Scott McCarron, 30-34--64 (-7)

- McCarron carded eight birdies en route to a 7-under 64 opening round. It is the sixth time since June 2018 McCarron has recorded a round 7-under-par or lower.
- It is the sixth time McCarron has led/co-lead following the opening round. He has never converted this lead into a victory.
- In three starts at the Hoag Classic, McCarron has not finished outside the top 10. Last year he finished runner-up.
- McCarron has never recorded a round over par at Newport Beach Country Club. This season, McCarron has recorded 13 consecutive rounds under par, his longest-streak since joining the Tour in 2015.
- This year McCarron has finished his first four events inside the top 25. He entered this week at the Hoag Classic off a runner-up finish at the Cologuard Classic.
- McCarron owns eight victories, seven runner-up finishes and 40 finishes in the top 10 on PGA TOUR Champions.

Fran Quinn, 34-30--64 (-7)

• Quinn carded a 7-under 64 with eight birdies in the opening round to match a career-best (previous best: 7-under 64 at the 2016 and 2017 American Family Insurance Championship). Quinn had a one-shot lead until he bogeyed the final hole.

- Quinn's 6-under 30 on the back nine is a career-best nine hole score.
- It is the second time he has led/co-lead after the first round on PGA TOUR Champions (2018 Dominion Energy Charity Classic).
- Quinn is playing as a sponsor exemption. The last sponsor exemption to go on to win was John Daly at the 2017 Insperity Invitational.
- The Massachusetts native is making his second start at the Hoag Classic. Last year, after gaining entry as an alternate when **Doug Garwood** withdrew due to the flu, Quinn exited the opening round T2, ultimately finishing T6 after rounds of 67-70-69--206 (-7).
- This year, Quinn's best finish through three events is T25 at the Chubb Classic.
- Quinn owns two third-place finishes, six top-10 finishes and 19 top-25 finishes on PGA TOUR Champions.

First-Round Lead Notes

- The highest opening-round score by a Hoag Classic champion came in 1998, when Hale Irwin posted a 1-underpar 70 on Friday en route to a 13-under-par 200 for a one-shot victory.
- The largest 18-hole lead in tournament history occurred in 2011 when a first-round 11-under-par 60 gave Nick Price a five-shot cushion heading into the weekend.
- In the 24-year history of the Hoag Classic, nine 18-hole leaders to go on and win the tournament (most recently: Jay Haas, 2016).
- Through four events, no first-round leader/co-leader has won in 2019. In 2018, six first-round leaders/co-leaders won: Jerry Kelly (Mitsubishi Electric Championship at Hualalai), Mark Calcavecchia (Boca Raton Championship), Bernhard Langer (Insperity Invitational), Miguel Angel Jimenez (Regions Tradition), Scott Parel (Boeing Classic), Steve Stricker (Sanford International) and Bernhard Langer (SAS Championship).

Doug Garwood, 31-35--66 (-5)

- Garwood carded birdies on Nos. 2, 3, and 4 followed by three more, including one on his final hole to finish at 5-under 66 in third place after the opening round.
- Garwood, who resides in Chatsworth, Calif., got in the field as an alternate for Retief Goosen. He is making his third start at the Hoag Classic (T9,2015; T15, 2016).
- In 2018, Garwood posted three finishes in the top 10. His best was a T5 finish at the Cologuard Classic.
- Garwood owns one victory on PGA TOUR Champions (2016 SAS Championship), three runner-up finishes and 23 finishes in the top 10.

Corey Pavin, 33-34--67 (-4)

- Pavin carded a bogey-free 4-under 67 in a three-way tie for fourth place.
- This is Pavin's eighth start at the Hoag Classic. His best finish was T7 in his first appearance in 2010. Last year he finished T18 after carding a 6-under 65 in the final round.
- Pavin, who hails from Los Angeles and graduated from UCLA, finished T10 at the Oasis Championship, his best finish in four starts this year.
- In 2018, Pavin posted two finishes in the top 10 and seven finishes in the top 25. His best was a T6 finish at the Principal Charity Classic.
- Pavin owns one victory on PGA TOUR Champions (2012 Oasis Championship), eight runner-up finishes and 49 finishes in the top 10.

Billy Andrade, 34-33--67 (-4)

- Andrade opened with three birdies on his first four holes, followed by three more en route to a 4-under 67 in the opening round.
- This is Andrade's fifth start at the Hoag Classic. His best finish was T3 in 2016.
- Andrade's best finish this year was a T25 finish at the Chubb Classic.
- In 2018, Andrade finished runner-up at the Rapiscan Systems Classic and posted eight finishes in the top 10. He finished No. 27 on the Charles Schwab Cup money list.

 Andrade owns three victories on PGA TOUR Champions (2015 Bass Pro Shops Legends of Golf at Big Cedar Lodge, Boeing Classic, Charles Schwab Cup Championship), five runner-up finishes, and 34 finishes in the top 10.

David Toms, 35-32--67 (-4)

- Toms carded an eagle on No. 15 followed by birdies on Nos. 17 and 18 to close his opening round at 4-under 67.
- After the first round, Toms ranks T2 in the field in putting (25 on 15).
- He is making his second start at the Hoag Classic. Last year he finished in fifth place.
- Toms has recorded every round under par this season (13), his longest streak since joining the Tour in 2017.
- Toms opened the season with a runner-up finish at the Mitsubishi Electric Championship at Hualalai followed by a fourth-place finish at the Oasis Championship. Last week, Toms finished T6 at the Cologuard Classic.
- Toms owns one victory (2018 U.S. Senior Open), two runner-up finishes and 21 top-10 finishes on PGA TOUR Champions.

- The field includes five past champions of the Hoag Classic:

 - o **Duffy Waldorf** (2015): 1-under 70 (T20)
 - o **Fred Couples** (2010, 2014): 3-under 68 (T7)
 - o **David Frost** (2013): 3-over 74 (T58)

- **John Daly** withdrew prior to the start of the first round due a knee injury and was replaced in the field by **Steve Pate.**
- Hal Sutton withdrew after his 15th hole due to an ankle injury. He was 5-over par when he withdrew.
- Jay Haas withdrew after his 15th hole due to an injured back. He was 1-over-par when he withdrew.
- Colin Montgomerie withdrew following the opening round due to an ankle injury. He shot a 9-over 80.
