Extended Forecast – Another dry day will be seen on Saturday, however clouds will be on the increase, especially during the afternoon. A stalled out frontal boundary over Florida will start to lift northward Saturday night into Sunday. This, combined with a weak tropical disturbance, will bring a substantial surge of moisture into SE Georgia. A sharp cutoff in precipitation is expected near the coast so confidence in rainfall amounts and coverage is still low. In Orlando, a stalled frontal boundary over the Florida Peninsula will keep daily chances for showers/T-storms in the forecast early next week.
