ShotLink Keys to Victory for Phil Mickelson

Phil Mickelson won his 43rd career PGA TOUR event in his 578th career start at the age of 47 years, 8 months, 16 days. Mickelson became the oldest winner of a World Golf Championships event. With his win at the 2018 WGC-Mexico Championship, Mickelson moved from 17th to third in the FedExCup standings and marked the 158th week he ranked inside the top-five of the standings since 2007.
