Additional Notes

- Winter changes to the course include all bunkers renovated to Better Billy Bunker, four new bunkers installed on No. 3, 11, 14 and 16, a new tee built on No. 17 and 1.5 acres of drainage and sand plating installed.

- The club was established in 1914 with the course being redesigned by John Fought in 2008.

- The course has hosted the Sanderson Farms Championship beginning in 2014.

- The course has a Donald Ross look, arguably greens that are top 10 on tour, great food for the players and other top amenities.
