Final Round Notes

Sunday, August 25, 2019

Course Setup: Par 72 / 7,190 yards (R3 average: 71.653; Cumulative: 71.087)

Weather: Mostly cloudy with a high of 75. Winds out of the NW 6-12 mph.

Summary: Brandt Jobe carded his best round of the season with a 9-under 63 on Sunday to win the Boeing Classic by three strokes over Tom Pernice Jr. Jobe began his round seven shots back, but 10 birdies secured the largest come-frombehind win in the history of the tournament.

Brandt Jobe, 69-66-63-198 (-18)

- Jobe began his final round T7 after rounds of 69-66. He birdied the first five holes to move up the leaderboard, just two strokes behind second-round leader Fred Couples. Jobe birdied Nos. 8 and 9 before the turn to become even with Couples and a birdie on No. 14 moved him into the leading position.
- Jobe sunk a 25-foot putt on No. 17 and closed with a birdie on No. 18 to finish with a three-stroke lead and complete a seven-stroke come-from-behind win, the largest comeback in the history of the Boeing Classic.
- Jobe's three-stroke victory ties the largest margin of victory at the event.
- It is the seventh come-from-behind win this year on PGA TOUR Champions. The largest come-from-behind win on Tour this season was Kevin Sutherland by eight strokes at the Principal Charity Classic.
- His final-round 9-under 63 is his lowest round recorded this year on PGA TOUR Champions.
- The victory is Jobe's second in five years on PGA TOUR Champions. Jobe claimed his first at the 2017 Principal Charity Classic by one stroke over Scott McCarron and Kevin Sutherland.
- The Oklahoma City native is making his third appearance at the event. Until his victory today, his best finish at the event was in his first start in 2016, where he finished at 10-under (T6).
- Jobe ranks first in Greens in Regulation at 72.6 percent and this week at the Boeing Classic hit 43 of 54 greens.
- This season Jobe now owns one victory and five finishes in the top 10. He moves from No. 24 to No. 14 in the Charles Schwab Cup standings with \$819,227 in earnings.

Tom Pernice Jr, 68-68-65-201 (-15)

- Pernice moved nine places up the leaderboard when he carded nine birdies for a 7-under 65 in Sunday's final round. Pernice finished runner-up at 15-under 201, three strokes behind Jobe.
- His 7-under 65 was his best round in 18 starts this season and best solo finish of the season.
- In nine starts at the Boeing Classic, Pernice owns five finishes in the top 10.
- This season, Pernice won the Bass Pro Shops Legends of Golf at Big Cedar Lodge with Scott Hoch. The win was his first since the 2016 Invesco QQQ Championship.
- At \$540,829 in earnings, Pernice sits No. 24 in the Charles Schwab Cup standings.

Jerry Kelly, 67-68-69-204 (-12)

- Kelly carded a 3-under 69 on Sunday to finish his third start at the event T3 at 12-under 204.
- It is just the second time this year Kelly has posted three consecutive rounds in the 60s.
- The 2017 Boeing Classic Champion has not recorded a round over par at The Club at Snoqualmie Ridge.
- This season, Kelly won the American Family Insurance Champion, finished runner-up at the Mitsubishi Electric Classic and the U.S. Senior Open Championship and owns nine finishes in the top 10.
- Kelly ranks No. 2 on the Charles Schwab Cup standings, just \$567,303 behind 13-week leader Scott McCarron.

Fred Couples, 65-63-76-204 (-12)

- Couples carded his first hole-in-one on PGA TOUR Champions on Saturday to hold the largest lead entering the final round with five strokes over David Toms and Paul Broadhurst.
- On Sunday, Couples began his round with a birdie on the first hole, but five bogeys throughout the remaining of his round left him at 4-over 76 for his highest round in 24 rounds at The Club at Snoqualmie Ridge.
- In nine appearances in the Boeing Classic, Couples owns four third-place finishes (2010, 2013, 2015, 2019) and eight finishes in the top 25.
- This season he has five top-10s in nine starts, a runner-up finish at last week's DICK'S Sporting Goods Open. He improved to No. 22 in the Charles Schwab Cup standings.

Other Notes

- Cumulative scoring average of 71.087 ranks second all-time lowest in the 15-year history of the Boeing Classic (lowest: 70.823 in 2006).
- **David Toms** entered the final round T2, but after an even-par round on Sunday finished T5, his second top-10 finish in three starts at the Boeing Classic.
- **Tommy Tolles** carded rounds of 69-68-68 to finish T5, his best finish of the season. It was the first time this season Tulles has posted three consecutive rounds in the 60s.
- Defending champion Scott Parel carded rounds of 69-72-71 for a T35 finish.
- Charles Schwab Cup leader Scott McCarron carded rounds of 69-75-69 to finish at T35. McCarron will hold his top position in the Charles Schwab Cup standing for the 13th consecutive week.
- Davis Love III carded rounds of 70-71-72 (T40) in his Boeing Classic debut. This week represents Love's 15th start on PGA TOUR Champions. Others making their Boeing Classic debut included World Golf Hall of Fame member Retief Goosen (T16) and Shaun Micheel (67th).
- **Fred Funk** withdrew through eight holes in his final round due to injury.
