Q. Retief, at the start of the week you knew you had to win these next two weeks. Is there a sense of urgency for you when you got on property here knowing you had to win these next two?

Q. I've got to ask you, back in Richmond you went to the long putter. We talked about it. Why the switch back to the short putter?

RETIEF GOOSEN: I tried something new last week and in a way I learned something a little bit going back to the short putter. So last week was good, I hit a lot of good putts, but I also hit a lot of horrible ones, and so far this week the putter is sort of behaving.

Q. One-shot lead going into the final round right now. Game plan for tomorrow?

RETIEF GOOSEN: Pending weather tomorrow, it looks like it may be a little cooler and I just have to go out there and shoot a low round again.
