Q. Give me the real story. How was the round?

JESPER PARNEVIK: The real story is my putting is dodgy at the best. I got us off to a good start, I hit it to six feet on the first hole and I limp-dicked it in the hole so badly it barely -- I don't even know how it made it, but it got us going. Jeff made a few birdies, and 9 under's a pretty good score.

JEFF MAGGERT: He says that, but he's making all the short ones when they count and that's the name of the game, especially on a windy day. You know, we both kind of had some bad holes, but we both had a lot of good holes. I think we both probably would have shot under par on our own ball today. I think I made three, four, five birdies; he made four, five birdies. You know, made a few bogeys, but it was a tough day. You know, fortunately no team bogeys.

Q. Way windier up here than at Top of the Rock, I just came from there, but how did that kind of affect play today, if at all?

JESPER PARNEVIK: Put it this way: I don't know what hole it was here, par 3, he hit an 8-iron 247 yards. That's how windy it was. And it was not -- he didn't intend to hit it 247. He intended to hit it like 200.

JEFF MAGGERT: 200 and it went 247. It was a tough day on this course, it was. You could let it get away today if you didn't really pay attention to what you were doing.

Q. How does your guys' game complement one another? How did you guys pick each other as partners?

JESPER PARNEVIK: I love playing with Jeff because he's so solid, he rarely misses his shots. The 17th hole, No. 8 here, it was a tough tee shot on the par 3. He knocked it up there fairly close and I lipped out for hole-in-one and hit it to six inches and I can handle those, so that felt good. It's going to be fun tomorrow.

JEFF MAGGERT: Jesper, he'll make a par better than anybody because he works hard and he never gives up. A lot of guys will hit a bad shot in this format and they might be thinking that they're out of the hole. All of a sudden he'll hit one from 100 yards up there like a tap-in for a par and it just takes pressure off both our games when you've got a guy that's really working hard to make pars like that.
