Once the sun comes out, temperatures will quickly climb through the 90s with a high near 100 degrees expected. Peak heat indices will be near 105 degrees. Southerly winds of 6-14 mph will occur throughout the day with gusts up to 20 mph.

Extended Forecast – Upper level ridging will continue to strengthen with dry conditions and hot temperatures. Highs over 100 degrees are likely through early next week with hottest temperatures expected Sunday, Monday and Tuesday. Record highs are likely each of these days. Somewhat drier air will keep heat indices near actual air temperatures. Slightly weaker southerly winds will be in place this weekend before increasing again early next week.
