Charles Schwab Cup: The top-five players in the standings have a mathematical chance to win the Charles Schwab Cup. Based on where top-ranked Scott McCarron (T25) and second-ranked Jerry Kelly (T25) stand, Bernhard Langer (2nd) and Retief Goosen (T3) are in position to win the Charles Schwab Cup if they win the tournament.

Jeff Maggert, 63-65 - 128 (-14)

Charles Schwab Cup Standings – Start: 31st / Projected: 10th

- Maggert made six birdies, including a holed bunker shot on No. 17, en route to a second-round 65. Through two rounds, he is one of two players that has only made one bogey.
- His 128 total is his second-best 36-hole total on PGA TOUR Champions. He opened with rounds of 63-63 at the • 2016 Shaw Charity Classic and led by three, but carded a 4-over 74 in the final round and finished T6.
 - This is the fourth time Maggert is among the top two mid-way through a 72-hole tournament.
 - 2015 Regions Tradition (T1); went on to win in a playoff
 - o 2015 U.S. Senior Open (T1); went on to win
 - 2018 Bridgestone SENIOR Players Championship (T2); went on to lose in a playoff



• He has four wins on PGA TOUR Champions, the last coming at the 2015 DICK'S Sporting Goods Open. It has been 4 years, 2 months and 8 days (or 96 starts) since that victory.

Bernhard Langer, 64-68 – 132 (-10)

Charles Schwab Cup Standings – Start: 3rd / Projected: 2nd

- Langer's eight birdies were offset by three bogeys and a double bogey on the 18th hole, where he hit his third shot into the greenside water hazard. A day after hitting 17 of 18 greens in regulation, he only hit 12 Friday.
- Langer has a Tour-record 11 wins in majors, which are also 72-hole events. He trailed through 36 holes in just four of those 11 wins. At this year's Senior Open Championship presented by Rolex, he was T7 entering the weekend and went on to win after closing with rounds of 70-66.
- Langer is the only player with multiple wins in Charles Schwab Cup Playoffs events (2017 Dominion Energy Charity Classic, 2017 Invesco QQQ Championship). He has eight top-10s in Playoffs events, the most all-time.
- The Charles Schwab Cup Championship is one of nine tournaments on this year's schedule that Langer has not won. In 11 prior starts at this event, he has recorded three runner-up finishes and a total of seven top-10s.
- Langer has seven wins at age 60 or older, the most in Tour history. If he goes on to win, he would be the fiftholdest winner in Tour history (age on Sunday: 62 years, 2 months, 14 days).
- So far this year, tournaments have been won by players age 60 or older four times, a single-season record.
 - Scott Hoch (63 years, 5 months, 4 days), Bass Pro Shops Legends of Golf at Big Cedar Lodge
 - o Mark O'Meara (62 years, 1 month, 18 days), Cologuard Classic
 - Bernhard Langer (61 years, 11 months, 1 day), The Senior Open Championship
 - Bernhard Langer (61 years, 5 months, 14 days), Oasis Championship
- In order for Langer to win his sixth Charles Schwab Cup, he must win the tournament. Additionally, Scott McCarron must finish T5 (two-way) or worse and Jerry Kelly must finish T2 (two-way) or worse.

Retief Goosen, 66-67 - 133 (-9)

Charles Schwab Cup Standings – Start: 5th / Projected:4th

- After a bogey on the par-5 opening hole, Goosen carded five birdies and posted a second-round 67.
- When he won the Bridgestone SENIOR PLAYERS Championship, Goosen led by three through 36 holes. He was one of four players to post three top-10s in majors this season, and he had the best scoring average among players that played all five majors (69.55).
- Goosen is one of six players with top-10s in each of the first two Playoffs events. He is a total of 32-under in this year's Playoffs.
- Entering this week, Goosen had the Tour's lowest scoring average (69.35). Bernhard Langer, who has led the Tour in scoring each of the last five years, was No. 2 with a 69.40 average.
- In order for Goosen to win the Charles Schwab Cup, he must win the tournament. Additionally, Scott McCarron must finish T12 (three-way) or worse and Jerry Kelly must finish T5 (two-way) or worse. Goosen would be the first rookie to win the Charles Schwab Cup.

Other Notes

- The top-five players in the standings have a mathematical chance to win the Charles Schwab Cup.
 - 1. Scott McCarron T25 / -2 (Projected rank: 1st)
 - 2. Jerry Kelly T25 / -2 (Projected rank: 3rd)
 - 3. Bernhard Langer 2nd / -10 (Projected rank: 2nd)
 - 4. Colin Montgomerie T10 / -6 (Projected rank: 5th)
 - 5. **Retief Goosen** T3 / -9 (Projected rank: 4th)
- On Saturday, Kelly and McCarron will be paired together for the 12th time this season (11:35 a.m. tee time). Kelly has won the matchup six times (70.36 average), but McCarron has the better scoring average (70.18) in the 11 matchups.
- **Brandt Jobe** opened with rounds of 67-66 and is T3 with Goosen. Jobe improved to 14th in the standings after winning the Boeing Classic, but he hasn't posted a top-10 in his six starts since. He entered the week No. 19.
