Paul Broadhurst, 70-67-67—204 (-6)

- Broadhurst carded a bogey-free 3-under 67 in the third round to enter Sunday leading the field by two.
- This week there have only been three bogey-free rounds and Broadhurst owns two of those (Marco Dawson, Rd.
- Should be go on to win, he will become the seventh player to win back-to-back titles and first since Colin Montgomerie won in 2014-2015.
- It is the first time he has led/co-led after 54-holes on PGA TOUR Champions.
- Broadhurst ranks second in the field this week in driving accuracy (32 of 42).
- In 15 rounds at the KitchenAid Senior PGA Championship, Broadhurst has a scoring average of 69.13.
- On PGA TOUR Champions, Broadhurst owns two major championships (2016 Senior Open Championship presented by Rolex, 2018 Senior PGA Championship), three additional victories, one runner-up finish and 14 finishes in the top 10.
- This season, Broadhurst finished runner-up at the Bass Pro Shops Legends of golf at Big Cedar Lodge when he looked to defend his title with partner Kirk Triplett and he has posted two additional top 10 finishes.

Third-Round Lead Notes

Sunday's final group will play together for the first time. It is the fourth time Broadhurst and Tanigawa have played together, but both players will play with Goosen for the first time on PGA TOUR Champions.

- In last year's five major championships, **Miguel Angel Jimenez** was the only player to convert a 54-hole lead into a victory (Regions Tradition, Senior Open Championship presented by Rolex). **Steve Stricker** converted a 54-hole lead into a victory this year at the first major of the year, the Regions Tradition.
- When the event was played at Oak Hill in 2008, winner **Jay Haas** was one stroke behind **Bernhard Langer** after 54-holes.
- The largest come-from-behind win in the history of the KitchenAid Senior PGA Championship is by six strokes in 1987 by Chi Chi Rodriguez.

Retief Goosen, 67-72-67—206 (-4)

- Goosen carded four birdies en route to a 3-under 67 in the third round. He sits in second place, two-strokes behind the leader.
- Goosen ranks T2 in the field this week in putting (72 on 38 GIR).
- In Goosen's only other start at Oak Hill, he carded rounds of 77-74 and missed the cut at the 2003 PGA Championship.
- Goosen is making his eighth start on PGA TOUR Champions since turning 50 on February 3.
- After a T6 finish in his second start on Tour at the Chubb Classic, Goosen broke his right ring finger during the second round of the Cologuard Classic and was forced to withdraw. He missed the next seven weeks, and since returning he has three top-25 finishes in four starts. He is currently No. 40 in the Charles Schwab Cup.

Ken Tanigawa, 67-74-66—207 (-3)

- Tanigawa matched the low round of the week when he carded a 4-under 66 in the third round. He is in third place, three strokes behind the leader.
- Tanigawa ranks T2 in the field this week in putting (66 on 38 GIR).
- He is making his second start at the event. Last year he finished T23.
- Tanigawa was named the 2018 Rookie of the Year after graduating from Q-School and earning a fully-exempt status for the 2018 season.
- In 10 starts this season, Tanigawa has posted two finishes in the top 10, and nine finishes in the top 25. His best was at the Insperity Invitational (T7).
- Tanigawa owns one victory on PGA TOUR Champions (2018 PURE Insurance Championship) and five finishes in the top 10.

Other Notes

- The leading position in the Charles Schwab Cup standings remains in play as **Scott McCarron** (4th), **Kirk Triplett** (T11), and **Scott Parel** (T11) all have an opportunity.
- Charles Schwab Cup leader **Scott McCarron** carded four birdies for a 3-under 67 in the third round. He sits T4, four strokes behind the leader. McCarron leads the field in putting this week (78 on 42).
- **Corey Pavin** landed a 70-foot birdie putt on No. 9 to add to his five additional birdies and finished the third round at 4-under 66. Pavin has finished runner-up three times in a major championship on PGA TOUR Champions.
- **John Reigger** entered the field as an alternate when Ian Woosnam withdrew. Reigger is now T5 after a 1-under 69 in the third round. Reigger has two starts this year on Tour and is playing in his fifth KitchenAid Senior PGA Championship.
- **Bob Sowards** (Kinsale Golf and Fitness Club) is the low golf professional after the second round at T15.
- Shaun Micheel, winner of the 2003 PGA Championship at Oak Hill, is T47 at 10-over 220.
- Jay Haas, winner of the 2008 KitchenAid Senior PGA Championship at Oak Hill, is T64 at 13-over 223.
- **Michael Bradley** (+9) and **Tom Gillis** (+9) withdrew prior to the third round.
- This week's winner will receive a lifetime exemption into the KitchenAid Senior PGA Championship and exemptions into the 2020 PGA Championship, 2019 Senior Open Championship and 2019 U.S. Senior Open.
