Things to Know

- Sacramento native Cameron Champ earns his second PGA TOUR title, improving to 2-for-2 with the 54-hole lead
- Champ has won in his second start of both seasons of his PGA TOUR career
- Champ's grandfather, Mack, is in hospice care in Sacramento with stage IV stomach cancer
- Runner-up Adam Hadwin earns his best finish on TOUR since winning the 2017 Valspar Championship
- Justin Thomas collected his third consecutive top-five, accomplishing the feat for the second time in his career

- Wins in his second start for the second consecutive season; did so as a rookie at the 2018 Sanderson Farms Championship
- Moves to No. 2 in the FedExCup standings, trailing Sebastian Munoz by 79 points; represents the highest position of his career
- Improves to 2-for-2 with the 54-hole lead/co-lead on the PGA TOUR
- Last player to earn his second victory before turning 25: Bryson DeChambeau, 2017 John Deere Classic/2018 the Memorial Tournament presented by Nationwide
- Becomes the 21st player to win twice in his first 33 professional starts on the PGA TOUR
- Led the field in Driving Distance (337.1); only two players in 2018-19 won and led the field in Driving Distance (Champ/Sanderson Farms Championship, Rory McIlroy/RBC Canadian Open)
- Led the field in Scrambling (career-best 84.2%); ranked 185th on TOUR in that category in 2018-19
- Recorded a career-best mark in Strokes Gained: Tee-to-Green (2.879 per round)
- 369-yard drive at No. 18 was the longest drive hit on that hole by any player in the field
- In two previous Safeway Open starts, missed the cut in 2017 and finished T25 in 2018
- Born in Sacramento and attended Heritage Peak Charter School

Miscellaneous Notes

- The last time the first three events of the season were won by players in their 20s was 2015-16 (Emiliano Grillo/Safeway Open, Smylie Kaufman/Shriners Hospitals for Children Open, Justin Thomas/CIMB Classic)
- The last time the first three events of the season were won by the leader/co-leader entering the final round was 2011 (Jonathan Byrd/Sentry Tournament of Champions, Mark Wilson/Sony Open in Hawaii, Jhonattan Vegas/The American Express)
- Runner-up **Adam Hadwin** earned his best finish since winning the 2017 Valspar Championship
- With a 7-under 65, **Marc Leishman** (3rd) tied **Corey Connors** for the low round of the day and earned his 18th career top-three finish
- **Justin Thomas** (T4) recorded his third consecutive top-five, accomplishing the feat for the second time in his career (other: Win/The Honda Classic, P2/WGC-Mexico Championship, 4th/WGC-Dell Technologies Match Play in 2017-18 season)
- **Zac Blair** (T4) played his first five holes of the tournament in 3-over and finished 13-under; Blair's last top-five came at the 2016 Sony Open in Hawaii (3rd)
- **Dylan Frittelli** (T7) earned his second consecutive top-10 following a T6 at the Sanderson Farms Championship; he had just one top-10 in his first 37 starts on TOUR
- In his first start of the season, **Daniel Berger** (T23) earned 32 FedExCup points, enough to retain his PGA TOUR card for the remainder of the season; entered the season on a Major Medical Extension with five starts available to earn 15 FedExCup points to equal No. 125 on the 2018-19 FedExCup points list (Pat Perez/376)
- **Sebastian Munoz** finished T33 and retains his lead in the FedExCup standings; Munoz leads by 79 points over Champ
