Things to Know

- After falling to Bubba Watson, 7 and 6, in the Championship Match last year, Kevin Kisner returns to the Championship Match for the second consecutive year after defeating Francesco Molinari, 1-up. Kisner will face Matt Kuchar, the 2013 WGC-Dell Technologies Match Play champion, after Kuchar beat Lucas Bjerregaard, 1-up.
- Championship Match by seed: Kuchar (23) vs Kisner (48).
- Consolation Match by seed: Francesco Molinari (7) vs Lucas Bjerregaard (50).
- Kuchar vs Kisner in the Championship Match is a rematch of the fourth round in 2018, when Kisner eliminated Kuchar, 1-up.
- Kuchar (age 40) is bidding to become the oldest champion in WGC-Dell Technologies Match Play history.
- Regardless of the Championship Match outcome, Kuchar will move to No. 1 in the FedExCup standings and pass Rory McIlroy.
- Lucas Bjerregaard needs to win the Consolation Match for a solo-third place finish to earn Special Temporary
 Membership on the PGA TOUR. Bjerregaard entered the week with 95 non-member FedExCup points and needs to
 equal No. 150 from last year's FedExCup points list, which was Ben Martin with 266 points to receive Special
 Temporary Membership. Third-place this week receives 200 FedExCup points, which would put Bjerregaard over
 the threshold.

• Of the 17 countries represented in the field, both finalists are from the United States, with Italy (Molinari) and Denmark (Bjerregaard) represented in the Consolation Match.

- Kuchar advanced to the Championship Match after making birdies on Nos. 16 and 17 to hold off Lucas Bjerregaard, 1-up, after Bjerregaard squared the match on the 15th hole with a birdie of his own.
- 40-year-old Kuchar is seeking to become the oldest champion in tournament history, as no player in his 40s has ever won the WGC-Dell Technologies Match Play
- 2013 champion Matt Kuchar advanced to the Championship Match for the second time in his career. In his 2013 victory, Kuchar beat Hunter Mahan, the 2012 champion who had advanced to the Championship Match in back-to-back years.
- Kuchar could become the first player on the PGA TOUR to win three times during the 2018-19 Season, having previously won the 2018 Mayakoba Golf Classic and the 2019 Sony Open in Hawaii. Kuchar is bidding to become the first player since Steve Stricker in 2009 to record three or more victories after turning 40.
- Regardless of the Championship Match outcome, Kuchar will move to No. 1 in the FedExCup standings and pass Rory McIlroy.
- Lucas Bjerregaard needs to win the consolation match for a solo-third place finish to earn Special Temporary
 Membership on the PGA TOUR. Bjerregaard entered the week with 95 non-member FedExCup points and needs to
 equal No. 150 from last year's FedExCup points list, which was Ben Martin with 266 points to receive Special
 Temporary Membership. Third-place this week receives 200 FedExCup points, which would put Bjerregaard over
 the threshold.
- Bjerregaard will post his best finish on the PGA TOUR this week. His previous best was a T12 at The Honda Classic
 in March.

- Kisner handed Francesco Molinari his first loss of the week with a par at the last after Molinari three-putted. The match was tied through 11 holes, but Kisner won the 12th with a birdie and the 14th with a par before Molinari tied the match with birdies on Nos. 16 and 17.
- After losing his opening match to Ian Poulter, 2-up, Kisner could become the first player in tournament history to lose his opening match and still win the WGC-Dell Technologies Match Play.
- Kuchar vs Kisner in the Championship Match is a rematch of the fourth round in 2018, when Kisner eliminated Kuchar, 1-up.

- Kisner is the fifth player to advance to the Championship Match in back-to-back years, joining Tiger Woods (2003, 2004), Geoff Ogilvy (2006, 2007), Paul Casey (2009, 2010), Hunter Mahan (2012, 2013).
- Kisner needed three extra holes to advance out of Group 14 this week, beating Poulter with a birdie on the third playoff hole Friday. Kisner is seeking to join Rory McIlroy as the only players to advance out of the Group Stage in a playoff and go on to win the championship.
- The two-time PGA TOUR winner is currently 30th in the United States Presidents Cup standings; he went 2-0-2 on the winning United States team in 2017 in his lone Presidents Cup appearance at Liberty National
- This week's finish will be Kisner's first top-10 showing since a T7 at The RSM Classic in 2018
- Molinari made the Semifinals for the first time in his ninth career appearance in the WGC-Dell Technologies Match Play
