Things to Know

- Kyle Stanley holds 36-hole lead/co-lead for sixth time seeking to convert for the win for the first time
- Austria's Matthias Schwab seeks to become the first sponsor exemption to win since Matthew Wolff (2019 3M Open)
- Robert Streb has never missed the cut in five appearances at the Barracuda Championship
- Four bogey-free rounds were all recorded in the morning wave
- Winner earns a spot in the field at next week's PGA Championship if not already exempt; top two players, not otherwise exempt, finishing in the top-10 and ties, earn exemptions into 2020 U.S. Open

Scoring

The Barracuda Championship is employing the Modified Stableford scoring format, the first PGA TOUR event to use the format since The International in 2006. Players are allocated points based on the number of strokes taken at each hole with the goal of achieving the highest overall score.

Kyle Stanley (+22/1st)

- Two-time TOUR winner (2012 Waste Management Phoenix Open, 2017 Quicken Loans National) mixed one eagle, six birdies and three bogeys en route to +14 points and a +2-point lead through 36 holes
- Marks sixth time with 36-hole lead/co-lead on TOUR, failing to convert previous five into a win (most recent, 2020 Puerto Rico
 Open/T3)
- Sits No. 131 in FedExCup while seeking to advance to the FedExCup Playoffs for the fifth consecutive season and eight overall
- Lone top-10 in 18 starts this season; T3/Puerto Rico Open
- Three previous appearances at Barracuda Championship (T8/2014, T56/2015, 80th/2016)
- One of two players with two eagles through 36 holes (Roberto Castro/+14/T19)

Additional Notes

- Playing on a sponsor exemption, non-member **Matthias Schwab** (+20/T2) makes his sixth PGA TOUR start and first at the Barracuda Championship; last sponsor exemption and last non-member to win on TOUR; Matthew Wolff/2019 3M Open
- In four previous starts at the Barracuda Championship, Robert Streb (+20/T2) has never missed the cut (best finish: T3/2019)
- At No. 79 in the Official World Golf Ranking, **Branden Grace** (+20/T2) is highest ranked player in the field; birdied four of last six holes to reach +20 points in his first appearance in this tournament; entered this week off four consecutive missed cuts
- PGA TOUR rookie **Maverick McNealy** (+19/T5) birdied his opening two holes for the second consecutive day; sits No. 60 in FedExCup standings; two career top-10s have both come this season (T5/AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am, T8/Rocket Mortgage Classic); finished T65 at 2017 Barracuda Championship
- Troy Merritt (+19/T5), runner-up at 2019 Barracuda Championship, began bogey-eagle-bogey before notching three birdies in a row (Nos. 7-9) en route to a +11 score; in next week's PGA Championship, replacing Francesco Molinari who withdrew Friday
- **Emiliano Grillo** (+18/T7) seeks second PGA TOUR title in his 126th start; win would mark his second title in California (2015 Safeway Open/Napa, California); finished T18 at 2019 Barracuda Championship
- Cameron Percy (+18/T7) makes seventh appearance at Barracuda Championship, advancing to the weekend once in six previous starts (T13/2016); since becoming a TOUR member in 2010, has yet to advance to the FedExCup Playoffs (entered this week No. 139)
- Russell Knox (+18/T7) advances to the weekend after 10 consecutive missed cuts entering this week
- **Peter Uihlein** (+18/T7) makes third appearance at Barracuda Championship (MC/2013, T18/2019); owns nine top-10 finishes in 97 starts on TOUR, but none in the top-3
- 18-hole co-leaders Adam Schenk (+18/T7) and Ryan Moore (+16/T14) fail to maintain share of lead
- After beginning the day at T118, **Wyndham Clark** (+8/T50) notched nine birdies en route to a +13 score; nine birdies in a single round is one shy of his career best (R1/2020 Waste Management Phoenix Open)

Barracuda Bonus

The first player to post an albatross on No. 12 (+8 points) in each round will receive a \$100,000 charitable donation in his name. Half of all charity dollars will go to local Reno-Tahoe charities (which the tournament will direct) and the remaining 50% will be directed to a 501(c)(3) of the winning player's choice.

• No player has made an albatross on No. 12 in 36 holes however, five eagles have been recorded at No. 12 in the first two rounds (Seamus Power/R1, Kyle Stanley/R2, Patrick Rodgers/R2, Michael Gligic/R2, Eric Axley/R2)
