Extended forecast – A few short-lived thunderstorms are possible this evening and overnight – with much of the night being dry. A frontal boundary will stall out across southern Wisconsin through early Friday afternoon before advancing into northern Illinois late Friday afternoon into Friday evening. Numerous thunderstorms will be ongoing Friday morning along and north of the Illinois-Wisconsin state line, while south of this line expect storm coverage to be more hit and miss between 6-10am. A lull in showers and storms chances is expected late Friday morning into much of Friday afternoon before the cold front advances southward late in the day. Thunderstorms will become likely after 7pm and will continue through Friday night – with some of the evening storms becoming strong to severe. Rain and storm chances will come to an end by 6am Saturday, with cooler and dry conditions for the weekend.
