Second-Round Notes - Friday, August 2, 2019

Weather: Mostly cloudy, with a high of 81. Wind SSE 4-8 mph. Due to 3.17 inches of rain overnight, preferred lies were utilized for the second consecutive day.

Cut: 83 players at 4-under 136 from a field of 156 professionals. With more than 78 players advancing to the weekend, a 54-hole cut will take place to reduce the field to the low 70 and ties for the final round.

Things to Know

- First-round co-leader Byeong Hun An is bogey-free through two rounds as he takes the outright lead
- Adam Svensson becomes just the seventh player (first this season) since 1983 with multiple rounds of 61 or better in a season
- Patton Kizzire joins Phil Mickelson as the only players since 1983 with multiple instances of back-to-back eagles in a season
- Kizzire joins Bill Haas as the only players with back-to-back eagles since this event moved back to Sedgefield CC in 2008
- 4-under 136 represents the lowest cut in Wyndham Championship history
- Players currently projected to move into the Top 125 in the FedExCup: Patton Kizzire, Shawn Stefani
- Players currently projected to fall out of the Top 125 in the FedExCup: Robert Streb, Alex Noren

Byeong Hun An (-13/1st)

- Followed career-low 8-under 62 (previously 64) with a 5-under 65 to move into the outright lead
- One of four players bogey-free through 36 holes (Paul Casey, Anirban Lahiri, J.T. Poston)

- At 13-under 127, betters his previous best opening 36-hole score by five strokes (132 2018 BMW Championship/T29, 2017 Waste Management Phoenix Open/6th)
- Leads the field in Strokes Gained: Tee To Green (+8.303); T1 in Sand Saves (1/1) and Scrambling (6/6)
- Marks the second time to lead/co-lead after the second round (2017 Waste Management Phoenix Open/6th)
- In two previous starts at the Wyndham Championship, finished T18 in 2015 and missed the cut in 2017
- Comes off top-20 finishes in three of his last five starts, highlighted by a T13 at the Rocket Mortgage Classic
- Three-time runner up seeks his first PGA TOUR title in his 94th start

Additional Player Notes

- 2018 Corales Puntacana Resort & Club Championship winner **Brice Garnett** (2nd) is making his fifth start at the Wyndham Championship, including back-to-back T20 finishes in his last two starts (2016, 2018); is now a combined 36-under in his last three starts at Sedgefield Country Club
- Making his first start in the Wyndham Championship, first-round co-leader Sungjae Im (T3) followed up a career-low 62 (previously 64) with a 3-under 67 to better his best 36-hole score by three strokes; of six top-10 finishes this season, three have been top-5 showings
- With eagles on Nos. 5 and 6 en route to a second-round 6-under 64, Patton Kizzire (T3) becomes just the second player with back-to-back eagles since the event returned to Sedgefield Country Club in 2008 (Bill Haas/2012/R2/Nos. 14 & 15); joins Phil Mickelson (2001 Buick Open and Open Championship) as the only players since 1983 with multiple instances of back-to-back eagles in a season (2018 Mayakoba Golf Classic/R1/Nos. 5 & 6)
- Adam Svensson (T3) equaled his career-low round on TOUR (2019 Sony Open in Hawaii/R1) with a 9-under 61; in addition to becoming the first player this season with two rounds of 61 or better (61/Sony Open in Hawaii/R1), he becomes just the seventh player since 1983 to perform the feat on the PGA TOUR; en route to the 61, equaled the TOUR's low nine-hole score this season with a 7-under 28 on Sedgefield Country Club's front side
- After missing the cut in 10 of his first 15 starts of the season (with a T40 at the Desert Classic his best showing), Josh
 Teater (T3) has now made the cut in eight of his last nine starts; the best of his three top-25 finishes this season have
 come in his last two starts (T6/Barbasol Championship, T13/Barracuda Championship)
- After runner-up finishes in two of his last four starts (T2/RBC Canadian Open, 2/WGC-FedEx St. Jude Invitational), 2011
 Wyndham Championship winner Webb Simpson sits T3; after entering the week No. 13 in the FedExCup standings, is currently projected to move to No. 10 in the Wyndham Rewards Top 10; coming off solo-third and T2 Wyndham Championship finishes from 2017 and 2018, respectively
- Mackenzie Hughes followed a 7-under 63 with a 4-under 66 to move to T3; seeking second PGA TOUR victory (2016 The RSM Classic)
- Making his first start in the Wyndham Championship since losing in a playoff to Patrick Reed in 2013, Jordan Spieth (T12) trails Byeong Hun An by four strokes; coming off of a T12 last week at the WGC-FedEx St. Jude Invitational, the 11-time PGA TOUR winner is currently projected to move from No. 67 to No. 63 in the FedExCup standings
- In his bid to join Sam Snead (1949-50, 1955-56) as players to successfully defend his title, 2007 and 2018 tournament champion **Brandt Snedeker** (T38) posted a second-round even-par 70, just the ninth time in 42 rounds he failed to turn in a sub-70 score at this event
- A couple of the TOUR's most recent winners are well positioned heading into the final 36 holes, with 3M Open winner **Matthew Wolff** and Barracuda Championship winner **Collin Morikawa** at T19 and T27, respectively
- After his second shot on the par-4 13th hole, **Brendan Steele** (MC) used an alignment rod (training aid) in breach of Rule 4-3, with the two-stroke penalty leading to a double-bogey on the hole
- Danny Lee did not complete his round and was disqualified

FedExCup Notes

As the final event in the PGA TOUR Season, the Wyndham Championship offers the final opportunity for players to improve their FedExCup positions heading into the Playoffs, or in some instances, move into the top 125 in the FedExCup standings and qualify for the first Playoffs event, THE NORTHERN TRUST.

Seven of the last nine players ranked 125th in the standings entering the Wyndham Championship remained inside the cut line entering the FedExCup Playoffs. Last season, Tyrone Van Aswegen was one of the two exceptions, dropping from 125th to No. 127 following his missed cut at Sedgefield Country Club.

Wyndham Rewards Top 10

- The top 10 in the FedExCup after this week share a \$10 million bonus through the Wyndham Rewards Top 10 program
- With a win or solo-second, Paul Casey (T9) would earn \$1.1 million via a fourth-place finish in the Wyndham Rewards Top 10
- Players in this week's field within 500 points of the Wyndham Rewards Top 10 (Wyndham Championship position/Wyndham Rewards projection): Webb Simpson (T3/10th), Chez Reavie (T27/14th), Charles Howell III (T12/15th), Sungjae Im (T3/21st), Scott Piercy (T53/27th), Hideki Matsuyama (MC/30th), Lucas Glover (T53/31st) and Corey Conners (T53/32nd)

Aon Risk Reward Challenge

The inaugural Aon Risk Reward Challenge concludes this week, where two players still have a mathematical chance of overtaking Brooks Koepka and claiming the \$1 million prize. Jason Kokrak needs to record a double-eagle and an eagle on the par 5, 15th hole, while Alex Noren needs two double-eagles to overtake Koepka. Unlikely, but not impossible as proven by Fabian Gomez's albatross on No. 15 during his opening round of the 2011 Wyndham Championship. Koepka and Jason Day are currently tied atop the Aon Risk Reward Challenge season-long standings, but Koepka is projected to win the tie-breaker based on common performances on the Aon Risk Reward Challenge designated holes this season.
