SCOTT McCARRON (-8)



Q. What was the key for you today out there in what seemed to be a pretty difficult day for most guys?

SCOTT McCARRON: Well, it was a tough day to judge what the wind was doing. I drove the ball extremely well again today, which you've got to do here. You have to drive the ball pretty straight. Some of these fairways, they might only be about eight paces wide in some areas. Hit a lot of fairways, drive it pretty far down there.

I had a lot of opportunities. I left a few out there coming down the stretch. I mean, two three-putts and easy up-and-down, but I make a bogey, it's a little disappointing, but to finish off with birdie there feels pretty good.

Q. When you're going like this, two wins, two second place finishes, massive lead in the Charles Schwab Cup standings, what's going on with your being, your whole what you're doing out here? What are you doing, what are you thinking, what's the confidence like?

SCOTT McCARRON: Well, I certainly play with a lot of confidence. Each week's a new week. It doesn't matter what you did the week prior or what you think you can do, every day is new. So I try to stay in the moment as much as I can, but I'm also again playing with a lot of confidence. That's the big thing. I come out, I want to play, I want to work out, I want to eat right, all those things and I think just having that fun factor (inaudible).

Q. So going into tomorrow, lots of guys within shouting distance, for sure. One word, fill in the blank, Scott McCarron, I have to do what tomorrow to win this thing?

SCOTT McCARRON: One word? That's a good question. Why don't you give me two words?

Q. I'll give you two words.

SCOTT McCARRON: How about (inaudible).

Q. That's a perfect answer. Good luck tomorrow.

SCOTT McCARRON: I could say stay in the moment, or stay, that would make sense. One word, what am I, Wheel of Fortune?

Q. So you were in the same spot here in 2017. What do you think it is about this course that suits your game?

SCOTT McCARRON: You know, I like this golf course in that the greens, one thing, are the best greens we putt on almost all year. I mean, they are phenomenal, so I like that aspect. And I like the lines off the tees. You've got to be pretty creative out here. Sometimes I'm driving like 40 yards over the trees and I'm trying to drive it in small little areas, but it's a golf course that just fits my eye off the tee.

Q. Is it unfinished business would you say a little bit?

SCOTT McCARRON: Well, it always is when you finish second. When you finish second 21 months ago to Montgomerie, I felt I certainly was playing well enough to win, I didn't get the job done, so we've got a little unfinished business. But again, there's a lot of guys in the hunt and someone could go low tomorrow and I'm just going to have to play really well.
