Tommy Tolles, 65-67 – 132 (-12)

Charles Schwab Cup standings – Start: 59th / Projected: 23rd

- Tolles' first bogey of the tournament came on the 317-yard 15th, the easiest par 4 on the course. He rebounded with birdies at Nos. 16 and 18 en route to a 5-under 67.
- Tolles will start Sunday's final round as a leader/co-leader for the second time in his 42nd start on PGA TOUR Champions. He led by one through 36 holes at the 2018 Cologuard Classic, but finished T9 after a final-round 75.
- Tolles started the week 59th in the Schwab Cup. Since 2016, only three Playoffs events have been won by players that started the week outside the top 10. The highest-ranked player to win was No. 32 Tom Pernice Jr. at the 2016 Invesco QQQ Championship.
- He won twice on the Korn Ferry Tour, the last coming in 1994 at the NIKE Alabama Classic. Should he win Sunday, Tolles would break a winless streak of 395 starts (121 Korn Ferry Tour, 233 PGA TOUR, 41 PGA TOUR Champions) over a span of 25 years, 5 months, 19 days.
- Last year, Tolles made his Playoffs debut and finished T45 at the Dominion Energy Charity Classic and T30 at the Invesco QQQ Championship. He was 50th in last year's final Charles Schwab Cup standings.

Scott Parel, 66-66 – 132 (-12)

Charles Schwab Cup standings – Start: 9th / Projected: 3rd

- Like Tolles, Parel's first bogey of the tournament came on the 317-yard 15th, the easiest par 4 on the course. He rebounded with birdies at Nos. 16 and 18 en route to a 6-under 66.
- This marks the fourth time Parel will start the final round as a leader/co-leader, and the third time this season (T4/Bridgestone SENIOR PLAYERS Championship, P2/Principal Charity Classic).
- Parel will play in Sunday's final group for the fifth time this season. In the first four instances, he has a 69.75 scoring average and finished second twice (Insperity Invitational, Principal Charity Classic).
- Should he win Sunday, Parel would become the second player with two Playoffs victories, joining Bernhard Langer (2017 Dominion Energy Charity Classic, 2017 Invesco QQQ Championship) as the only players to do so.
- Parel has four top-10s in seven Playoffs starts, including two top-10s at the Dominion Energy Charity Classic.
- Parel has eight top-10s this season, including three runner-up finishes, and is No. 9 in the Charles Schwab Cup.

Second-Round Lead Notes

- This season, 11 players have led/co-led entering the final round and gone on to win. The last player to do so was Jerry Kelly at The Ally Challenge.
- Bernhard Langer (2017) and Scott McCarron (2016) won the Dominion Energy Charity Classic as a second-round leader/co-leader. Last year, eventual champion Woody Austin trailed by three and was T4 at 8-under.

Colin Montgomerie, 66-67 – 133 (-11)

Charles Schwab Cup standings – Start: 14th / Projected: 11th

- Montgomerie tallied seven birdies in a second-round 67, and he will play in Sunday's final group for the first time since the 2018 Mitsubishi Electric Championship at Hualalai.
- Should he win Sunday, Montgomerie would become the third member of the World Golf Hall of Fame to win a Playoffs event, joining Vijay Singh and Bernhard Langer.
- Montgomerie has six wins on PGA TOUR Champions, the last coming at the 2017 SAS Championship. He has made 51 starts since his last victory.
- Montgomerie is one of 11 players that has played in every Charles Schwab Cup Playoffs event since the postseason began in 2016. He finished second in the Charles Schwab Cup in 2014, 2015 and 2016. Since then, he's finished 10th (2017) and 29th (2018).

Charles Schwab Cup Playoffs Implications

After Sunday's final round, the top-54 players in the standings will qualify for the Invesco QQQ Championship. Through the second round, **Tommy Tolles** is the only player projected to move into the top-54.

Other Notes

- Five-time Charles Schwab Cup champion **Bernhard Langer** carded a 7-under 65 and is T4 at 9-under. Winner of the 2017 Dominion Energy Charity Classic, Langer is the tournament's all-time leading money winner (\$554,500) and all 11 of his rounds at the James River Course have been under par (68.00 average).
- Retief Goosen carded a second-round 68 and is T4 at 9-under. Should Goosen go on to win, he would become the third player to win a major and a Playoffs event in the same season, joining Bernhard Langer (2017) and Vijay Singh (2018).
- Last year, **Woody Austin** and **Vijay Singh** were the only two players to post three top-10s in the Charles Schwab Cup Playoffs. Austin, this week's defending champion, eagled the 18th hole to post a second-round 68, and he is T12 at 6-under. Singh, winner of the 2018 Charles Schwab Cup Championship, is T15 at 5-under.
- **Scott McCarron**, the Charles Schwab Cup leader and winner of the 2016 Dominion Energy Charity Classic, is T12 after rounds of 68-70.
- Mark O'Meara and Mark Calcavecchia both withdrew due to injuries during the second round.
