#### Scott McCarron, 69-67-136 (-8)

- McCarron is a leader/co-leader entering the final round for the 14<sup>th</sup> time in his career, winning a total of six times he's been in this position, including both victories this season (Mitusbishi Electric Classic, Insperity Invitational).
- At the 2017 Mastercard Japan Championship, McCarron held the outright lead heading into Sunday at 12-under, but finished T2 to Colin Montgomerie.
- For the sixth straight week, McCarron holds the lead position in the Charles Schwab Cup standings with \$1,366,211 in earnings, leading No. 2 Ken Tanigawa by nearly \$477,000.
- With a win tomorrow, he would extend his lead by \$400,000 to \$1,766,211.
- In his 10 victories so far on PGA TOUR Champions, McCarron's final-round scoring average is 66.60.
- He has a total of 45 finishes in the top-10 and 69 finishes in the top-25 in his five years on PGA TOUR Champions.
- A native of Sacramento, Calif., McCarron won three times on the PGA TOUR.

#### Kirk Triplett, 69-68–137 (-7)

- Triplett carded five birdies and one bogey en route to finishing with a second-round 4-under par 68.
- Earlier this season, Triplett won the Hoag Classic with an 18-foot eagle putt on the second playoff hole to beat Woody Austin at Newport Beach CC in Newport Beach, Calif.
- He will be playing in Sunday's final group for the second time this year (Hoag Classic; Cologuard Classic-T2)
- Triplett owns a total of seven titles and 10 runner-up finishes, including three this year. He has a total of 58 top-10 finishes.
- He is currently No. 6 in the Charles Schwab Cup with \$738,669.

#### **Second-Round Lead Notes**

- At the 2017 Mastercard Japan Championship, Montgomerie started the final round T3 and three shots behind second-round leader McCarron. Through seven holes Sunday, he was 1-over for the day and 8-under for the tournament and still trailed by three. Montgomerie birdied Nos. 8, 10, 12, 13, 14 and 17 to finish at 14-under-par, one shot ahead of McCarron and **Billy Mayfair**.
- This season, players leading/co-leading entering the final round have won seven out of 12 tournaments. Most recently, Steve Stricker converted his Saturday-night lead into victory at the Regions Tradition.

#### **Other Notes**

- Cliff Kresge's second-round 6-under par 66 was the lowest of the field on Saturday and his best round in nine starts on PGA TOUR Champions. The three-time Web.com Tour winner was the second to last player in the field, gaining entry when Joey Sindelar withdrew due to an injury the Saturday prior to the event.
- **Billy Andrade** carded five birdies and two bogeys and is currently 6-under heading into Sunday. He has four top-10s this season and owns a total of three victories on PGA TOUR Champions.
- Scott Parel had five birdies on Saturday, including Nos. 10-12 and also finished the day at 6-under. At last week's Principal Charity Classic, Parel set the tournament's 36-hole scoring record to hold the outright lead, but **Kevin Sutherland** came back with a course record 62 on Sunday to force a playoff, ultimately claiming the victory on the second hole.
- **Darren Clarke** is the fourth player tied for third at 6-under. He has two top-10s this season, including a tie for second at the Cologuard Classic, and is currently No. 33 in the Charles Schwab Cup.
- Defending champion Colin Montgomerie finished the day even-par and is currently T8 (-4).
- **Toshimitsu Izawa** is currently 5-under par and leads the field of eight players to receive a sponsor exemption (home country):
