Final Round Notes

Sunday, April 28, 2019

Courses/ Format: Top of the Rock (1,404 yards/Par 27/Modified alternate shot for first 9; best ball for second 9)

Weather: Partly cloudy with a high of 65. Winds out of the SE 10-15 mph.

Summary: **Scott Hoch** and **Tom Pernice** opened the final round of the Bass Pro Shops Legends of Golf at Big Cedar Lodge with a hole-in-one on the first hole and ended with a course-record victory at 23-under. At 63 years, 5 months and 4 days, Hoch became the oldest player to win on PGA TOUR Champions.

Tom Pernice Jr./ Scott Hoch, 23-under 156

- Making their ninth appearance at the event, but teammates for the first time, Pernice and Hoch finished at 23-under 156, setting a new tournament course record.
- The team became just the seventh in tournament history to win wire-to-wire. The last team to do so was Andy North and Tom Watson in 2008.
- Pernice used a 7-iron on the 175-yard first hole for his second hole-in-one in his career (2010 SAS Championship, No. 11 first round) and 10th in the history of the Bass Pro Shops Legends of Golf at Big Cedar Lodge.
 - Became the second player in PGA TOUR Champions history to open a round with a hole-in-one (Miller Barber, 1993 Gulfstream Aerospace Invitational).
- At 63 years, 5 Months, and 4 days, Hoch became the oldest winner in PGA TOUR Champions history surpassing Mike Fetchick at 63 years to the day.
- The win is Hoch's first since winning the 2008 Chubb Classic, a span of 11 years, 2 months and 11 days, the longest time in PGA TOUR Champions history surpassing the record held by Craig Stadler (8 years, 8 months, 28 days). Hoch now owns four victories on PGA TOUR Champions.

- Kansas City, Missouri native, Pernice claimed his first victory since winning the 2016 Invesco QQQ Championship. It was his sixth on PGA TOUR Champions.

Kirk Triplett / Paul Broadhurst, 18-under 161

- Defending champions, Triplett and Broadhurst opened with birdies on Nos. 1-5 en route to carding the lowest round of the day at 10-under in the final round. The team move 13 places up the leaderboard for a runner-up finish.
- Triplett has four top-five finishes in six appearances at this event. This season, he won the Hoag Classic, and now owns three runner-up finishes in eight starts.
- The finish is Broadhurst's best of the year, and first runner-up finish on PGA TOUR Champions.

Vijay Singh / Carlos Franco, 18-under 161

- Teammates for the third year and winners of the 2017 Bass Pro Shops Legends of Golf, Singh and Franco carded an 8-under 46 in the final round to finish runner-up at 18-under 161.
- The finish is Singh's best of the year and fourth runner-up finish on PGA TOUR Champions.
- The finish is Franco's best since winning the event in 2017 and just his second runner-up finish on PGA TOUR Champions.

Other Notes

- Teammates for the second year, **Jesper Parnevik** and **Jeff Maggert** finished in fourth place after at 17-under. The finish is Parnevik's best this season and Maggert's second in the top-five.
- UCLA teammates, **Brandt Jobe** and **Scott McCarron** finished T5 at 15-under. McCarron entered the week from winning the Mitsubishi Electric Classic and it is his fifth top-five finish in nine starts this season. The finish is Jobe's best of the season.
- In their fifth year as teammates, 2016 runner-ups **Kevin Sutherland** and **Paul Goydos** finished at 15-under for a T5 finish. The finish matches Goydos' best of the season (T5, Hoag Classic) and is Sutherland's fourth top-five finish in nine starts this year.
