Things to Know

- Adam Schenk holds his first lead/co-lead after any round on the PGA TOUR
- Ryan Moore cards a bogey-free round in his first Barracuda Championship start since 2008
- With six consecutive birdies, Patrick Rodgers sets his best consecutive birdie streak on TOUR
- Coming off a T3 at the 2019 Barracuda Championship, Robert Streb sits three points off the lead

Scoring

The Barracuda Championship is employing the Modified Stableford scoring format, the first PGA TOUR event to use the format since The International in 2006. Players are allocated points based on the number of strokes taken at each hole with the goal of achieving the highest overall score.

- In his 81st career start, holds the first lead/co-lead after any round on the PGA TOUR
- Making second start at Barracuda Championship (MC/2018)
- Seeking first PGA TOUR win (best career finish: T6/2019 John Deere Classic)
- Entered the week No. 110 in the FedExCup standings, seeking to qualify for the Playoffs for the second straight season
- In 21 total starts of the 2019-20 season, owns four top-25 finishes (best: T14/Puerto Rico Open and The American Express)

Ryan Moore (+14/T1)

- Marks ninth first-round lead/co-lead on TOUR; Has converted two of those instances into victory (2012 Shriners Hospitals for Children Open, 2013 CIMB Classic)
- Owns two top-10 finishes in the 2019-20 season (T8/THE CJ CUP @ NINE BRIDGES, T6/The American Express)
- Seeking sixth TOUR victory and first since the 2016 John Deere Classic
- Has qualified for the FedExCup Playoffs every season since its inception (2007); Entered the week No. 87 in the standings

Additional Notes

- **Robert Streb** (+11/T3) notched four consecutive birdies (Nos. 10-13) in his opening round; In four previous starts at the Barracuda Championship, has never missed the cut (best finish: T3/2019)
- With six consecutive birdies on Nos. 2-7, Patrick Rodgers (+11/T3) recorded his best birdie streak on TOUR (previous best, most recent: 5/R2/2018 Corales Puntacana Resort & Club Championship)
- Seamus Power (+11/T3) was perfect in scrambling, getting up-and-down eight of eight times on Thursday
- Will Gordon (+8/T18) looks to become the second straight Special Temporary Member to win the Barracuda Championship (Collin Morikawa/2019); To earn full status on TOUR for the 2020-21 season, he must earn as many or more points through the non-member FedExCup points list as No. 125 on the 2019-20 season FedExCup standings
- Vaughn Taylor withdrew prior to his round with a rib injury and was not replaced in the field; Michael Kim withdrew during
 the round with a back injury

Barracuda Bonus

The first player to post an albatross on No. 12 (8 Stableford points) in each round will receive a \$100,000 charitable donation in his name. Half of all charity dollars will go to local Reno-Tahoe charities (which the tournament will direct) and the remaining 50% will be directed to a 501(c)(3) of the winning player's choice.
