Today – Warm and likely dry conditions expected today with a weak frontal boundary approaching the area late this afternoon. Shower development looks unlikely along the boundary with a subtle wind shift the main consequence. Winds will be out of the southwest for most of the round with some gusts of 15-20 mph possible between 10am-2pm. A high in the middle 80s is expected.

Extended Forecast –A complex of showers/T-storms will develop over MN/IA tonight and then tracks into northern Illinois by Sunday morning. While most of this activity remains north of the area, a shower/T-storm can't be ruled out near Springfield. The other concern will be strong southerly winds with gusts around 30 mph becoming possible by Sunday afternoon. A cold front will move into the Chicago area Sunday night and then become stalled out near the area on Monday. This front will likely remain over the region through Thursday with periods of rain and storms. Rainfall amounts over 1 inch appear possible.
