Things to Know

• Matthew Wolff returns to defend his lone PGA TOUR title

- Tommy Fleetwood makes his first TOUR start since March, as he makes his tournament debut
- Additional headliners include Dustin Johnson, Brooks Koepka and Tony Finau
- The 3M Open is a second-year PGA TOUR event (2019); TPC Twin Cities previously hosted the 3M Championship, a PGA TOUR Champions event for nearly 20 years (1993-2018)
- The 2019 3M Open marked the first non-major PGA TOUR event in the state of Minnesota since the 1969
 Minnesota Golf Classic; The last PGA TOUR event in Minnesota was the 2009 PGA Championship at Hazeltine; the 2016 Ryder Cup was also contested at Hazeltine
- TPC Twin Cities is an Arnold Palmer design with Tom Lehman as consultant; renovated prior to the 2019 3M Open

Notes on the Field

- Four players in the top 20 in the Official World Golf Ranking; Dustin Johnson (4), Brooks Koepka (6), Tommy Fleetwood (12), Tony Finau (17)
- Nine major champions: Brooks Koepka (4), Bubba Watson (2), Dustin Johnson, Jason Dufner, Lucas Glover, Stewart Cink, Charl Schwartzel, Rich Beem and Tom Lehman (1)

FedExCup and the 3M Open

- With his 3M Open win last year, Matthew Wolff became eligible for PGA TOUR membership and moved to 73rd in the standings; qualified for the Playoffs (THE NORTHERN TRUST/T71)
- Collin Morikawa, who finished T2 at last year's 3M Open, entered the Wyndham Rewards Top 10 for the first time after winning the Workday Charity Open two weeks ago
- Webb Simpson (No. 2), Rory McIlroy (No. 5) and Jon Rahm (No. 8) are the only three players from last season's final Wyndham Rewards Top 10 who are currently inside the top 10 with four weeks left in the Regular Reason

Player Notes

Matthew Wolff (FedExCup No. 45, OWGR No. 55)

- Eagled 72nd hole to claim first PGA TOUR win by one stroke and became the third player to win NCAA individual championship title and PGA TOUR event in same year
- 2019 victory at TPC Twin Cities came in his third start as a professional
- Became the first player to win his first PGA TOUR event before his 21st birthday since Jordan Spieth at the 2013 John Deere Classic
- Enjoyed an outstanding amateur career at Oklahoma State University; made the winning putt to clinch the 2018 NCAA Championship; won the 2019 NCAA individual title; received Phil Mickelson Award in 2017-18 as the nation's most outstanding freshman, as well as the Haskins Award in 2019 for top collegiate golfer
- Lone top-10 finish in 16 starts this season was a solo-second at the Rocket Mortgage Classic
- Comes off a T22 finish at last week's the Memorial Tournament presented by Nationwide

Dustin Johnson (FedExCup No. 25, OWGR No. 4)

- Making his second start since collecting his 21st career PGA TOUR title at the Travelers Championship
- Additional top-10 finishes this season (in eight starts): T7/Sentry Tournament of Champions, T10/The Genesis Invitational
- · Comes off a missed cut at last week's the Memorial Tournament presented by Nationwide
- In last PGA TOUR start in Minnesota, finished T10 at the PGA Championship in 2009

Brooks Koepka (FedExCup No. 154, OWGR No. 6)

- Four-time major winner; 2017-18 U.S. Open, 2018-19 PGA Championship
- Seeks his eighth TOUR title and first since the 2019 World Golf Championships-FedEx St. Jude Invitational
- 3M Open marks his third start since collecting his 40th career top-10 finish on the PGA TOUR (7th/RBC Heritage)
- Has held the World No. 1 spot on two different occasions, most recently from the 2019 PGA Championship through the 2019 THE CJ CUP @ NINE BRIDGES

Tommy Fleetwood (FedExCup No. 81, OWGR No. 12)

- Making his first start on TOUR since a missed cut at the Arnold Palmer Invitational presented by Mastercard
- One top-10 in six starts this season (3rd/The Honda Classic)
- In search of first TOUR title; in 65 starts, owns four runner-up finishes

Tony Finau (FedExCup No. 32, OWGR No. 17)

- Comes off an eighth-place finish at last week's the Memorial Tournament presented by Nationwide
- Posted four rounds in the 60s to finish T23 in last year's inaugural 3M Open
- Best of four top 10s this season was a playoff loss to Webb Simpson at the Waste Management Phoenix Open
- Member of the victorious American Team in the 2019 Presidents Cup at Royal Melbourne GC in Australia
- Winner of the 2016 Puerto Rico Open

Notable Exemptions

Tom Lehman

- From Austin, Minnesota and played collegiately at the University of Minnesota
- Five wins on the PGA TOUR, including the 1996 Open Championship, and 12 on PGA TOUR Champions, most recently the 2019 Mitsubishi Electric Championship at Hualalai
- Last PGA TOUR start was the 2020 Charles Schwab Challenge (MC)
- Is the only player in history to be named Player of the Year on the PGA TOUR, the Korn Ferry Tour and PGA TOUR
 Champions; Has 21 cumulative wins across all three Tours (4 wins/Korn Ferry Tour, 5/PGA TOUR, 12/PGA TOUR
 Champions)
- Consulted on course renovations at TPC Twin Cities where he played the 3M Championship eight times with a T2 in 2011 his best result

Erik van Rooyen

• 30-year-old South African will be making his 16th career start on the PGA TOUR and ninth of the 2019-20 season

- Played college golf at the University of Minnesota in the Twin Cities, which is where he met his wife
- Best TOUR finish came earlier this season with a T3 at the World Golf Championships-Mexico Championship;
 finished T8 at the 2019 PGA Championship
- Comes off a T22 at last week's the Memorial Tournament presented by Nationwide

Additional Player Notes

- Former TCU golfer **Tom Hoge** is a two-time Minnesota State Amateur champion
- Two-time PGA TOUR winner **Troy Merritt** is a former Spring Lake Park and Winona State golfer
- 2012 and 2014 Masters Tournament winner **Bubba Watson** will make his first start in the 3M Open; best of three top-10 finishes this season was T3/Waste Management Phoenix Open
