MIKE GOODES (-4)

Q. Incredible round today.

MIKE GOODES: Thank you.

Q. How are you feeling?

MIKE GOODES: Good, good. Everything went good. I bogeyed the last hole, but I hit two good shots and it came back off the green. I hit a hard chip and didn't get it up and down. But I played really good. I was fortunate, I made a long putt on No. 3, the par 3. I hit back of the green and just trying to get it close and it goes right in the middle of the pin, it stops it and all. Then I hit it close a few times coming in. It's nice to have some short birdie putts.

Q. This is your 10th appearance at this event, so you've been here from the beginning and obviously your results have really varied here. What has that been about?

MIKE GOODES: I don't know. I think a whole lot how I'm playing. I come in here, it's a hard golf course. You've really got to be hitting your irons -- you've got to hit the fairways without being said, but then you've got to hit really good, crisp, solid irons so that you can control your spin and keep it in areas of the green that you're trying to get, give yourself decent birdie putts. And if you don't do that, is it going to roll away from you off the greens and down in places where it's hard to make pars. I'm fortunate, I've hit a lot of good irons the last two days and driven the ball pretty nice and made a few putts.

Q. T-6 is your best finish here. How do you capitalize on this moment today to try to go on and --

MIKE GOODES: Just go try to play good. I can't control what anybody else does, I just try to control what I do. It's hard to predict, just want to go play good.

Q. Did you anything different last night that kind of set you up for today?

MIKE GOODES: I cried all night because I watched my Tar Heels lose. Maybe I have to find a sad movie tonight.
