Orlando Forecast – A stalled frontal boundary will remain situated over the Florida Peninsula throughout the week. This front, combined with seasonably high moisture levels and afternoon sea breezes will bring a daily threat for showers/T-storms. The main threat for precipitation will be during the afternoon. The other concern is the potential for tropical development in the Gulf of Mexico mid to late week. If organization can occur, the risk for widespread, heavier rains, could increase depending on the track. Temperatures will generally be in the middle to upper 80s each day with an easterly wind in place.
