WOODY AUSTIN (-13)

WOODY AUSTIN: Three-putts the last two holes and still shoot 65, that's pretty bad, but that's my game. You know, even when I putt good, I still putt bad.

Q. I'll take a 65 any day.

WOODY AUSTIN: Yeah, but those two putts are going to cost me a lot. Obviously Miguel's probably too far with his round, but the big picture is I want to have a shot at that Schwab Cup and getting to second would have been a good boost for me. Those two three-putts are terrible, just terrible.

Q. How much leaderboard watching do you do?

WOODY AUSTIN: I'm a leaderboard watcher. I like to know how things are going, especially when we tee off on both sides, I like to see how the guys are playing on the back nine. You see a lot of guys going low at the turn from the other side. When you make the turn, you're like, okay, this side might be gettable, or if it's playing tough, you're like, okay, I just need to hang in there. I pay attention.

Q. Overall weekend?

WOODY AUSTIN: Well, I hit 34 of the last 36 greens, so I only missed one green a day the last -- I just didn't putt worth a darn yesterday. I missed everything yesterday and hit it seven feet and made eagle on the last hole, salvaged my day yesterday. And then today I was making a few and then throw it away on the last two holes. I gave myself plenty of chances, but it wasn't enough.

Q. Can momentum last two weeks?

WOODY AUSTIN: No. I mean, well, obviously I guess you could look at it from a mental standpoint of it, but when you take a full week off of golf, it's hard. I mean, you see it, you see guys like I think David MacKenzie shot, what, 63 on Sunday last week and this week he shot about five over. You know, it does happen. Jerry Kelly won and what was Jerry after -- he shot a couple over the first day. He played good after that, but you're like, wait a second, that's golf. It's hard to shoot them low rounds consistently. I mean, you're always going to kind of fluctuate.

Q. I've got to say that's golf. It is golf.

WOODY AUSTIN: Well, because it's so hard to get the ball in the hole on a consistent

basis. You may play good for -- you may hit it just as good like I did for these two days, but...
