Extended forecast – A complex of showers and thunderstorms is expected to be ongoing across northern Minnesota Friday morning, with precipitation chances remaining isolated around TPC Twin Cities as a warm front lifts through the area. Friday night will see another large complex of showers and thunderstorms move from the Dakotas into western Minnesota by early Saturday. This activity may reach TPC Twin Cities during the morning hours on Saturday – though recent forecast guidance suggests this complex will be weakening as it approaches east-central Minnesota. Additional scattered thunderstorms are forecast to redevelop Saturday afternoon. A cold front is expected to bring another round of showers and thunderstorms on Sunday. Confidence on the timing of this front is medium, with guidance currently suggesting that this boundary will push through during the morning hours with lower chances for precipitation redevelopment in the afternoon. Heat indices will be in the upper 90s to near 100F Friday—Saturday and could reach the mid-90s on Sunday.
