

DOUG BARRON (-10)

Q. Seems like the course might have been a little more conducive to scoring today just overall, just judging by the feel today. How do you feel you played today?

DOUG BARRON: I played really good. I got off to a good start. I didn't finish the way I wanted, but I hit the ball solidly. I made one bad swing -- two bad swings off the tee all day and got away with one of them. Made a good bogey on the one I got away with. I'm playing with one of the best ball-strikers of my generation, I'm playing with the number two money leader, so I mean, you're not going to get away with it if you don't keep making birdies. It is what it is.

Q. I was going to say that putt after the eagle, you make the bogey putt?

DOUG BARRON: Yeah, it was a great bogey.

Q. It was a round saver.

DOUG BARRON: It was a round saver. But I never really hit it close and then I didn't play conservative, I just didn't have yardages that I liked. And when you're playing with -- like I say, I always think Woody's one of the best ball-strikers I've ever played with and Jerry's up there on the Money List this year as he always is, you can't back up coming in. I'm a little disappointed with No. 17, but I'm playing good golf. Like I said, this isn't like or death stuff for me, so I'm having fun.

Q. The fact that you were able to win early this year, that should help you tomorrow?

DOUG BARRON: Well, it helps.

DOUG BARRON: Well, I'm not in the lead, I'm tied for the Let.

Q. But technically...

DOUG BARRON: The bottom line is you have to go out and play the best golf. Doesn't matter. Like even if I was in the lead by one, I'd say I'm still tied or behind, play like I'm behind because these guys are so good, they're not going to back up. I'm just going to go out and play golf, I'm not living or dying over it.
