

ROUND 2 INTERVIEW

BILLY ANDRADE (-9)

Q. Today was a normal round for you since you finished yesterday, didn't have to come out and play more than one round. How were the conditions considering yesterday's weather?

BILLY ANDRADE: I thought it was amazing how dry it was. I thought that for sure it was going to have a lot more casual water, kind of like last week in Houston where you're dropping, trying to find dry land. This place has drained unbelievably, I couldn't believe it. And the greens are relatively the same as they were when we played yesterday before the rain. I thought the course was fantastic.

Q. You had a bogey-free round, you're T-5 in putting overall today so far. Was your putter kind of locked in?

BILLY ANDRADE: Yeah, I putted well. I really -- I'm going to go to the putting green because I feel like there was a lot more out there. I played well enough that I thought I could have gotten a few more to drop that didn't drop. But these greens I think are very tricky, a lot of putts where you think they're going to break a certain way, especially the left-to-righters, and some of them break and some of them go straight. So it's very frustrating when you feel like you're hitting some pretty good putts, but overall I feel good about the way I've played.

Q. So you think putting's going to be what it takes to keep moving up the leaderboard the next two days?

BILLY ANDRADE: Absolutely, yeah. You've got to -- obviously you've got to hit it well, but especially a place like here where, unless you get some crazy wind, you know, the greens are favorable to getting it close and they're soft enough. So yes, I need to make a few putts.
