MEDIA INFORMATION

The information in this guide will assist all recognized media personnel with coverage of the 2019 Zurich Classic of New Orleans. A limited number of media credentials are available and will only be issued to recognized working personnel who have been approved by the PGA TOUR. Guests and non-working personnel will not be granted media credentials. Credentials may be claimed in the Media Center according to the schedule below. Please direct all media requests and correspondence to:

MEDIA CENTER

The Media Center is located to the right of the clubhouse. Only working media with the proper credentials will be allowed to use the media facility. Hours of operation are as follows:

- Wednesday, April 24 7:00 a.m. – 6:00 p.m.

- Saturday, April 27 7:00 a.m. – 8:00 p.m.
- Sunday, April 28 7:00 a.m. – 8:00 p.m.

TELEPHONES

If you need a personal telephone throughout tournament week, please state this in your credential request.

RADIO

One radio booth is available on a first-come, first-serve basis.

FOOD AND BEVERAGE

Coffee, soft drinks, water and snacks will be available in the Media Center all day. Breakfast and lunch are available beginning Monday, April 22, 2019, in the media dining area.

PARKING

Media personnel must have proper parking credential.

Directions:

From Downtown New Orleans (Approximately 15 miles), take the Greater New Orleans Bridge over the Mississippi River to the Westbank Expressway US 90. Continue on the Expressway for approximately 13 miles, go past the Alario Center / Segnette Blvd. traffic light and proceed on US 90 West. Continue on US 90 West to the traffic light at Lapalco Blvd., turn left, stay in the right lane and then follow the signs for Valet Parking.

From I-10, exit on Clearview Parkway and proceed to the Huey P. Long Bridge. Cross the bridge and continue on US 90 West to the second traffic light at Lapalco Blvd., turn left, stay in the right lane and then follow the signs for Valet Parking.

From Baton Rouge (Approximately 70 miles), from I-10 Eastbound take exit I-310 South. Continue on I-310 for approximately 10 miles until you reach US 90 East, turn left at the traffic light and proceed on US 90 East for approximately 13 miles. Continue on US 90 East to the traffic light at Lapalco Blvd., turn right, stay in left lane and then follow the signs for Valet Parking.

GENERAL REGULATIONS

All media must read and sign the official PGA TOUR Media Regulations available at www.pgatourmedia.com.

The following regulations are to be followed by all members of the media:

- An armband is necessary to walk inside the gallery ropes. Remain not more than an arm's length from the ropes, so as to blend into the gallery and appear to be a part of the gallery at all times.
- Players are not to be distracted during play. Do not interview players or ask them to pose for photographs during their rounds.
- Do not interview players or ask them to pose for photographs during their practice sessions before a round, except by prior arrangement with the player.
- If an interview is to be conducted in the practice areas, either the range or the putting green, it must be done by prior arrangement with the player, up against the ropes and not in the middle of the areas where it could be distracting to other players.
- Do not disturb players at their 18th green and/or scoring tent until after they have checked, signed and returned their scorecards. Media are not allowed in the scoring tent.

WORKING PRESS REGULATIONS

To avoid embarrassment to you and distraction to the contestants:

- Do not walk or stand in playing areas.
- Follow directions of marshals and other officials.
- Do not interview during play. The leading player each day – and others requested – will be interviewed following their rounds.

AUDIO AND VIDEO RECORDING REGULATIONS

1. All recording should be done in the proximity of the Press Room and/or interview area outside Scoring.
2. Audio and Video recorders are not permitted in the locker room.
3. Audio and Video recorders are not permitted within the playing area of the golf course unless written permission has been granted by the PGA TOUR.

WEATHER DELAY GUIDELINES

During weather delay situations, no one other than players and essential staff will be permitted in the locker room. This means the media are not permitted in the locker room in such situations. However, whenever possible, arrangements will be made for interviews during such situations.

PHOTOGRAPHY REGULATIONS

Photo credentials will be issued only to personnel on assignment from recognized and accredited publications or news services. Requests for credentials must be made by the appropriate news agency, not by the photographer.

Photographic likenesses of PGA TOUR, PGA TOUR Champions and Web.com Tour players may be used only for legitimate media outlet coverage of the events in which they are competing.

Commercial exploitation of these likenesses without written consent of the players and PGA TOUR is prohibited.

A limited number of photo armbands (or photo bibs), which permit the wearer access inside the gallery ropes, may be issued. Photographers and photographic assistants who do not have armbands or bibs must stay outside the gallery ropes. Photographic assistants will not be issued armbands.

Cameras may be used only by accredited media representatives who have been assigned photo credentials, and such use is subject to the following conditions:

- Photographers with photo armbands must stay within one arm's length of the ropes at all times.
Photographers without armbands are not permitted inside the ropes at any time.

- The use of golf carts is prohibited at all times.
- Photographers must not position themselves in the line of play. If requested to move by a player, his caddie or an official, the photographer will do so without delay or discussion.
- No photograph shall be taken until a player has completed his stroke.
- Players should not be asked to pose during a round.
- Noise-free equipment must be used at all times.
- Cameras are not permitted in the scoring tent or in the locker rooms.

The Photographer shall indemnify, defend and hold the Tournament and the PGA TOUR and their respective officers, agents, representatives, successors and the liabilities (including reasonable attorney's fees and expenses) incurred by, arising from, or in connection with (1) the unauthorized use of photographs taken by the Photographer, whether such unauthorized use is by the Photographer, the company designating the Photographer to use the credential on its behalf, or some third party to whom the photographs are distributed;

(2) any injuries resulting from acts or omissions by the Photographer or some third party to whom the Photographer directly or indirectly distributed the material; (3) any cameras, wires, cables or other equipment brought to the premises by the Photographer; or (4) the use of any photographs of any matter other than coverage of the Tournament.

Photographer lockers will be available for equipment storage during Media Center hours.

PGA TOUR Media Regulations

These Media Regulations establish the terms by which a media outlet and its representatives may request, receive and use credentials to access PGA TOUR tournaments for news and editorial purposes. These Media Regulations form a binding contract between PGA TOUR, Inc. ("PGA TOUR"), a Media Outlet and its Credential Holders (as defined below). In consideration of receiving credentials from PGA TOUR under these Media Regulations, each Media Outlet and its Credential Holders accept and agree to these Media Regulations.

SECTION I. GENERAL TERMS

1. PGA TOUR Holds Exclusive Media Rights. PGA TOUR holds the exclusive right to provide media outlets and their representatives with access to Tournaments. All media rights in and to Tournaments, including rights to all forms of audio, video and photography, are held exclusively by PGA TOUR. For purposes of these Media Regulations, "Tournaments" means all sanctioned tournaments on the PGA TOUR, PGA TOUR Champions, Web.com Tour, PGA TOUR Latinoamérica, Mackenzie Tour – PGA TOUR Canada and PGA TOUR China (the "Tours"), including the competition, practice rounds (including pro-ams), qualifiers, practice areas, hospitality areas and all surrounding events and areas at the tournament site(s) on all tournament days (typically Monday - Sunday). A "Media Day" preceding the week of a Tournament will also be a considered part of the Tournament for purposes of these Media Regulations, unless otherwise specifically set forth in these Media Regulations.
2. Overview of Credentials. PGA TOUR issues credentials under these Media Regulations solely to approved individuals ("Credential Holders") representing an approved media outlet ("Media Outlet"). A credential authorizes a Credential Holder, on a temporary and conditional basis, to access a Tournament on behalf of his/her Media Outlet and collect and distribute certain content for news and editorial purposes in accordance with these Media Regulations. Credentials are issued either for a specific Tournament (e.g., to a local outlet) or on a season-long basis.
3. Credential Requests. Credential requests for Tournaments (including Media Days) must be submitted by a Media Outlet for its desired Credential Holders through PGA TOUR's credentialing system. Credential requests from a Media Outlet must include the following information:
 - a. Media Outlet. The name of the Media Outlet.
 - b. Credential Holder(s). The individual name(s) of the Media Outlet's desired Credential Holders.
 - c. Competition Photography. The name of each Credential Holder, if any, that desires to be credentialed as "Competition Photographer" (for purposes of having the permission set forth in Section II.5.a below).
4. Credential Approvals. PGA TOUR reserves sole discretion to approve or deny a credential request in whole or in part. If PGA TOUR approves a credential request, PGA TOUR will record the approval in its credentialing system and issue a credential to the approved Credential Holder, setting forth the name of the Credential Holder, his/her Media Outlet and whether the Credential Holder is a Competition Photographer. To receive an issued credential, each Credential Holder and his/her Media Outlet must accept and agree to the approved terms of the credential and these Media Regulations in PGA TOUR's credentialing system.
5. Areas of Access. The specific areas of a Tournament site that each Credential Holder may access are determined on a Tournament-by-Tournament basis. Access to certain areas is limited (e.g., "inside the ropes" and locker room). A Credential Holder may access on-site areas only as permitted by PGA TOUR for the relevant Tournament.
6. News and Editorial Use Only. A Media Outlet and its Credential Holders may use information and other content collected at a Tournament pursuant to these Media Regulations solely in the Media Outlet's news and editorial coverage of the relevant Tournament and/or Tour. Such information and other content: (a) may not be used in any commercial manner (without limiting the sale of non-targeted, standard advertisements on an Approved Platform (as defined in Section II.1 below)); (b) may not be used to imply an official, marketing, endorsement or sponsorship relationship with PGA TOUR or any other Tour, Tournament or player; and (c) may not be sold, distributed, syndicated or licensed to third parties (except pursuant to Section IV.2 below).
7. Revocation of Credentials. PGA TOUR reserves sole discretion to revoke credentials issued under these Media Regulations, and/or the approved terms of a specific credential, in whole or in part at any time.

SECTION II. CONTENT AND PLATFORMS

1. Approved Platforms. Within these Media Regulations, "Approved Platforms" means, with respect to each Media Outlet: (a) the official publications, television channels, websites, software applications ("apps") and social media accounts that are operated by the Media Outlet and branded with the brand of the Media Outlet; and (b) the personal social media accounts of the Media Outlet's Credential Holders (e.g., a reporter's personal Twitter account); provided, however, that such personal accounts may be

used solely in the course of a Credential Holder representing his/her Media Outlet under these Media Regulations to complement the Media Outlet's news and editorial coverage of the relevant Tournament and/or Tour. PGA TOUR may revoke the rights set forth in these Media Regulations with respect to one or more Approved Platforms of a Media Outlet in whole or in part at any time in its sole discretion.

2. Information and Data.

a. Collection of Information. A Credential Holder may collect information at Tournaments and report such information via Approved Platforms as part of his/her Media Outlet's news and editorial coverage of the relevant Tournament and/or Tour, subject to the terms and conditions of these Media Regulations.

b. Use of Data. Any and all feeds of scoring data, statistical information and other data provided by PGA TOUR to a Media Outlet and/or its Credential Holders at a Tournament are provided solely to enhance the Media Outlet's news and editorial coverage of the Tournament under these Media Regulations (and subject to Section II.9 below). Such data feeds may not be distributed by a Media Outlet and/or Credential Holder in whole or in part unless a separate data license agreement is entered into with PGA TOUR.

3. Video.

a. Commentary / Interviews / Press Conferences. A Credential Holder may capture video of (i) commentary by the Credential Holder in the Media Center (e.g., "stand-up" Tournament updates), (ii) one-on-one interviews by the Credential Holder in the Media Center and any "flash" interview areas designated by PGA TOUR staff, and (iii) interviews organized by PGA TOUR Staff in the Media Center interview room and/or in "flash" interview areas (e.g., "press conferences"). A Credential Holder and/or his/her Media Outlet may distribute such video on a live and/or delayed basis via Approved Platforms. A Credential Holder may not capture video of practice or competition rounds, including any activity on the golf course or in the practice areas, unless permitted under the immediately following paragraph.

b. Practice Areas / Highlights. A Credential Holder, if and only if representing a Media Outlet that owns and operates a linear, 24x7x365 channel distributed via free-to-air, cable, satellite, IPTV and/or OTT platforms that is an Approved Platform, may capture video of interviews from the practice areas and highlights of practice and competition rounds. Such video: (i) may solely be captured for and used in a regularly scheduled news program on such linear channel (and simulcast via the Media Outlet's digital platforms that are Approved Platforms where such linear channel is simulcast on a 24x7x365 basis); (ii) may not be in excess of three (3) minutes in the aggregate per day from each Tour; and (iii) may not be distributed in any geographic market until PGA TOUR's broadcaster(s) of the Tournament in such geographic market has concluded its telecast of that day's live or initial air coverage.

4. Audio. A Credential Holder may capture audio of (a) commentary by the Credential Holder in the Media Center (e.g., "stand-up" Tournament updates), (b) one-on-one interviews by the Credential Holder in the Media Center and any "flash" interview areas designated by PGA TOUR staff and (c) interviews organized by PGA TOUR Staff in the Media Center interview room and/or in "flash" interview areas (e.g., "press conferences"). The Credential Holder and/or his/her Media Outlet may distribute such audio on a [live] and/or delayed basis via Approved Platforms. A Credential Holder may not capture "play-by-play" or similar audio descriptions of practice or competition rounds, including any activity on the golf course or in the practice areas.

5. Photography.

a. Competition Photographers. If a Credential Holder is credentialed as a Competition Photographer, he/she may capture photographs on all Tournament days throughout the Tournament site, including of competition.

b. Non-Competition Photographers. If a Credential Holder is not credentialed as a Competition Photographer:

i. Practice Days. On practice days (typically Monday – Wednesday), the Credential Holder may capture photographs throughout the Tournament site, including of practice areas and practice rounds.

ii. Competition Days. On competition days (typically Thursday – Sunday), the Credential Holder may capture photographs solely of the practice areas, in the Media Center and designated interview areas and of noncompetition areas of the Tournament site (e.g., hospitality areas).

c. Distribution. A Credential Holder and/or his/her Media Outlet may distribute photographs captured at a Tournament solely via Approved Platforms. Such photographs may not be used with real-time or near real-time information or sequenced to create a "shot by shot" or "hole by hole" account of the day's play, nor may photos be sequenced in such a way as to approximate video.

6. Media Days. On Media Days, a Credential Holder may capture video and/or audio of commentary by the Credential Holder, press conferences and interviews by the Credential Holder, and special events at Media Days (e.g., clinics, promotions, etc.). A Credential Holder and/or his/her Media Outlet may distribute such video and/or audio on a live and/or delayed basis via Approved Platforms. Each Credential Holder (whether a Competition or Non-Competition Photographer) may capture photographs of all Media Day activities and distribute such photographs through Approved Platforms as set forth in Section II.5.c immediately above.

7. Timing of Content Distribution. Audio, video, and photos captured at Tournaments may be used and posted in Approved Platforms until (and not after) forty-eight (48) hours following the conclusion of the applicable Tournament. If audio, video, or

photos are used or posted in Approved Platforms prior to such deadline, the Media Outlet and/or Credential Holder will not be required to take down such audio, video, or photos after such deadline unless PGA TOUR requests.

8. Archiving and Aggregation. A Media Outlet and/or Credential Holder may not archive, compile or aggregate content collected and captured at a Tournament pursuant to these Media Regulations, including without limitation for purposes of a gallery, program, show, product or service covering the PGA TOUR, any other Tour(s) and/or Tournament(s).

9. No Real-Time Coverage. A Media Outlet and/or Credential Holder's coverage of a Tournament from on site on any platform may not purport to be, approximate or serve as a substitute for play-by-play, hole-by-hole or real-time coverage of a Tournament via PGA TOUR's official or licensed platforms, as determined by PGA TOUR.

10. Promotion of Coverage. A Media Outlet and/or Credential Holder may not advertise, market, promote or imply the offering of "live" coverage of Tournament action (practice or competition) under these Media Regulations.

11. No Use for Gambling. A Media Outlet and/or Credential Holder shall not capture, collect, distribute or provide to any third party any results, data, content or information at or from a Tournament, or use, distribute or provide to any third party any data provided by PGA TOUR under these Media Regulations, for purposes of or in connection with any gambling, gaming, daily fantasy or similar activity.

12. Ownership. As a condition to receiving credentials hereunder and being provided with access to a Tournament, each Media Outlet and Credential Holder acknowledges and agrees that PGA TOUR is the sole owner of all rights, including all copyrights, in and to all audio and video captured at a Tournament (of golf action or otherwise). Each Media Outlet and Credential Holder hereby assigns to PGA TOUR all such rights, provided that each Media Outlet and Credential Holder is hereby authorized to use such audio and video as expressly permitted under these Media Regulations. At PGA TOUR's request, each Media Outlet and Credential Holder will execute any further documentation reasonably requested and provided by PGA TOUR to effect PGA TOUR's ownership of such audio and video. Further, at PGA TOUR's request, each Media Outlet and Credential Holder will provide PGA TOUR with copies of all such audio and video, and all photography it/he/she captured at a Tournament, at PGA TOUR's cost and expense.

13. Credits. Uses of video pursuant to these Media Regulations, where reasonably practicable and customary, shall be made with a courtesy credit to PGA TOUR.

14. Takedowns. PGA TOUR may issue and/or request takedowns of content captured at a Tournament as applicable in the event of any violation of these Media Regulations. Each Media Outlet and Credential Holder agrees to promptly comply with any such request.

15. Other Content and Platforms. Content and platforms not specifically addressed in these Media Regulations, including virtual and augmented reality, may not be captured at a Tournament or used by a Media Outlet and/or Credential Holder unless set forth in a separate written agreement with PGA TOUR.

SECTION III. ON-SITE CONDUCT GUIDELINES

1. General Conduct Guidelines. For all Credential Holders:

- a. A Credential Holder must present his/her credentials upon entry to a Tournament, at all relevant access points within a Tournament and at the request of PGA TOUR or Tournament staff.
- b. A Credential Holder must follow the directions and instructions of PGA TOUR and Tournament staff while present at a Tournament pursuant to these Media Regulations.
- c. All media recording devices and other equipment must be noise free at all times.
- d. The use of carts by a Credential Holder is prohibited.

2. Positioning Guidelines. For all Credential Holders:

- a. Only a Credential Holder with an inside the ropes credential is permitted inside the ropes at any time. Further, a Credential Holder must hold an inside the ropes credential for the relevant Tournament day.
- b. A Credential Holder with an inside the ropes credential: (i) must remain within an arm's length from the ropes, so as to blend into the gallery and appear to be part of the gallery at all times; and (ii) is not permitted on the teeing ground unless express written permission has been granted by PGA TOUR.
- c. A Credential Holder may not position himself/herself in the line of play. If requested to move by a player, caddie or PGA TOUR or Tournament staff, a Credential Holder must do so without delay or discussion. A Credential Holder should position him/herself outside of the reasonable line of sight of PGA TOUR broadcasters.

3. Interview Guidelines. For all Credential Holders:

- a. Use of interviews must be limited to the person being interviewed.
- b. A Credential Holder must clearly request, and the player must clearly grant permission, for audio and/or video of an interview to be recorded. The Credential Holder is responsible for providing evidence of such permission at the request of PGA TOUR and/or the interviewee.
- c. Players are not to be distracted or interrupted for interviews (or any other purpose) during practice or play on any day of a Tournament.

d. Interviews are permitted in the practice areas only if the interview is conducted by prior arrangement with the player, outside the hitting area and not where it could be distracting to other players.

e. On competition days, interviews may be conducted only after the conclusion of the player's round (i.e., after the player has signed his scorecard), unless a prior arrangement is made a pre-round interview. A Credential Holder is not allowed in the scoring area. PGA TOUR staff will seek to make requested and leading players available each day in a designated interview area (typically, near the scoring area and/or in the Media Center).

4. Photography Guidelines. For all Credential Holders (i.e., for Competition and Non-Competition Photographers):

a. Silent photography equipment must be used when taking a picture during a player's swing at any time.

b. Players may not be asked to pose during practice sessions (i) before a practice or competition round except by prior arrangement with the player or (ii) during a practice or competition round under any circumstances.

5. Locker Room Guidelines. Only Credential Holders specifically credentialed for locker room access are permitted in the locker room. For such permitted Credential Holders:

a. Live reporting, video recording and photography are not permitted in the locker room.

b. Audio recording is permitted in the locker room, subject to the following terms and conditions:

i. Audio interviews in the locker room are for a Credential Holder's reference only. The audio may not be distributed to the public or any third party or used for any other purpose.

ii. Audio may be recorded in the locker room solely for one-on-one player interviews (with express permission).

iii. A Credential Holder must make other players in the vicinity aware that an interview is being recorded.

iv. PGA TOUR staff may designate an area within the locker room for the purpose of conducting interviews.

c. During weather delays, a Credential Holder is not permitted in the locker room. If possible, PGA TOUR staff will make players available for interviews during weather delays in designated interview area(s).

SECTION IV. MISCELLANEOUS TERMS

1. Use of PGA TOUR and Tournament Trademarks. Each Media Outlet is authorized to use the names, logos and other trademarks of PGA TOUR and Tournaments solely in its news and editorial coverage of a Tournament and/or Tour pursuant to these Media Regulations. The use of such trademarks must be in accordance with PGA TOUR's and Tournaments' brand guidelines and instructions from time to time. Such trademarks: (a) may not be used in any commercial manner; and (b) may not be used to imply an official, marketing, endorsement or sponsorship relationship with PGA TOUR or any other Tour or a Tournament.

2. Commercial Uses. If a Media Outlet and/or Credential Holder desire to use information or other content collected by them pursuant to these Media Regulations, any archival footage or content of PGA TOUR or any trademark of PGA TOUR or a Tournament for any commercial or promotional purpose, please contact PGA TOUR. Any such usage, if permitted, must be set forth in a separate license agreement. These Media Regulations do not apply to, and credentials will not be issued under these Media Regulations to, equipment manufacturers, sponsors and other commercial entities.

3. Wire Services. A Media Outlet recognized by PGA TOUR as an established wire and news distribution service (e.g., AP) may distribute the information and other content collected by its Credential Holders under these Media Regulations to third party media organizations in the ordinary course of its business. Such third party media organizations may use such information and other content solely for their news and editorial coverage on the same terms and conditions applicable to Media Outlets under these Media Regulations. Each wire and news distribution service will be responsible for the compliance of its third party media organizations with the terms and conditions of these Media Regulations. No Media Outlet or Credential Holder may otherwise transfer, sell or license the information or other content collected by it/him/her pursuant to these Media Regulations.

4. Assumption of Risk and Release of Liability. As a condition to receiving credentials under these Media Regulations, each Media Outlet and Credential Holder acknowledges and assumes all risks and dangers incidental to the game of golf and attending a Tournament, known and unknown, and hereby releases PGA TOUR, the Tournament, the host organization, the host site, all sponsors, all players, volunteers and their respective affiliates, officers, directors, managers, members, employees and agents from any and all liabilities, damages and losses, including property damage, personal injury and death, resulting from its/his/her attendance of a Tournament to the fullest extent permitted under applicable law.

5. Indemnification. Each Media Outlet and Credential Holder shall indemnify, defend and hold harmless PGA TOUR, Tournaments, host organizations, host sites, sponsors, players and their respective affiliates, officers, directors, managers, members, employees, volunteers and agents from and against any and all liabilities, damages, injuries, claims, suits, judgments, causes of action and expenses (including reasonable attorneys' fees) suffered or incurred by any of them as a result of any breach of these Media Regulations, negligence or willful misconduct by or of, for purposes of the Media Outlet's obligation, the Media Outlet or any of its Credential Holders, or, for purposes of a Credential Holder's obligation, such Credential Holder.

6. Use of Likeness. Each Credential Holder grants permission to PGA TOUR and its affiliates, licensees, distributors and media partners to utilize the his/her image and likeness as appearing incidentally in any live or recorded television or other transmission or reproduction in whole or in part of any Tournament.

7. Interpretation, Modification and Enforcement. PGA TOUR may interpret, modify, update, replace and enforce these Media Regulations at any time in its sole discretion. These Media Regulations are not intended to and do not serve as a waiver of any intellectual property or other rights of PGA TOUR.

8. Reservation of Rights. PGA TOUR reserves all rights not expressly granted to a Media Outlet and/or Credential Holder under these Media Regulations.

9. No Transferability. These Media Regulations, and each credential issued hereunder, may not be transferred, conveyed or assigned by a Media Outlet or Credential Holder.

10. Entire Agreement. These Media Regulations constitute the entire agreement among PGA TOUR, a Media Outlet and its Credential Holders with respect to the matters covered in these Media Regulations and shall supersede all prior written, oral, or implied understandings among them with respect to such matters. Any other terms or conditions proposed by a Media Outlet or Credential Holder are hereby rejected.

11. Governing Law; Venue. These Media Regulations will be construed and enforced according to the laws of the State of Florida, without regard to conflicts of law principles. Each party irrevocably submits to the exclusive jurisdiction of the courts of St. Johns County in the State of Florida and the federal courts of the United States of America located in Jacksonville, Florida for any action or proceeding arising out of or related to these Media Regulations.

12. Acceptance of Media Regulations. By using a credential, each Credential Holder and his/her Media Outlet accepts and agrees to the approved terms of the credential and these Media Regulations (in the event the Credential Holder and/or Media Outlet has not already accepted and agreed).

About TPC Louisiana

As the region's headquarters of professional golf, TPC Louisiana offers an unparalleled experience of the sport in the area. The club boasts a renowned championship golf course with 18 professional-level holes, meticulously maintained to the PGA TOUR's highest standards of operation.

Master architect Pete Dye designed the course, working in conjunction with TOUR players Steve Elkington and Kelly Gibson – a New Orleans native. The course is located in Avondale, just 15 miles from the bustle of the “Big Easy” and Bourbon Street. TPC Louisiana was named “the #4 best upscale public golf course” by Golf Digest magazine when it opened back in 2004. TPC Louisiana is consistently included in GolfWeek's “Best Courses You Can Play” each year (Golf Digest 2011 Top 100 public Golf Course).

The golf course, which is part of the Audubon Golf Trail, stretches over 250 acres of wetlands across along the Mississippi River delta. True to Pete Dye's style, the golf course features over 100 bunkers, including several large waste bunkers on the first six holes of the back nine. TPC Louisiana boasts a series of short and compelling par-4 holes to balance. The five sets of tees, ranging from a fair 5,121 yard from the women's tees all the way back to the 7,400 PGA TOUR tees, offers golfers of all skill levels a great blend of challenge and playability.

The signature hole on the golf course is the par-5, 18th hole. Water is in play for the entire right side of the hole, making for a challenging finish for even the most seasoned golfer.

TPC Louisiana is host of the Zurich Classic of New Orleans, Louisiana's premier tournament and the PGA TOUR's annual stop in the state.

Hole Descriptions

HOLE #1 399-YD. PAR 4 –

This hole is one of the shortest par 4s on the golf course. Most players will hit a fairway wood off the tee into the narrow fairway, trying to avoid the long fairway bunker on the left. The right side of this green has 3 challenging pot bunkers that must be avoided.

HOLE #2 548-YD. PAR 5 -

A straight away par 5 with a large fairway bunker left of the fairway off the tee and a second to navigate on the approach, this hole is reachable for many of the TOUR players. The green was enlarged and elevated following the 2013 Zurich Classic. Players going at this green in two must be careful as plenty of trouble lurks left, right and long of the green.

HOLE #3 221-YD. PAR 3

This long par 3 is often setup so that players can play a mid-iron. The hole is framed by a water hazard that is in play to the right and behind the green. A visually deceptive tee shot is made even more challenging as a steep pot bunker face guards the front of the green. The green is one of the largest on the course and has many subtle contours.

HOLE #4 482-YD. PAR 4 -

One of the longer holes on the course, the 4th sets up for a left-to-right shot off the tee to avoid a hazard on the right. This will leave players with a mid-to-long iron shot into the green that favors a right-to-left approach. Beware of the deep pot bunkers left of the green, but don't short-side yourself if the hole location is on the right.

HOLE #5 438-YD. PAR 4

This beautiful hole requires a right to left shot off the tee box. The second shot will favor a left to right shot over a long fairway bunker and multiple pot bunkers on the right side of the green. Nick Watney holed his 2nd shot here in the final round in 2007 that set up his 3 shot victory.

HOLE #6 476-YD. PAR 4

The third long par 4 in the front side's "triangle of doom" requires a long straight drive that avoids a hazard on the left. The 2nd shot is a near 90-degree dogleg to the left, and players will hit anything from fairway woods to long irons depending on the wind conditions.

HOLE #7 561-YD. PAR 5

A fairly long par 5 that requires a well-placed drive, avoiding the massive fairway bunker on the right and some pot bunkers on the left. A lay-up is a prudent play as the fairway widens out to the right. Longer hitters must avoid the pot bunker to the left if they are trying to hit a smallish, tilting green in two.

HOLE #8 372-YD. PAR 4

This hole may be reachable downwind for big hitters but this play is quite risky. Most players will hit a fairway metal or hybrid from the tee that will leave them a short iron for their 2nd shot. The green is guarded by several pot bunkers with one pot bunker in front of the green creating another blind approach shot. This hole will provide plenty of birdie opportunities and excitement.

HOLE #9 207-YD. PAR 3

A demanding par 3 that has played over par in the Zurich Classic of New Orleans several times. Water guards the left side of this elevated green that makes for a difficult chip for players that bail out right. The defining feature of the 9th green is the large peak in the middle right side that will make for a challenging 2 putt for any player that has to putt across it.

HOLE #10 390-YD. PAR 4

A fairway wood or iron is required for this short par 4 that starts off the back nine. Players need a well-executed tee shot to be aggressive with a wedge or short iron into this narrow but deep green.

HOLE #11 575-YD. PAR 5

After pounding a driver on this long par 5, decisions must be made. Going for the green in two requires the 2nd shot to be maneuvered around the tall cypress tree in the middle of the fairway, a mere 80 yards from the green. Laying up on this hole is tricky as well. Make sure the lay-up is well to the right of the cypress tree so you will have an easier approach to a well-guarded and contoured green.

HOLE #12 492-YD. PAR 4

Perhaps the toughest hole on the golf course. The tee shot should be hit with a slight right to left shot shape. This will leave a long-to-mid iron into a green that requires a left to right shot. A deep bunker is on the right, while a large chipping area dominates the left side of the big green.

HOLE #13 403-YD. PAR 4

Another tricky, short par 4 that long hitters may try to press their luck and drive the green. Deep pot bunkers surround the green, so an errant shot could result in a double bogey. The green is the smallest on the golf course so a better play is a fairway wood to the right of the large cypress tree to set up a wedge into what should be a birdie hole.

HOLE #14 216-YD. PAR 3

This is the only par 3 on the course that doesn't have water in play. The hole is framed by a large bunker in front of the green and 4 pot bunkers that guard the left and right. Different tee complexes can make this hole play as short as 167 yards.

HOLE #15 490-YD. PAR 4

This is the last hole on the course that requires a long tee shot. The ideal drive would be a right-to-left ball flight that avoids the large fairway bunker on the left. Approach shots need to be high and soft as this saddle shaped green is one of the few on the course that are not protected by a bunker. This tricky green complex will test even the best short games on the PGA TOUR. Par is a great score and birdies are a rare delight.

HOLE #16 355-YD. PAR 4

Number 16 is a really interesting hole where players can choose to hit driver over a fairway bunker complex with overhanging trees to a green protected by water to the front and left. The other play is a hybrid or a long iron followed by a wedge into the green. A birdie hole.

HOLE #17 215-YD. PAR 3

The last and most difficult of the par 3's, this hole will produce everything from aces to triple bogeys. Water runs down the entire left hand side of the hole and the green is guarded by two small bunkers to the right.

HOLE #18 585-YD. PAR 5

This exciting par 5 features one of the largest fairways on the golf course but water runs down the entire right side. Big hitters off the tee can sometimes catch a slope on the right side that adds extra yards to the drive to set up a go for the green in two. The bunkering around the green complex is spectacular and produces all sorts of interesting shots. A true risk-reward-gambling par 5, the 18th at TPC should ensure great theater and a great champion for the Zurich Classic of New Orleans.

2019 Zurich Classic Team Profiles

Jason Day – Adam Scott

Two former World #1 ranked players will pair in Aussies Jason Day and Adam Scott. Day has 12 PGA Tour victories including the 2015 PGA Championship, and Scott has 13 Tour wins, with an additional 13 International victories, highlighted by the 2013 Masters. Day has been a member of four International Presidents Cup teams and one World Cup team, Scott has represented the International side on 8 Presidents Cup teams and four World Cup teams. This is Adam Scott's first appearance in the Zurich Classic.

Brooks Koepka – Chase Koepka

Brothers Brooks and Chase Koepka will renew their partnership from the 2017 Zurich Classic where they finished T-5 as a team, the first time the two played together in competition. Since that 2017 pairing, Brooks went on a run of winning three of the next seven major championships- the 2017 US Open, 2018 US Open and 2018 PGA Championship and reached the #1 ranking in the world. Chase is a member of the European Tour graduating from the Challenge Tour at the end of 2017. Brooks played collegiately at Florida St. and Chase at South Florida.

Sergio Garcia – Tommy Fleetwood

2018 victorious European Ryder Cup teammates Sergio Garcia and Tommy Fleetwood will partner in the 2019 Zurich Classic after participating last year with different partners. Garcia is the owner of 10 PGA Tour victories and 19 more International wins, including the 2017 Masters Tournament. He has participated on nine Ryder Cup teams and is the all-time leading points winner in Ryder Cup history earning 25.5 points. Partner Tommy Fleetwood went 4-0 in team play in his first Ryder Cup and had a very successful year on the PGA Tour finishing 19th on the FedEx Cup points list. He finished 2nd at the US Open at Shinnecock Hills and had a T-4 at last year's Zurich Classic partnering with close friend Chris Paisley. Fleetwood was also a member of the 2009 Walker Cup team.

Kevin Kisner – Scott Brown

Kevin Kisner and Scott Brown, close friends from Aiken, SC will partner for the third year in a row in team play at the Zurich Classic. The pair were in a playoff in New Orleans in 2017, with Kisner holing a 90 foot pitch shot for eagle to on the 72nd hole to force a Monday playoff where Cameron Smith and Jonas Blixt prevailed after 4 holes. The pair also had the 3rd round lead in 2018 before struggling in foursomes on Sunday. Kisner has 3 PGA Tour wins including the recent WGC Dell Technologies Match Play and was a member of the 2017 Presidents Cup team. Brown turned professional in 2006, joined the PGA Tour in 2012 and was the winner of the 2013 Puerto Rico Open. Kisner played collegiately at University of Georgia and Brown at University of South Carolina-Aiken.

Patrick Reed – Patrick Cantlay

Two Patrick's, Reed and Cantlay will pair again for the third straight year in team play at the Zurich Classic after a T-14 in 2017 and T-7 in 2018. Reed is best known for his Ryder Cup success, amassing a 7-3-2 record in three matches. He has six PGA Tour wins, including the 2018 Masters Tournament. He was on the 2015 and 2017 Presidents Cup teams, and represented the US in the 2016 Summer Olympics. He won two Louisiana High School state championships and two NCAA Championships at Augusta St. Cantlay was the winner of the 2018 Shriners Hospitals Open for Children, and also won the 2013 Colombia Championship on the Web.com Tour. He was a member of the 2011 Walker Cup and Palmer Cup teams and was ranked the #1 amateur in the world while playing at UCLA.

Steve Stricker – Jerry Kelly

Steve Stricker and Jerry Kelly will return again as partners for the Zurich Classic. Both have team play experience with Stricker being a member of five Presidents Cup teams and three Ryder Cup teams, plus serving as Captain of winning the 2017 Presidents Cup team. He will also Captain the US for the 2020 Ryder Cup Matches in his home state of Wisconsin. Kelly was a member of the 2003 Presidents Cup team, and also won the Shark Shootout in 2006 with Rod Pamplung as partner, in and 2009 with Stricker. Stricker has 12 PGA Tour wins and three wins on PGA Tour Champions, and Kelly has three PGA Tour victories including the 2009 Zurich Classic of New Orleans, three PGA Tour Champions wins, and two Web.com victories.

Bubba Watson – JB Holmes

Bubba Watson and JB Holmes will recreate their 2017 partnership that resulted in a T-5 finish. Bubba paired with Mart Kuchar in 2018 and Holmes with Brandt Snedeker. Watson has 12 PGA Tour wins including the 2011 Zurich Classic, and the 2012 and 2014 Masters Tournaments. He's been a member of four Ryder Cup and two Presidents Cup teams. He had 100 employees from businesses he owns- the Pensacola Blue Wahoos minor league baseball team, Bubba's Sweet Shop and Chevrolet dealership bus to New Orleans last year to follow his play on Friday of the tournament. Holmes has five PGA Tour wins, including the 2019 Genesis Open. He was on the 2005 Walker Cup and 2015 Presidents Cup teams, and the 2008 and 2016 Ryder Cup teams, both US victories.

Jason Dufner – Pat Perez

Jason Dufner extended great career success in New Orleans with a 2nd place finish in the 2018 Zurich Classic partnering with Pat Perez. Dufner won the Zurich Classic in a playoff in 2012, and added top 10's in 2009, 2010, 2011, 2017 and the 2nd place finish in 2018. He has five PGA Tour wins including the 2013 PGA Championship. He was a member of the 2012 Ryder Cup and 2013 Presidents Cup teams. Perez has three PGA Tour victories and one Web.com win. He rose to #16 in the World rankings in 2018. Dufner played at Auburn and Perez at Arizona St. University

Tony Finau – Kyle Stanley

Tony Finau and Kyle Stanley return to New Orleans as new partners. Finau finished 6th last year paired with Daniel Summerhays and Stanley finished T-29 with Ryan Ruffels in 2017. Finau won the 2016 Puerto Rico Open and had a breakout 2018, finishing in the top 10 in the first three majors of the year and making the 2018 Ryder Cup team, rising inside the top 10 in the world rankings. Stanley had a decorated career at Clemson and has two PGA Tour wins, including the 2018 Quicken Loans National. He was also on the 2007 Walker Cup team and played in the 2018 World Cup.

Ernie Els /Trevor Immelman

International Presidents Cup Captain Ernie Els will partner with Assistant Captain Trevor Immelman for the 2019 Zurich Classic. Both are past major champions – Els with two US Open titles and two Open Championship wins, and Immelman with a Masters Championship. Els has 19 PGA Tour titles to his credit, along with 47 International victories, and Immelman has two PGA Tour wins and six International victories. Els has been on eight Presidents Cup teams and Immelman on two. Els was in a playoff for the 2012 Zurich Classic title, losing on the third playoff hole to Jason Dufner.

Jon Rahm – Ryan Palmer

Jon Rahm and Ryan Palmer return to the Zurich Classic with new partners for 2019. Rahm partnered with Wesley Bryan last year, and Ryan Palmer was previously with Jordan Speith, finishing 4th in 2017. Rahm has two PGA Tour victories and three International wins, and was a member of the 2018 Ryder Cup team. He also was on the 2016 World Cup team and 2014 and 2015 Palmer Cup teams. He is currently in the top 10 in the world ranking and has risen as high as #2. He is the only two-time winner of the Ben Hogan award for outstanding male collegiate golfer of the year while at Arizona St. Palmer has three PGA Tour wins and one Web.com victory. He has three top 10 finishes so far in the 2018-19 season. Palmer graduated from Texas A&M.

Henrik Stenson - Graeme McDowell

Henrik Stenson and Graeme McDowell are two major champions forming a new partnership at the 2019 Zurich Classic. Stenson owns six PGA Tour wins and 13 International victories, highlighted by the 2016 Open Championship, won in a memorable duel over Phil Mickelson. Stenson has been a member of five Ryder Cup teams and was the silver medalist in the 2016 Summer Olympics. Graeme McDowell is a winner of four PGA Tour wins and eight International events, including the 2010 US Open at Pebble Beach. He's been a member of four Ryder Cup teams and was on the 2001 Walker Cup team. He played collegiately at University of Alabama-Birmingham.

Louis Oosthuizen – Charl Schwartzel

Two more major champions will pair- 2010 Open Champions winner Louis Oosthuizen and 2011 Master Champion Charl Schwartzel. The South Africans pair finished third as a team in the 2018 Zurich Classic. Oosthuizen has 13 International wins and has player on three International Presidents Cup teams. Schwartzel has two PGA Tour victories and has 13 International wins and has been a member of four International Presidents Cup teams. Both have been ranked in the top 10 in the world during their careers.

Ian Poulter - Sam Horsfield

Englishman Ian Poulter and rising star Sam Horsfield have paired for this year's Zurich Classic. Poulter is best know for his Ryder Cup success and intensity., amassing a 14-6-2 record over six appearances. He has won three times on the PGA Tour, including two WGC's and has 12 International victories. He made the cut in his two Zurich Classic team appearances, with Geoff Ogilvy in 2017 and Graeme McDowell in 2018. Horsfield played collegiately at University of Florida and won three tournaments as a freshman. He turned pro in 2017 and won European Tour qualifying by eight shots. He had three top 5's and six top 10's in the 2018 European Tour Season.

Zurich Classic of New Orleans Record Book (established 2017)

***2017 & 2018 Format Information:**

An historic change was made to the format of the Zurich Classic of New Orleans in 2017, making the event a two-player team event featuring Foursomes (alternate shot) during the first and third rounds and Four-ball (best ball) during the second and fourth rounds. A change was made at the 2018 Zurich Classic of New Orleans, with the two formats switching rotations. Rounds one and three in the two-player team event featured the Four-ball (best ball) format, while the second and fourth rounds used the Foursomes (alternate shot) format.

Since the formation of the PGA TOUR (1968), the Zurich Classic became the first official event to utilize Foursomes as part of a team competition.

The 2017 Zurich Classic was the first official PGA TOUR team event in 36 years. Before that, the last official PGA TOUR team event was the 1981 Walt Disney World National Team Championship held at the Magnolia, Palm and Lake Buena Vista courses at Disney. Vance Heafner and Mike Holland won that title. The tournament became an individual stroke-play event in 1982.

The Zurich Classic awards FedExCup points and official money and counts as an official victory for the members of the winning team.
