win, is fully exempt through the 2020-21 season
- The victory earns him a spot in the PGA Championship in two weeks, as well as the Charles Schwab Challenge and the Memorial Tournament presented by Nationwide. Among the 2019-20 fields in which he earns a spot include the Sentry Tournament of Champions, PLAYERS Championship and Masters Tournament
- Earns 1,000 points towards making the 2019 U.S. Presidents Cup team
- Made his third start at the Wells Fargo Championship (T76/2015, MC/2017, 1st/2019)
- Becomes the fifth player to make the Wells Fargo Championship his first career PGA TOUR win, joining Anthony Kim (2008), Rory McIlroy (2010), Rickie Fowler (2012) and Derek Ernst (2013)
- Made a return to the PGA TOUR by virtue of finishing 15th on the 2018 Web.com Tour Finals money list

- In 2016-17, missed 15 36-hole cuts and a 54-hole cut in 17 starts on the PGA TOUR. He finished 71st at the 2017 Barbasol Championship
- The 13th player this season (26 individual stroke-play events) to convert a 54-hole lead/co-lead into victory
- Becomes the seventh player to convert a 54-hole lead/co-lead into victory at the Wells Fargo Championship
- Marks his fourth top-10 finish on the PGA TOUR. Previous best was a T6 at the 2015 Sony Open in Hawaii
- Two-time winner on the Web.com Tour
- 2013 University of California-Berkeley alum earned All-America honors with the Bears and won the 2013 NCAA individual championship

Joel Dahmen (2nd/-12)

- Followed back-to-back 66s in rounds one and two with a pair of 70s on the weekend to claim his career-best finish in his 64th start. Previous best was a T2 at the 2018 John Deere Classic
- With the runner-up finish, is projected to move inside the top-30 in the FedExCup standings to No. 29
- Was making his third start at the Wells Fargo Championship (MC/2017, T16/2018, 2nd/2019)
- Marks his second top-10 finish of the season (T9/Farmers Insurance Open)

Justin Rose (3rd/-11)

- Posted back-to-back 3-under 68s on the weekend to finish alone in third at 11-under 273
- Reigning FedExCup champion was making eighth start at the Wells Fargo Championship, having now finished inside the top five in each of his last three appearances (5th/2014, 3rd/2016, 3rd/2019)
- Marks his fifth top-10 finish in eight starts this season
- Was in search of his second win of the season (Farmers Insurance Open) and 11th on the PGA TOUR
- Was making his first start since missing the cut at the Masters Tournament

Jason Dufner (T4/-9)

- 54-hole co-leader posted a 2-over 73 in the final round as he sought his sixth career PGA TOUR win and first since the 2017 Memorial Tournament
- Claims his first top-10 finish since a T5 at the 2018 PLAYERS Championship
- Best finish in 15 starts this season before this week was a T21 at the Mayakoba Golf Classic
- In six starts at the event, has finished T4 (2019), T5 (2009), T42 (2018) and missed three cuts

Sergio Garcia (T4/-9)

- With weekend scores of 65-68, posted a score in the 60s in each of the final two rounds for the first time since the 2018 Valspar Championship
- Was making his ninth appearance at Wells Fargo Championship with T2 in 2005 his only previous top-10 finish
- Was making his first start in the event since 2013 (T16)
- Claims his fifth top-10 finish of the season in his ninth start. Comes off a T2 finish at last week's Zurich Classic, partnered with Tommy Fleetwood
- Was in search of his 11th career PGA TOUR win and first since the 2017 Masters Tournament

Miscellaneous notes

- Paul Casey made just two pars on his first 10 holes in the final round en route to a 2-under 69 and T4 honors at 9-under 275
- Following a 71-70 start, 2012 Wells Fargo Championship winner **Rickie Fowler** posted weekend scores of 66-68 to finish T4 at 9-under 275
- 2010 and 2015 Wells Fargo Championship winner **Rory McIlroy** followed a bogey at No. 9 with a double-bogey at the par-5 10th en route to a 2-over 73. Finished T8 at 7-under 277
- Defending champion Jason Day finished T24 at 4-under 280. Dating to the event's 2003 inception, no player has successfully defended his title
