


Today – Strengthening southeast flow and increasing moisture will allow showers and isolated T-storms to develop this afternoon. The main concern is heavy downpours, with lightning a secondary concern. The more widespread activity likely remains to our north. Temperatures will once again climb into the lower 90s with heat indices near 100F. Southeast winds will increase to 7-14 mph for the afternoon hours.

Extended Forecast – Hurricane Delta will track through the Southeast U.S. on Saturday/Sunday with south to southwest flow bringing excessive moisture to the Florida Peninsula. There will be a threat for showers/T-storms both afternoons. However, given modest instability levels, the main concern are heavy downpours. The highest precipitation should also hold off until after 3pm Saturday/Sunday. Temperatures will climb near 90 degrees each day. Southerly winds will be in place this weekend, sustained at 6-14 mph.
