

**ROUND 3 INTERVIEW**

**PAUL BROADHURST**  
**KIRK TRIPLETT ( -18)**

**Q. Paul, I'll talk to you first. 13 or 14, I think, nice tee shot in there close for a birdie, and on 18. Giving chase today?**

**PAUL BROADHURST:** We were a long way off the pace going in, so it was a case of attacking all the pins. We did that. We got off to a great start, a few good iron shots and converted them. It was poetry in motion. It wasn't sticky, we just had a few holes where the putts didn't go in and then managed to hole a couple towards the end. So yeah, 10 under on a tough track, so delighted.

**Q. Kirk, can you talk a little bit about knowing who was in front of you and where you were standing as you guys were doing this?**

**KIRK TRIPLETT:** I don't think we were even close enough to even really consider that. I mean, we're just trying to jump up in front of guys that are going to have a good finish. This format, you don't feel like teams are going to go backwards, right? So if you're playing a regular Tour event and you're 5 or 6 behind, you feel like the leader might come back to you, but with two men, they might make a bogey, but they're not going to make more than one, not very often anyway. So you play aggressive in this format regardless of where you're at, whether you're in 2nd place or 22nd place. So we got off to a fast start today and we look like geniuses. What can I say?

**Q. Paul, to be here again, you guys won it last year and second place right now.**

**PAUL BROADHURST:** Yeah, it seems to be working. Kirk got first, team captain, and I got second, and I don't know. We seem to jell, especially around the par 3s. We played both -- the four rounds we played on the par 3 course we played really well. Yesterday was a tough day, really tough day yesterday. I mean, the birdies were scarce, but it was good fun to make some putts. It was a good day.

**Q. Is there something about this place? I mean, you won last year, you both had big years after that, and back here and at least going to finish high up.**

**KIRK TRIPLETT:** Well, I played with Craig Stadler a few years ago here as well and we've done well here. I like the format, I like having a safety net. I feel kind of like I play a little more aggressive than I typically play. I hit a lot of bad shots and they don't seem to bother me as much.

But as far as yesterday goes with the wind blowing really hard, we really struggled most of

the day, but with today's round, based on yesterday's finish, we birdied four out of the last five or six holes yesterday to kind of bring some momentum to today.

**Q. It's nice it kind of calmed down a little bit today and that kind of thing. In terms of the overall golf here and what's available at Ozarks National and here, just talk to me about the week and the golf played here and just the event itself. Talk to me about that. We're with Bass Pro, so we're looking for this stuff.**

**PAUL BROADHURST:** This is my second time here. You stand on that practice area behind us, if you're not hitting the ball well on that practice area, you're not going to hit it well anywhere. It doesn't get any better than this. I love coming here. The 18-hole course is pretty impressive. Yesterday was a real tough day.

My family really enjoyed the time here. My son's here for the first time, he's loved it. (Inaudible). He's met Justin Timberlake, so he's going home really happy, so he's got bragging rights at school next week.

**KIRK TRIPLETT:** Something for everybody here. I mean, you can play a golf tournament, what have you got, five or six different courses with all of them different, all of them unique, all of them spectacular.
