What is your thought process in regards to the wildcard and how you're approaching that?

ROD PAMPLING: Realistically, if I play some good golf, that will take care of itself. I'm not going out there thinking about the wildcard. Still at this stage I'm thinking about winning, which that takes care of the wildcard and everything.

My thought process tomorrow is just play as good of golf as I have the last two days and just try and make some more putts. We've been patient, which has been good, which that's the kind of golf course it is. It's tricky out there. At the end of the day, if I take care of my own golf and still shoot for the win, the wildcard, and hopefully it won't get the curse on that one. If we play good golf, it will happen, so I'm not really worried about it.
