


Extended Forecast – Moisture will surge back northward tonight into tomorrow with the threat for rain returning to the forecast. The heavier and more widespread precipitation should stay offshore with just off and on showers more likely for Savannah. In Orlando, a stalled frontal boundary over the Florida Peninsula will keep daily chances for showers/T-storms in the forecast early next week. There is potential for tropical development in the Gulf of Mexico towards the end of the next week as well. Regardless of development, moisture levels will remain elevated with a continuing threat for showers/T-storms.
