## Things to Know

- Haotong Li becomes first player from China to hold a lead or co-lead after a round in a major
- Brooks Koepka is in a tie for third and two strokes back as he seeks third consecutive PGA Championship title
- Tommy Fleetwood, runner-up at the 2019 Open Championship, posts career-best 36-hole score in a major
- Tommy Fleetwood and Cameron Champ post low tournament round through 36 holes with 64s
- 82-time PGA TOUR winner and 15-time major champion Tiger Woods stands T44
- World No. 1 and 2017 PGA Championship winner Justin Thomas makes the cut on the number to remain a perfect five-for-five in made cuts in the event
- Martin Kaymer and Zach Johnson, who were among nine players tied for third after opening 66s, both miss cut

## Haotong Li (1/-8)

- Bogey-free 65 leads to 132 total, his career-best 36-hole score on TOUR
- Holds second career lead after any round on the PGA TOUR (R1/2019 World Golf Championships-HSBC Champions)
- Marks the first time a player from China has ever held a lead or co-lead after a round in a major
- No player from China has ever won on the PGA TOUR; owns best all-time finish by a player from China with a third-place finish at the 2017 Open Championship (Royal Birkdale)
- Making 12<sup>th</sup> start in a major; best finish: 3<sup>rd</sup>/2017 Open Championship
- After a T24 at the 2019 WGC-HSBC Champions and participating in the 2019 Presidents Cup, has made two starts on TOUR in 2020: the Memorial Tournament presented by Nationwide (MC), WGC-FedEx St. Jude Invitational (T75)

#### Brooks Koepka (T2/-6)

- With rounds of 66-68, 17 of his last 22 major rounds have been in the 60s
- Trailed after 36 holes in two of four major titles: 2018 U.S. Open (T4/Five strokes), 2018 PGA Championship (T3/Two strokes)
- Seeks third consecutive PGA Championship title and fifth major championship victory (wins: 2017 U.S. Open, 2018 U.S. Open, 2018 PGA Championship, 2019 PGA Championship)
- Looks to become the first player since 1956 to win the same major in three consecutive years; players in the last 100 years to accomplish the feat: Walter Hagen (PGA Championship in 1924, 1925, 1926, 1927) and Peter Thomson (The Open Championship in 1954, 1955, 1956)
- Last player to win at least one major in four consecutive years: Tiger Woods (2005, 2006, 2007, 2008)
- With a win, would tie Phil Mickelson for the second-most major championship titles among active players
- With a win, would become the third-youngest player to win five majors since WWII, behind only Tiger Woods and Jack Nicklaus

#### Tommy Fleetwood (T2/-6)

- 134 marks low 36-hole score in a major (previous best: 135/2019 Open Championship)
- 64 marks low score in 18 rounds at the PGA Championship
- Owns two runner-ups in 18 previous major appearances, most recently, a second-place finish at the 2019 Open Championship Royal Portrush, the last major contested
- In his third season as a member of the PGA TOUR; highest-ranked player in the Official World Golf Ranking without a PGA TOUR win

#### Jason Day (T2/-6)

- 2015 PGA Championship winner
- Leads the field in Strokes Gained: Approach the Green (6.751); Ranks 117<sup>th</sup> in the category on the season
- 69 marks sixth straight round in the 60s on TOUR
- Has recorded a top-10 in each of his last three starts (T7/Workday Charity Open, T4/the Memorial Tournament presented by Nationwide, T6/World Golf Championships-FedEx St. Jude Invitational); longest streak since 2016 (Won/the Arnold Palmer Invitational presented by Mastercard, Won/WGC-Dell Technologies Match Play, T10/Masters Tournament)
- 12-time PGA TOUR winner; most recent: 2018 Wells Fargo Championship
- Winner of THE PLAYERS Championship in 2016

## Tiger Woods (T44/E)

- Sits eight shots off the lead in his 21st start at the PGA Championship
- Followed season-high 114 feet, 9 inches of putts in round one with 48 feet, 11 inches in the second round
- Four-time PGA Championship winner (1999, 2000, 2006, 2007)

# **Additional Player Notes**

- Daniel Berger (T2) has finished in the top-three in his last four starts on TOUR, including his win at the Charles Schwab Challenge, the first event held when the season resumed in June
- 2013 U.S. Open winner **Justin Rose** (T2), has missed cuts in his last three TOUR starts (Travelers Championship, Workday Charity Open, the Memorial Tournament presented by Nationwide)
- Mike Lorenzo-Vera (T2) was T4 after 18 holes at the 2019 PGA Championship at Bethpage State Park; Making fifth major start and third start in the PGA Championship (2018/T65, 2019/T16); At No. 82 in the Official World Golf

- Ranking, has not made a competitive start since March 2020 when he missed the cut in the European Tour's Commercial Bank Qatar Masters
- Sacramento native Cameron Champ (T8) posts career-low round in a major with a 64 in his third major start
- Making his 64<sup>th</sup> start in a major, **Paul Casey** (T8) has the most major starts since 2002 without a win (Ian Poulter is second as he makes his 62<sup>nd</sup> major appearance)
- Rickie Fowler missed the cut, snapping a streak of 14 consecutive cuts made in majors, which was the secondlongest active streak (Brooks Koepka leads at 23 consecutive made cuts in majors, with Tommy Fleetwood and Webb Simpson now in second at 12)
- Cameron Tringale was disqualified under Rule 3.3b(3) for signing an incorrect scorecard
