- Dustin Johnson seeks second major championship title; is 0-for-3 in previous 54-hole lead/co-leads in majors
- Brooks Koepka is two strokes back as he seeks third consecutive PGA Championship title
- PGA TOUR Rookie Scottie Scheffler seeks first PGA TOUR win in PGA Championship debut
- Sacramento native Cameron Champ seeks first major title; Leads field in Driving Distance
- Collin Morikawa seeks third PGA TOUR win and first major in his 26th professional start

Leader (entering the week)

Dustin Johnson (1/-9)

- Records his eighth straight round in the 60s at the PGA Championship
- Makes career most birdies in a major championship round with eight in the third round
- Seeks second major championship title (2016 U.S. Open/Oakmont) in 43rd career start in a major

- Holds 54-hole lead/co-lead in a major for the fourth time; has failed to convert a 54-hole lead to victory in a major: 2018 U.S. Open/3, 2015 U.S. Open/T2, 2010 U.S. Open/T8
- Has converted eight of 17 previous 54-hole leads/co-leads in 72-hole events (most recently: 2019 WGC-Mexico Championship)
- Owns four runner-ups in majors: 2019 PGA Championship/2, 2019 Masters/T2, 2015 U.S. Open/T2, 2011 Open Championship/T2
- Earned 21st career PGA TOUR title at 2020 Travelers Championship, extending his streak of earning at least one title to 13 consecutive seasons
- Leads the field in Strokes Gained: Putting (6.705); Made 140' 6" of putts and needed 24 putts in round three

Scottie Scheffler (T2/-8)

- In search of first PGA TOUR victory in his 31st start; last player to earn first TOUR victory at a major: Danny Willett/2016 Masters
- PGA TOUR Rookie is making his third start in a major and first at the PGA Championship (2019 U.S. Open/MC, 2017 U.S. Open/T27, 2016 U.S. Open/MC)
- Seeks to become first rookie to win a major since Keegan Bradley at the 2011 PGA Championship
- Looks to become the ninth player to win the PGA Championship in his debut; Eight players have won the PGA Championship in their tournament debut: Keegan Bradley (2011), Shaun Micheel (2003), John Daly (1991), Bob Tway (1986), Doug Ford (1955), Bob Hamilton (1944), Tom Creavy (1931), Jim Barnes (1916)
- Reigning Korn Ferry Tour Player of the Year after two wins in 2019; Four former Korn Ferry Tour Players have gone on to win majors: Tom Lehman (1996 Open Championship), Stewart Cink (2009 Open Championship), Zach Johnson (2015 Open Championship, 2007 Masters), Jimmy Walker (2016 PGA Championship)
- Looks to join Viktor Hovland as rookie winners on TOUR in 2019-20

Cameron Champ (T2/-8)

- Sacramento native seeks first major title in third major championship appearance: 2017 U.S. Open/T32, 2019 PGA Championship/T54
- Owns two PGA TOUR wins: 2018 Sanderson Farms Championship, 2019 Safeway Open
- Leads the field in Driving Distance (324.5); the last major winner who led in Driving Distance: Justin Thomas/2017 PGA Championship
- Posted low round of the tournament in round two (64)
- Is one of seven African-American winners on the PGA TOUR

Brooks Koepka (T4/-7)

- Made three consecutive bogeys (Nos. 13-15) and finished with birdies at No. 16 and 18 to post 69
- 18 of his last 23 major rounds have been in the 60s
- Has been inside the top-four of the leaderboard after 54 holes in his last six majors
- Came from behind after 54 holes in one of four major titles: 2017 U.S. Open/T2 (one back)
- Seeks third consecutive PGA Championship title and fifth major championship victory (wins: 2017 U.S. Open, 2018 U.S. Open, 2018 PGA Championship, 2019 PGA Championship)
- Looks to become the first player since 1956 to win the same major in three consecutive years; players in the last 100 years to accomplish the feat: Walter Hagen (PGA Championship in 1924, 1925, 1926, 1927) and Peter Thomson (The Open Championship in 1954, 1955, 1956)
- Last player to win at least one major in four consecutive years: Tiger Woods (2005, 2006, 2007, 2008)
- With a win, would tie Phil Mickelson for the second-most major championship titles among active players
- With a win, would become the third-youngest player to win five majors since WWII, behind only Tiger Woods and Jack Nicklaus

Additional Player Notes

- **Bryson DeChambeau**, who seeks first major championship title in 15th appearance, closed his round with a 95' 5" birdie putt, the longest made putt on the PGA TOUR since the 2017 RBC Canadian Open (Nick Watney/95' 7")
- Making his 64th start in a major, **Paul Casey** (T4) has the most major starts since 2002 without a win
- 36-hole leader **Haotong Li** posted a 3-over 73 and is T13
