Q. Have you been able to put your finger on it yet, because in Richmond you said you weren't sure with your game and now you've played your way into two Playoffs, now you're into Schwab. What is it in your game.

TOMMY TOLLES: I know the what, I just don't know the why. I'm hitting the ball so much better than I have for almost two years now. I've really struggled with the occasional wild tee shot, really poor iron shot, and now if anything my weakness has been probably 10-footers, which has normally been my strength. I guess that's why it's a four-letter word.

Q. Other parts of your game that were strong this round this week?

TOMMY TOLLES: Mostly my iron game. The distance control was much better than it has been of late. I struggled for a few holes on Friday when it warmed up and the ball was really going a little bit farther. It took me four or five holes to get used to it, but once I got it kind of dialed in, everything kind of came to fruition.

Q. When you think about four weeks ago to where you are right now, I mean, it's pretty incredible what you've been able to accomplish. How do you sum it up?

TOMMY TOLLES: I'm flabbergasted, that's the only word I can come up with. Again, it's completely unexpected. A month ago I was probably playing just as poorly as I had at any other time and for it to turn around in two to three weeks, I've got no explanations.

Q. How much does this change your future on this tour?

TOMMY TOLLES: Well, I can call the PGA TOUR office in the morning and officially withdraw from Qualifying School, that's a plus. I get to play all the events next year, which is another plus. All this is -- this is just overwhelming right now.

Q. You seem emotional.

TOMMY TOLLES: I'm surprised, I really am. I'm shocked, I'm shocked that I was able to play well last week and play this week because I haven't been doing it for a very long time.
