**Things to Know**

- Nick Taylor holds the first 54-hole lead/co-lead of his career and tops his career-low 54-hole score by three strokes
- Taylor in search of the first wire-to-wire victory at the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am since Phil Mickelson in 2005
- The last two players on TOUR to lead outright after each of the first three rounds have gone on to win in wire-to-wire fashion
- Defending champion Phil Mickelson trails by a single shot as he seeks record-breaking sixth AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am title
- The last international winner of the event was Vijay Singh in 2004
- Jason Day has finished in the top five in four of the last five years at the event but has not recorded a top-10 on TOUR since the 2019 Travelers Championship
- 2018 team champions Kevin Streelman and Larry Fitzgerald lead the Pro-Am portion of the tournament by one stroke over Phil Mickelson and Steve Young

**Nick Taylor (1<sup>st</sup>/-17); MP-PB-SH**

- First 54-hole lead/co-lead on the PGA TOUR (previous-best 54-hole position: T2/2019 Safeway Open; finished T10)
- Better career-low 54-hole score by three strokes (201/2019 Shriners Hospitals for Children Open/finished T29)

- 198 total through three rounds falls two shy of tournament record (Phil Mickelson/2005, Dustin Johnson/2010, Paul Goydos/2010)
- The last two players to lead outright after each of the first three rounds have gone on to win in wire-to-wire fashion (Brooks Koepka/2019 PGA Championship, Nate Lashley/2019 Rocket Mortgage Classic)
- The last wire-to-wire winner at the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am was Phil Mickelson in 2005
- Has played his last 208 holes without a 3-putt
- Last Canadian to win on the PGA TOUR: Corey Connors/2019 Valero Texas Open
- Last international-born player to win the event was Vijay Singh (2004)
- One top-10 in five previous starts at the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am (T10/2017)
- One top-10 in nine previous starts during the 2019-20 season (T10/Safeway Open)
- Winner of the 2014 Sanderson Farms Championship

#### **Phil Mickelson (2<sup>nd</sup>/-16); SH-MP-PB**

- Carded a third-round 5-under 67 at Pebble Beach, highlighted by back-to-back hole-outs for birdie from the bunker on No. 13 (46'11") and off the green on No. 14 (88'3")
- Currently trails Nick Taylor by one stroke; trailed entering the final round in last two wins at the event, including a three-stroke come-from-behind win in 2019 and a six-stroke comeback victory in 2012
- Five-time AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am champion (1998, 2005, 2007, 2012, 2019); currently tied with Mark O'Meara for most wins in the event
- Currently in second place, marks the 25<sup>th</sup> time since 1998 he has been inside the top 3 after any round at the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am (Dustin Johnson is next on the list with 16)
- In search of his 15th win in the state of California since 1983; currently tied for most with Tiger Woods
- Last player to successfully defend title at the event: Dustin Johnson, 2010
- Last player to successfully defend title on TOUR: Brooks Koepka, 2019 PGA Championship
- At age 49, would be the oldest winner on TOUR since Davis Love III at the 2015 Wyndham Championship (51)
- Comes off back-to-back missed cuts in his last two TOUR starts (The American Express, Farmers Insurance Open); won the event in 2019 after missing a cut in his most recent start (2019 Waste Management Phoenix Open)

#### **Jason Day (3<sup>rd</sup>/-14); MP-PB-SH**

- Played 35 consecutive holes without a bogey until the par-4 17<sup>th</sup> at Spyglass during the third round
- Has three come-from-behind wins on TOUR (2015 and 2018 Farmers Insurance Open, 2015 RBC Canadian Open)
- 12-time PGA TOUR winner; in search of first victory since the 2018 Wells Fargo Championship
- Last top-10 on TOUR came at the 2019 Travelers Championship (T8)
- Four top-fives in the last five seasons at the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am (T4/2015, T5/2017, T2/2018, T4/2019)
- Has never missed the cut and owns eight top-20 finishes in 10 prior starts at the event

#### **Miscellaneous Notes**

- 2018 team champions **Kevin Streelman** (T4/-11) and Larry Fitzgerald lead the Pro-Am portion of the competition at 27-under, one clear of **Phil Mickelson** and Steve Young; the last player to win the individual and pro-am team title in the same year is Vaughn Taylor (with amateur Gregg Ontiveros) in 2016
- **Matt Every** (T4/-11) is making his 16<sup>th</sup> start since his last top-10 finish on TOUR (2019 AT&T Byron Nelson/T2)
- 2015 Sanderson Farms Championship winner **Peter Malnati** (6/-10) posted his last top-10 finish in an individual stroke-play event at the 2016 Sentry Tournament of Champions (T6)
- **Scott Piercy** (T7/-9) has played his last 256 holes without a 3-putt, the current longest streak on TOUR; following a T6 last week at the Waste Management Phoenix Open, in pursuit of first back-to-back top-10 finishes in individual stroke-play events since the 2019 RBC Heritage (T3) and AT&T Byron Nelson (T2)
- **Charl Schwartzel** (T7/-9) is competing on a Major Medical Extension with 11 starts available to earn 262 points to equal No. 125 on the 2018-19 FedExCup points list (Pat Perez/376); can accomplish with a solo-second or better
- 2009 and 2010 champion **Dustin Johnson** (T7/-9) owns seven top-five finishes in 12 prior starts at the AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am; in his only other start this season, finished T7 at the Sentry Tournament of Champions
- **Kramer Hickok** withdrew prior to the third round with food poisoning
