Fred Couples, 65-63-128 (-16)

- Couples played his first six holes bogey-free until he landed a birdie on No. 7 and an ace on No. 9 sparked his rise up the leaderboard. Couples birdied six of the last nine holes to finish at 9-under 63, matching his best round of the year (63, Rd. 3, DICK'S Sporting Goods Open).
- At 16-under 128, Couples records a new 36-hole tournament record (previous: four strokes by Ray Stewart in 2007) and with a five-shot lead over David Toms and Paul Broadhurst, enters Sunday with the largest lead in the history of the Boeing Classic.
- Couples carded a hole-in-one using a 4-iron on the Par-3 ninth hole from 203 yards. The ace was Couples first on PGA TOUR Champions. He has carded two on the PGA TOUR (1997 THE PLAYERS Championship, No. 17; 2006 THE PLAYERS Championship, No. 13).
 - There have been eighth aces this year on PGA TOUR Champions
 - o There have been two previous aces in the history of the Boeing Classic
 - Hale Irwin, No. 9, 2011
 - Tim Simpson, No. 6, 2009
- It is the first time Couples will play in the final group in nine appearances at his hometown event. He has not played in the final group this season.

- It is the 13th time Couples has led/co-lead headed into the final round. He has converted that lead/co-lead into a victory six times.
- The Seattle native is making his ninth start at the event, Couples has finished in third place three times (2010, 2013, 2015). Last year he finished T15.
- Should Couples go on to win, his opening round of 7-under 65 on Friday would match the lowest opening round by a winner (Jerry Kelly, 2017; Scott Parel, 2018).
- He enters the week off a runner-up finish at the DICK'S Sporting Goods Open where he carded rounds of 70-68-63. It was his best finish since winning the 2017 American Family Insurance Championship.
- This season, Couples finished four of his eight starts in the top 10 and ranks No. 28 in the Charles Schwab Cup standings.

Second-Round Lead Notes

- This season, a second-round leader/co-leader has won six times in 18 tournaments. The last player to do so was **Doug Barron** at last week's DICK'S Sporting Goods Open.
- In the Boeing Classic's 15-year existence, eight players have who led/co-led went on to win.
- The best come from behind win at the Boeing Classic was by five strokes by Scott Parel in 2018.

David Toms, 70-63-133 (-11)

- Toms began his second round with a birdie on No. 10 and played Nos. 14-1 at 6-under including an eagle on No. 15 to finish at 9-under 63. It was his best round at the event.
- Toms' 6-under 63 score ties his second-best round on PGA TOUR Champions. Toms carded a 62 in the opening round of the 2019 U.S. Senior Open Championship.
- In eight rounds at The Club at Snoqualmie Ridge, Toms has recorded five rounds in the 60s and six rounds under par.
- Toms ranks first in putting this season on PGA TOUR Champions holding a 1.731 average and ranks first this week in the field in putts per GIR (54 on 32).
- Toms claimed his first PGA TOUR Champions title at the 2018 U.S. Senior Open Championship and in 14 starts this year has posted three runner-up finishes and six finishes in the top 10.

Paul Broadhurst, 66-67-133 (-11)

- Broadhurst birdied his final three holes on Saturday to finish his bogey-free round at 5-under 67 and enter Sunday five strokes off the leader.
- Broadhurst is making his fourth appearance at the event. He has not finished inside the top 25, with his best finish coming last year (T35).
- The start is Broadhurst's 17th this year on PGA TOUR Champions. He has finished runner-up twice (Bass Pro Shops Legends of Golf; The Senior Open Championship presented by Rolex) and owns five finishes in the top 10.
- In four years on PGA TOUR Champions, he owns five victories, two runner-up finishes and 16 finishes in the top 10.

Other Notes

- Q-School graduate **Stephen Leaney** carded a 4-under 68 to sit T4 entering Sunday. The last player to win playing out of the Q-School category was **Ken Tanigawa** at the 2018 PURE Insurance Championship.
- Defending champion Scott Parel carded rounds of 69-72 to sit T34 entering Sunday.
- Charles Schwab Cup leader Scott McCarron carded rounds of 69-75 to enter Sunday T55. With the winner taking home \$315,000 at this week's event, McCarron will hold his top position in the Charles Schwab Cup standing for the 13th consecutive week.
- Davis Love III carded rounds of 70-71 (T34) in his Boeing Classic debut. This week represents Love's 15th start on PGA TOUR Champions. Others making their Boeing Classic debut included World Golf Hall of Fame member Retief Goosen (T11) and Shaun Micheel (T70).
- First-round leader Fred Funk
