Extended Forecast (Nassau) – Relatively dry conditions are expected in Nassau on Thursday with a weak frontal boundary arriving late Friday. Showers could develop as early as Friday afternoon, coming to an end Friday night. Mostly dry conditions appear likely for the weekend. Gusty northeast winds will occur behind the front late Friday, slowly diminishing during the day Saturday. Next week could be unsettled as an area of low pressure develops north of the Bahamas and a cold front moves through. Highest rain chances favor Tuesday. Limited instability will likely mitigate the lightning threat.
