Event History and Fact Sheet

The 13th Presidents Cup will be contested at The Royal Melbourne Golf Club in Melbourne, Victoria, Australia for a third time. Both captains will make their debuts, with Ernie Els set to lead the International Team, and Tiger Woods guiding the U.S. Team.

The first Presidents Cup was played September 16-18, 1994, at Robert Trent Jones Golf Club in Virginia, USA. The U.S. Team, captained by Hale Irwin, defeated the International Team, captained by David Graham, 20-12.

The United States also won the second Presidents Cup, held September 13-15, 1996, played again at Robert Trent Jones Golf Club. Arnold Palmer, no stranger to high-level international competition, had the reins as the United States edged Peter Thomson's International Team, 16-1/2 to 15-1/2.

The 1998 Presidents Cup was played December 11-13 at The Royal Melbourne Golf Club in Melbourne, Victoria, Australia. The International Team made the most of home-field advantage, winning 20-1/2 to 11-1/2. Jack Nicklaus served as captain of the U.S. Team, while Thomson repeated his role as captain for the International Team.

In 2000, the Presidents Cup returned to Robert Trent Jones, with the United States avenging its 1998 loss with a decisive 21-1/2 to 10-1/2 victory over the International Team. Thomson captained the International Team for a third time, while Ken Venturi was victorious in his debut as U.S. Team captain.

The 2003 Presidents Cup was held at The Links at Fancourt Hotel and Country Club Estate in George, South Africa. The competition ended in a tie, after both teams completed regulation with 17 points. Ernie Els of the International Team and Tiger Woods of the U.S. Team were designated to represent their teams in a sudden-death playoff. After three playoff holes, and as darkness was descending, Captains Gary Player and Nicklaus, in the spirit of the competition, decided that the two teams would share the Cup.

In 2005, Nicklaus and Player returned as captains, and the matches were held once again at the Robert Trent Jones Golf Club. The tie from 2003 was broken with an 18-1/2 to 15-1/2 U.S. victory.

The U.S. Team wrapped up its fifth Presidents Cup victory in seven tries at The Royal Montreal Golf Club in 2007 with a 19-1/2 to 14-1/2 victory, the U.S. Team's first at an international venue in the competition's 13-year history, led once again by Nicklaus. David Toms earned the most points for the U.S. Team, while Woody Austin earned a new nickname - Aquaman - after falling into the lake on hole 14 while attempting a shot. And while his team did not win, Canadian golf hero Mike Weir thrilled the crowds with a 1-up victory over World No. 1 Tiger Woods in Sunday's singles competition. Player captained the International Team for a third and final time.

In 2009, the Presidents Cup was held at TPC Harding Park in San Francisco, Calif., one of the top public golf properties in the United States. Two of the most dominant players on the

PGA TOUR during the 1980s and 1990s, Fred Couples and Greg Norman led the U.S. and International Teams, respectively. The 2009 Presidents Cup marked the first time in event history that both captains were former participants. Couples has appeared four times (1994, 1996, 1998, 2005) for the United States and Norman three (1996, 1998, 2000) for the Internationals, and both factored prominently in victories secured by their respective teams. As first-time captains, Couples and Norman each led strong teams with the U.S. Team retaining the Cup, winning for the sixth time by a score of 19-1/2 to 14-1/2.

The ninth playing of the event occurred November 15-20, 2011, at The Royal Melbourne Golf Club in Melbourne, Victoria, Australia, which was the first international venue to host this prestigious competition more than once. The U.S. Team captured the Presidents Cup for the seventh time, led once again by Captain Couples and a 5-0-0 performance by veteran Jim Furyk. Tiger Woods clinched the Cup for the United States with a 4-and-3 win over Australia's Aaron Baddeley in Sunday Singles. For Woods, it was the second consecutive time he had scored the winning point at the Presidents Cup, becoming only the second player to accomplish that feat (Couples, 1994, 1996) and the first captain's pick to do so. Norman's International Team was outscored 8-3 in foursomes and eventually lost the Cup by four points (19-15).

In 2013, the Presidents Cup was played at Muirfield Village Golf Club in Dublin, Ohio, which became the first golf course to host the Ryder Cup, The Solheim Cup and the Presidents Cup. Nick Price, who owns the distinction of the captain with the most Presidents Cup experience as a player (five appearances) led the International Team, which was defeated by Couples' U.S. Team, 18-1/2 to 15-1/2, despite an impressive Sunday charge by the Internationals. Woods once again clinched the victory for the U.S. Team for the third straight time, becoming the first player in event history to accomplish that feat. Couples became the winningest captain in Presidents Cup history with a 3-0-0 record.

The Presidents Cup was held in Asia for the first time when the 2015 edition was played at Jack Nicklaus Golf Club Korea in Songdo IBD, Incheon City, Korea. A tight battle between the United States and International teams brought the competition to the final match and the final hole. Bill Haas, son of U.S. Captain Jay Haas and a captain's pick for the team, secured the winning point in dramatic fashion against South Korea's Sangmoon Bae on the 18th hole.

In the shadow of the Manhattan skyline at Liberty National Golf Club in Jersey City, New Jersey, for the 2017 Presidents Cup, the U.S. Team, led by first-time captain Steve Stricker, delivered an impressive performance in a dominant 19-11 victory over captain Nick Price and the International Team to remain undefeated in the United States. Presidents Cup rookie Daniel Berger secured the clinching point while veteran Phil Mickelson surpassed Tiger Woods with the most match victories in Presidents Cup history with 26.

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA:

U.S. TEAM

The top eight (8) U.S. PGA TOUR members who earned the most FedExCup points from the 2017 BMW Championship through the 2019 BMW Championship, weighted as follows:

- (a) 2017 BMW Championship through 2018 TOUR Championship: 1 FedExCup point = 1 point
- (b) First event of the 2018-2019 season through 2019 BMW Championship: 1 FedExCup point = 2 points

Four Captain's selections were made on 8 November.

INTERNATIONAL TEAM

The top eight (8) international players (excluding those eligible for the European Ryder Cup team) from the Presidents Cup International Team Points List which shall be Official World Golf Ranking points accumulated in the time period from the 2018 Dell Technologies Championship through the 2019 BMW Championship.

Four Captain's selections were made on 7 November.

FORMAT:

Presidents Cup competition consists of 30 matches. Host Team Captain Els chose to begin with Four-Ball for Thursday's matches. The following segments will then alternate accordingly, with 12 Singles matches being played on Sunday:

- Thursday – 5 Four-Ball matches
- Friday – 5 Foursomes matches
- Saturday morning – 4 Four-Ball matches
- Saturday afternoon – 4 Foursomes matches
- Sunday – 12 Singles matches

Event History and Fact Sheet

All matches are worth one point each, for a total of 30 points. There are no playoffs, with each side receiving a half point if a match is tied after 18 holes. In a change inspired by the events of the 2003 Presidents Cup, if the competition is deadlocked at the end of Singles play, the competition will be deemed a tie and the teams will share the Presidents Cup.

Format Change: In 2019, a minor format change will be implemented, stating each player shall only be required to play a minimum of one match prior to the Sunday Singles matches. This is a change from previous years when players were required to compete in two matches prior to Singles matches.

PURSE:

Unlike many other events, the players do not receive prize money based on performance. Instead, the PGA TOUR pledges to contribute to charities, which are nominated by the players, captains and captains' assistants from both teams.

TROPHY:

Created by Tiffany & Company, The Presidents Cup trophy weighs a total of 28 pounds. The trophy is spun by a spinner from five sterling silver circles into five different shapes. The spun components then are put together by a silversmith to create a cup. The smith runs a roller die to create the beaded embellishment that goes around the cup and the foot of the trophy. The oval logo is etched and applied on the cup. Labor dedicated to creating the trophy totaled 80 hours (spinning, smithing, finishing). The entire trophy is vermeil in 24-carat gold, and the original trophy is housed at the World Golf Hall of Fame in St. Augustine, Fla.

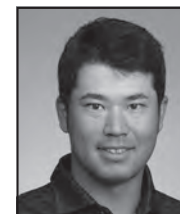

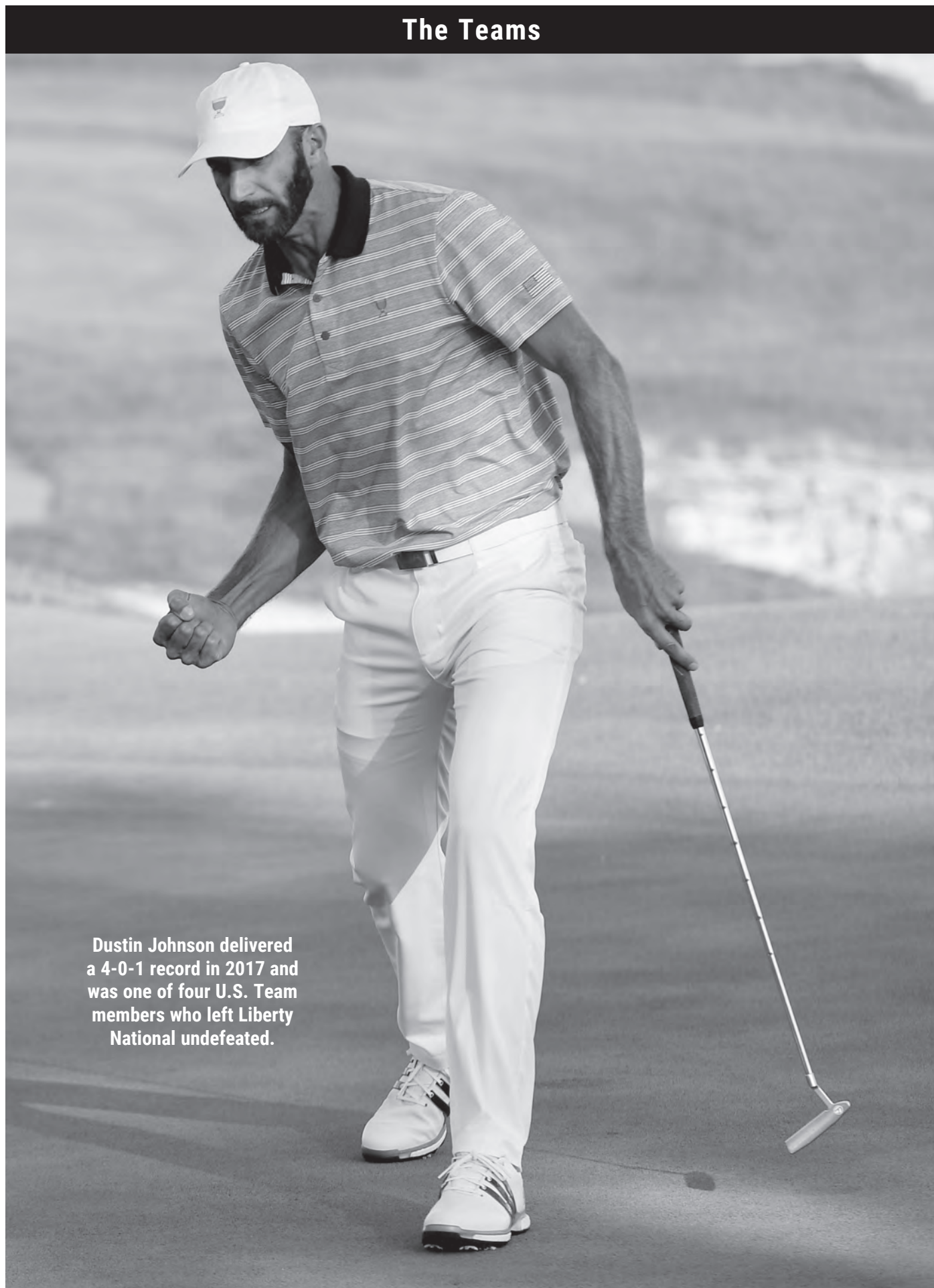

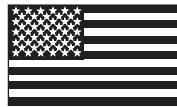

First-time captain Tiger Woods will become the Presidents Cup's second-ever playing captain and make his ninth career Presidents Cup appearance for the U.S. Team. Woods has a Presidents Cup record of 24-15-1 since his first appearance on the 1998 U.S. Team, and he is one of five players to earn a perfect 5-0-0 record during a single event (2009).

His 24 matches won ranks second all-time to Mickelson's 26 and his six victories in Singles matches are the most in the event's history. Woods also holed the winning putt for the U.S. Team in 2009, 2011 at Royal Melbourne and 2013 – the only player to clinch the Cup three times.

Woods captured his fifth Masters title in 2019 and later won his 82nd PGA TOUR title in October at the ZOZO CHAMPIONSHIP to tie Sam Snead's all-time PGA TOUR wins record.

Fred Couples was the victorious captain of the U.S. Team for three editions of the Presidents Cup (2009, 2011, 2013), the only 3-0 captain in event history, and he was a player four times in 1994, 1996, 1998 and 2005, during which he compiled a 9-5-2 record. This is his third stint as captain's assistant, after serving for Captain Jay Haas in 2015 and Captain Steve Stricker in 2017.

Couples won the Masters Tournament in 1992 with a two-stroke victory over Raymond Floyd and captured THE PLAYERS Championship in 1984 and 1996. He was 1991 and 1992 PGA TOUR Player of the Year and Vardon Trophy winner. With 15 career PGA TOUR titles, 13 PGA TOUR Champions titles and two PGA TOUR Champions majors, he was inducted into the World Golf Hall of Fame in 2013.

In addition to his Presidents Cup pedigree, Couples competed on the U.S. Ryder Cup Team five times (1989, 1991, 1993, 1995, 1997), won the World Cup of Golf for the United States four times in succession from 1992 to 1995 and the Dunhill Cup at St. Andrews in 1993.

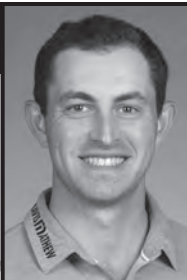
Fresh off captaining the victorious 2017 U.S. Presidents Cup Team at Liberty National, Steve Stricker will join Woods in Australia for his second stint as a Presidents Cup captain's assistant (2015) after he selected Woods as an assistant in 2017. A five-time Presidents Cup competitor (1996, 2007, 2009, 2011, 2013), Stricker boasts a 14-10 record and finished with a 2-2 record the last time the Presidents Cup was played at The Royal Melbourne Golf Club in 2011.

Stricker and Woods were on the same Presidents Cup team four times (2007, 2009, 2011, 2013) and accumulated four total points as partners. Ernie Els will take on the captain's role for the first time and is the sixth person to serve as a captain for the International Team. 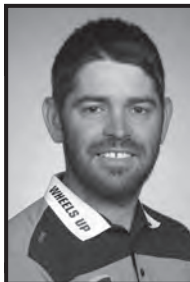

The Royal Melbourne Golf Club - Hole-by-Hole

HOLE #1: PAR 4, 372 YARDS / 341 METRES (HOLE #3 WEST)

Design connoisseurs might want to turn away as certain players approach the first green during this Presidents Cup, for it's possible the likes of Brooks Koepka and Dustin Johnson will find themselves with sidehill, or even uphill, chips for their second shot. One of the most remarkable front-to-back targets built during the Golden Age of golf architecture (pre-World War II), the second shot here has always challenged the golfer to hit firmly enough to cross or carry the swale in front of the green, but not too hard as to shoot through the back. Bombers driving through the fairway and chipping from near the next tee will make plenty of observers uncomfortable but fail to lessen the charm of this brilliant short par 4.

HOLE #2: PAR 5, 532 YARDS / 487 METRES (HOLE #4 WEST)

Famous for a glorious bunker carved into a hill that competitors can now easily carry, this rising and falling par 5 features a blind drive and an exciting approach played through classic Sandbelt bunkering. Expect to see plenty of birdies and eagles here.

HOLE #3: PAR 3, 176 YARDS / 161 METRES (HOLE #5 WEST)

The third was the only hole at Royal Melbourne built under the direct supervision of designer Dr. Alister MacKenzie. That he had confidence in Mick Morcom to finish construction after he left, and later described him as the best course superintendent he had come across, will not surprise those who have stood on this tee and marveled at its green complex. Played across a deceptive valley, the putting surface leans aggressively to the front and with deep bunkers cut into both sides. You can't miss left or right here, nor can you leave your tee shot short of the green or past the pin. Repeatedly across Royal Melbourne, the margins are incredibly fine – and here is one of the best illustrations.

HOLE #4: PAR 4, 438 YARDS / 401 METRES (HOLE #6 WEST)

Royal Melbourne's famous fourth is probably the best dogleg par 4 in Australia. Although somewhat diminished by the ease with which leading professionals can carry its angled drive bunkers, the approach remains as fearsome as anything at Augusta National, principally because hitting past the pin and coming up short are both disastrous. Superintendent Richard Forsyth describes this green as having the "toughest two-putt" on the course. Its back bunker is also the hardest to get up and down from anywhere on the Sandbelt. The bank behind the green is perfect for those wanting to witness incredible shot-making and extreme disappointment from one spot.

HOLE #5: PAR 3, 147 YARDS / 135 METRES (HOLE #7 WEST)

There isn't a golf course with more beautifully bunkered par 3s than Royal Melbourne's Composite, and the fifth is not only the shortest hole, it's also one of the nastiest. Even the best bunker players in the world struggle to make par from the sand here, so playing safely to the left is often a smart move. The problem for professionals is that most are conditioned to fire at pins with their wedges, which is rarely a sound strategy on this hole.

HOLE #6: PAR 4, 311 YARDS / 285 METRES (HOLE #10 WEST)

Famous for the enormous bunker that its fairway bends around, this driveable par 4 features a tricky green site that mere mortals are best advised to approach with a full wedge in hand. With some of the longer hitters at the Presidents Cup likely to be tempted to go for the green off the tee, spectators should see everything from eagles to conceded holes here.

HOLE #7: PAR 4, 454 YARDS / 416 METRES (HOLE #11 WEST)

One of the tougher par 4s on the course, the seventh hole doglegs to the left and rises into a particularly difficult green site that is angled from the right side to the left. Those unable to keep their drive close to the inside corner of the dogleg are faced with a longer second shot, and a worse approach shot angle. Always difficult to keep your ball under the hole, this green does get quick and usually sees its fair share of three-putts.

HOLE #8: PAR 4, 475 YARDS / 435 METRES (HOLE #12 WEST)

A par 5 for member play, the eighth is a two-shot hole for professionals and notable for an exciting tee shot across sand and heathland that favours those able to control a long draw. Blocking your drive out to the right will add distance and difficulty to an approach that needs to carry broken ground and a nasty short bunker in order to reach the green. Though punishing on stray balls, expect to see plenty of threes here, particularly in four-ball matches.

HOLE #9: PAR 4, 438 YARDS / 401 METRES (HOLE #17 WEST)

A true MacKenzie masterpiece, the ninth features some of the most beautiful greenside bunkering anywhere on the Melbourne Sandbelt. The hole itself is a perfectly proportioned dogleg, which rewards golfers able to hug the corner bunkers with a much better angle into its famous target. When the pin is cut on the right side of this green, the great dilemma is whether to challenge the deep bunkers or play safely away to the left and leave yourself a long, slippery, cross-slope putt. The golf here will be exciting no doubt, but the architecture is next-level.

HOLE #10: PAR 4, 433 YARDS / 396 METRES (HOLE #18 WEST)

Designed by Dr. Alister MacKenzie as the finishing hole on the West course, the 10th plays up and over a spectacularly bunkered ridge to a fairway that turns right but falls and leans away to the left. Golfers need to choose their line carefully on this tee, or risk running through the fairway into the trees. Those who find the fairway often face an approach played with the ball above their feet, and to a large, deceptive green that slides away from left to right. Even with a wedge in hand, the second shot here can be very tricky.

The Royal Melbourne Golf Club - Hole-by-Hole

HOLE #11 – PAR 4, 332 YARDS / 304 METRES (HOLE #1 EAST)

The opening hole on the East course, the 11th was designed by MacKenzie's partner Alex Russell and is a notorious short par 4 with one of the trickiest green sites in Australia. Though driveable, the playing strategy from the tee is entirely dependent upon the day's pin, as being out of position is a recipe for disaster. This is the perfect place for spectators to watch the action, as they are likely to witness everything from an eagle to an absolute calamity.

HOLE #12 – PAR 4, 439 YARDS / 402 METRES (HOLE #2 EAST)

A classic Royal Melbourne dogleg, the 12th is the narrowest driving hole on the course and turns sharply from left to right through trees before rising steeply between bunkers as you approach the green site. The green itself is tiered and elevated well above the fairway. For decades golfers have found this one of the more difficult approach shots at Royal. Getting your ball close to the hole is only possible after the most precisely judged approach.

HOLE #13 – PAR 4, 382 YARDS / 350 METRES (HOLE #3 EAST)

A true sleeper, the 13th bends to the right and narrows significantly as its fairway starts to turn. Most golfers will lay up here and leave themselves a short iron approach played from a downhill lie and into a deceptive green with more internal contour than most others on the course. There are generally fewer birdies on this hole than you might normally see in a professional tournament on a 350-metre par 4.

HOLE #14 – PAR 3, 189 YARDS / 173 METRES (HOLE #16 EAST)

For many years this hole was left off the Composite course rota, and tournament participants would simply shake their heads as they walked right past it to get between holes. For architecture aficionados, it's well known as being on a shortlist for the most beautifully bunkered par 3s in golf. On relatively flat ground, the green and surrounds Alex Russell created here are simply stunning. Spectators new to Royal Melbourne are advised to spend some time on this hole during the Presidents Cup, admiring both the play of the competitors as well as the beauty of the bunkering.

HOLE #15 – PAR 5, 568 YARDS / 520 METRES (HOLE #17 EAST)

Despite being the longest hole on the Composite course, the 15th will still play like a par 4 for many of the competitors, as much because of the huge technological advancements made in the game as for the downhill nature of its tee shot. Regardless of par, the Alex Russell-designed green site and diagonal bunkering through the final 80 to 90 metres give the hole great beauty and make it perfect for matchplay.

HOLE #16 – PAR 4, 473 YARDS / 433 METRES (HOLE #18 EAST)

The 16th is the final hole on the East course at Royal Melbourne and is rightly famous in Australian golf for the many memorable tournaments that have been determined on its sloping green. The bunkering is also renowned, in particular an island of heath in the right trap that cost American Matt Kuchar the 2013 Australian Masters when, as leader, he made a double bogey on the 72nd hole. For many golfers, the key to safely negotiating this dangerous par 4 is keeping their tee shot down the left side and then aiming their second shot into the middle of this steeply pitched putting green.

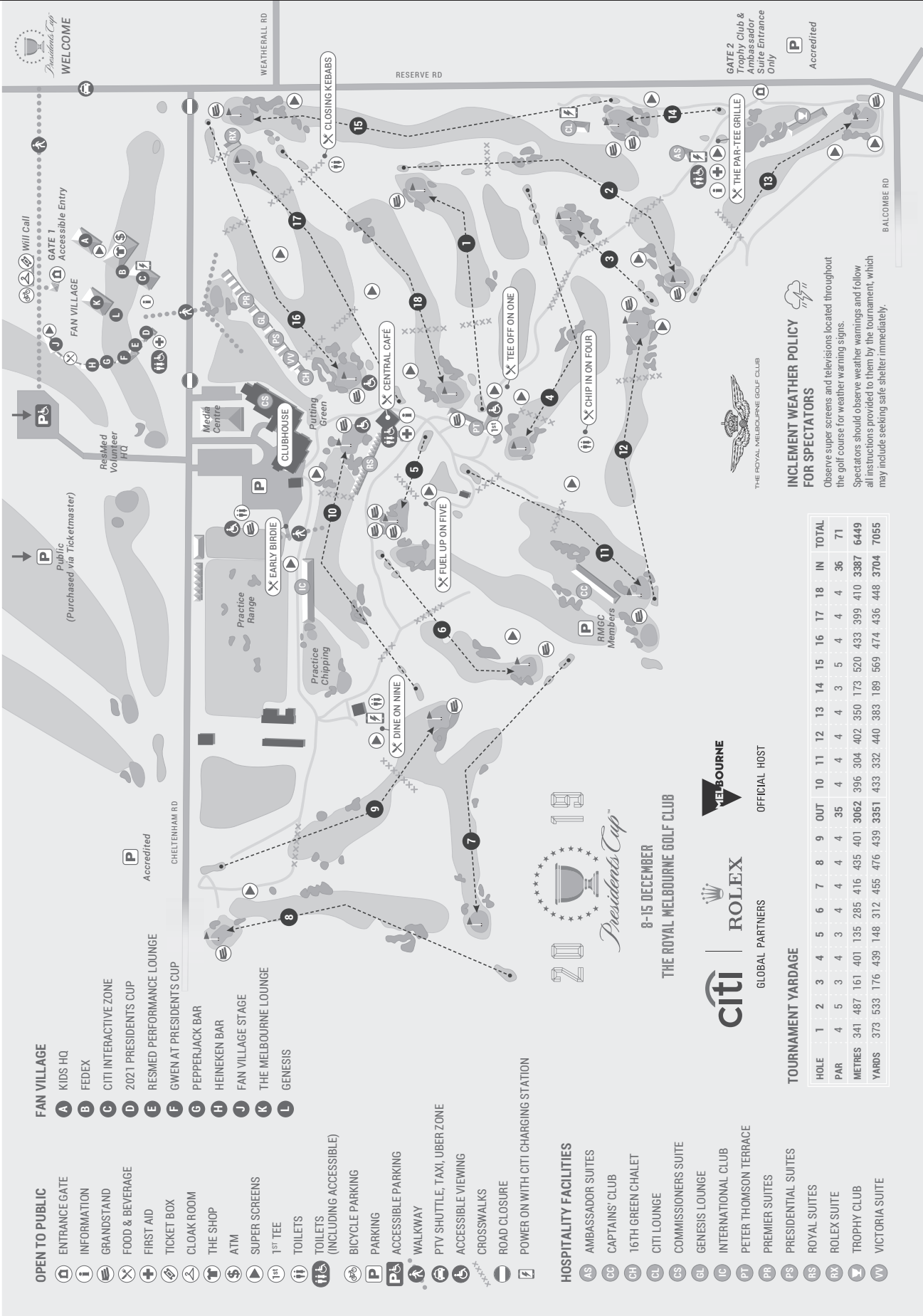
HOLE #17 – PAR 4, 436 YARDS / 399 METRES (HOLE #1 WEST)

The opening hole on the West course, the 17th is a straightaway par 4 where many players take a fairway wood or long iron off the tee, as the otherwise open landing area starts to narrow noticeably near the 260-metre mark. Though seemingly uncomplicated, the approach shot is tricky to get close to the pin as the green is deceptively contoured and usually firm. Those behind in their matches will probably need a birdie here in order to keep their hopes alive.

HOLE #18 – PAR 4, 458 YARDS / 419 METRES (HOLE #2 WEST)

Another par 5 converted to a par 4, the 18th hole twists to the right and then twists to the left as golfers approach one of the more fearsome green sites in Melbourne. Players will need to consider the wind and the day's pin carefully before choosing where to aim their drives, as being out of position on this hole is not a recipe for success. Hopefully the majority of matches reach this final green, and spectators can see how the world's best golfers manage shots around what is a sharply angled, right-to-left putting surface.

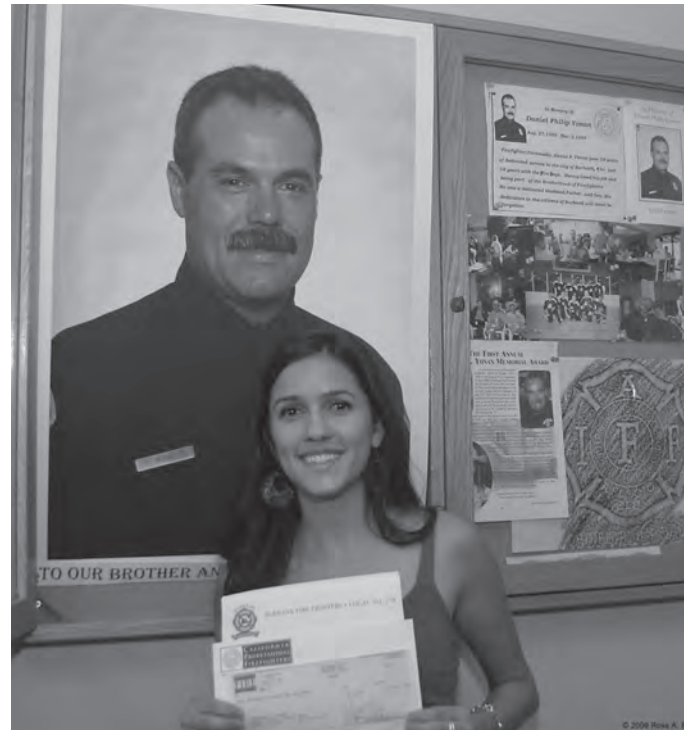

From aiding to the countless of children through the St. Jude Children's Hospital to providing relief efforts to those in Venezuela; from ensuring a transformative summer camp adventure for thousands of Georgia kids to helping those in their battle with addiction - these are but a few examples of the myriad ways those involved in the Presidents Cup have been able to affect change in their communities, home countries and globally.
