Dustin Johnson (-11/1st)

- Followed bogey-free 64 in round one with bogey-free 67. Only player in the field bogey-free through 36 holes
- Making 11th appearance at the WGC-Mexico Championship and counts 2017 and 2015 victories among five top-10s in 10 starts
- Holds 36-hole lead/co-lead on PGA TOUR for the 17th time, most recently at 2018 U.S. Open (3rd). Gone on to win eight of previous 16 times, most recently at 2018 FedEx St. Jude Classic

- Hit 7/14 fairways in second round compared to 11/14 in first round. Needed 33 putts compared to 27 in round one
- Has two top-10 finishes in four starts this season (T4/Sentry Tournament of Champions, T9/Genesis Open)

Rory McIlroy (-9/T2)

- Started birdie, birdie, par, birdie before adding 6s at Nos. 6 and 9 to turn in even-par. Posted eight pars and one birdie (No. 14) on the back nine for 1-under 70
- Six top-10s in nine previous appearances at WGC-Mexico Championship, including T7 in 2017 at Chapultepec
- Three top-five results in four starts this season (T54/WGC-HSBC Champions, T4/Sentry Tournament of Champions, T5/Farmers Insurance Open, T4/Genesis Open)
- First-round 63 marked his lowest opening round at a World Golf Championships event

Matt Kuchar (-9/T2)

- Began the second round with four birdies en route to 4-under 67
- Making 10th appearance at the WGC-Mexico Championship with best finish a T3 in his tournament debut in 2010
- Has three top-ten finishes in in seven starts this season, including two wins (2018 Mayakoba Golf Classic/2019 Sony Open in Hawaii)
- Seeking to become the first player since Steve Stricker (2009) to win three or more times in a season past the age of 40

Sergio Garcia (-7/T4)

- Started second round with three consecutive birdies en route to 5-under 66
- Improved off the tee, hitting 12/14 fairways compared to 5/14 in first round
- Lone PGA TOUR start this season resulted in T37 at Genesis Open
- With 10 PGA TOUR wins, remains in search of his first official World Golf Championships title while making his 56th official appearance in a WGC event
- Owns second-most top-10 finishes in the WGC-Mexico Championship (8), trailing only Tiger Woods (12)
- Of eight top-10s in 18 previous appearances in this event, three have been T3 results (2005, 2007, 2013)

Tommy Fleetwood (-7/T4)

- Started second round with consecutive eagle 2s at No.1 (18'11" putt) and No. 2 (holed out from 39 yards) en route to 6-under 65
- Last time back-to-back eagles were recorded on TOUR was also in Mexico: Patton Kizzire/R1/No.5, No. 6/2018
 Mayakoba Golf Classic
- Last time a player started a round on TOUR with consecutive eagles was Sean O'Hair in 2009 at WGC-Mexico Championship, when it was contested at Doral Resort & Spa
- Finished runner-up in this event in 2017, one of three previous appearances (T71/2015, 2nd/2017, T14/2018)

Tiger Woods (-5/T8)

- Strung together six birdies and a lone bogey (No. 17) for 5-under 66
- Hit 13/18 greens in both first and second rounds but made 108' 2" of putts in second round compared to 72' 0" in first round
- 66 marks his second-lowest round this season (65/R3/Genesis Open)
- Began tournament by hitting opening tee shot out-of-bounds leading to a double bogey
- Competing in Mexico for the first time in his career. The last time he won at a course he was playing for the first time was the 2006 edition of this event, when he won by eight strokes.

Miscellaneous Notes

- Following a double bogey at his opening hole (No. 10), England's Ian Poulter reeled off seven birdies and two bogeys to shoot a second-consecutive 68 and sit T6 at 6-under. Poulter leads the field in total birdies with 13
- Australian Cameron Smith (-6/T6) is one of 16 players making their first appearance at WGC-Mexico Championship
- Thailand's Kiradech Aphibarnrat's (-5/T8) best result in 46 PGA TOUR starts is T3/2013 CIMB Classic, but he also owns three top-five finishes in WGC events (T5/2018 WGC-Mexico Championship, T5/2018 WGC-Dell Technologies Match Play, T4/2018 WGC-HSBC Champions)

- Mexico's highest-ranked player Abraham Ancer, paired with Tiger Woods for the first two rounds, sits T35 after rounds of 71-72
- Three players are making their first start in a World Golf Championships event Jake McLeod (-3/T16), Aaron Rai (+2/T39), Eddie Pepperell (+5/T58)

- Making his 600th official start on the PGA TOUR, defending champion Phil Mickelson (+2/T39) followed a first-round 79 with a bogey-free 65 while seeking to join Tiger Woods (7) as the only players with three or more WGC-Mexico Championship victories
- Rickie Fowler (+2/T39) suffered a one-stroke penalty for taking an improper drop (dropped from shoulder height instead of knee height) at his opening hole (No. 10), leading to a triple-bogey 7
