Things to Know

- Sebastian Munoz wins first PGA TOUR title at age 26 defeating Sungjae Im on first playoff hole
- Munoz holed a 14'7" birdie putt on the 72nd hole to force playoff
- Munoz becomes the third-consecutive 54-hole leader/co-leader to convert for the win at the Sanderson Farms Championship (Ryan Armour/2017), (Cameron Champ/2018)
- The playoff was the first on the PGA TOUR since the 2018 RSM Classic

Sebastian Munoz (1st/-18)

- Earned 500 FedExCup points, exemption through 2021-22 PGA TOUR Season, starts in multiple events, including the 2020 Sentry Tournament of Champions, 2020 Arnold Palmer Invitational, 2020 PLAYERS Championship, 2020 Masters Tournament, 2020 PGA Championship and 2020 Memorial Tournament
- It took 376 points to qualify for the FedExCup Playoffs in 2019, 659 for BMW Championship and 1254 for the TOUR Championship
- First PGA TOUR title comes in his 47th start at the age of 26 years, 8 months, 18 days
- Moves to No. 1 in the FedExCup with 585 points
- Became the 13th player to make the Sanderson Farms Championship his first TOUR win and sixth consecutive: Cameron Champ (2018), Ryan Armour (2017), Cody Gribble (2016), Peter Malnati (2015), Nick Taylor (2014), Chris Kirk (2011), D.J. Trahan (2006), Luke Donald (2002), Cameron Beckman (2001), Willie Wood (1996), Ed Dougherty (1995) and Brian Henninger (1994)
- Became the first international winner of the Sanderson Farms Championship since Nick Taylor (2014)
- Week was highlighted by a 14'7" birdie putt on the 72nd hole to force a playoff
- Carded a bogey-free third-round 9-under 63 to claim the 54-hole lead

- Only bogeys of the week came on No. 7 Thursday, No. 11 Friday and No. 15 on Sunday
- Hit 57/72 greens in regulation and tallied 112 putts throughout the week
- Became the third player to convert a 54-hole lead into a victory since the event moved to the Country Club of Jackson in 2014 (Ryan Armour/20187, Cameron Champ 2018)
- Previous best finish at the Sanderson Farms Championship was T35/2016
- Has shot par or better in 10 of his 12 rounds at the Country Club of Jackson
- Made his first PGA TOUR start at the 2016 Sanderson Farms Championship (T35)
- Became the first Colombian player to win on the PGA TOUR since Camilo Villegas (2014 Wyndham Championship)
- Previous best PGA TOUR finish was T3 at the 2017 A Military Tribute at The Greenbrier

Sungjae Im (2nd/-18)

- Birdied three of his final five holes to finish 18-under tied with champion Sebastian Munoz
- Final-round 6-under 66 matches his lowest final round score in relation to par
- Previous best result on TOUR was T3 at the 2019 Arnold Palmer Invitational
- Recorded his second-consecutive top-20 (T19/A Military Tribute at The Greenbrier)
- Finished the 2018-19 season 19th in the FedExCup. Was the only rookie to advance to the TOUR Championship
- Recorded seven top-10s last season en route to earning PGA TOUR Rookie of the Year honors

Byeong Hun An (3rd/-17)

- Entered the final-round solo-third at 14-under, shooting a final-round 3-under 69 to finish third
- The finish was his best result since a solo-third at the 2019 Wyndham Championship
- This week marked his tournament debut at the Sanderson Farms Championship
- The solo-third was good for his 13th PGA TOUR top-10

Kevin Streelman (T4/-16)

- Carded a final-round 8-under 64 to finish T4 at 16-under. The 64 was good for the low round on Sunday
- Previous best performance at the Sanderson Farms Championship was T10 in 2017
- Has now recorded three top-20s in five starts at the Sanderson Farms Championship

Carlos Ortiz (T4/-16)

- Carded a final-round 1-under 71 to finish T4
- Has finished T4 (2019) and T3 (2018) in two career starts at the Sanderson Farms Championship, marking his two best results on the PGA TOUR
- Has now recorded eight-consecutive rounds under-par at the Country Club of Jackson

Miscellaneous Notes

- This marked the first time the tournament has gone to a playoff since 2013
- Munoz becomes the sixth-consecutive player to earn his first PGA TOUR win at the Sanderson Farms Championship, matching the Shriners Hospital for Children Open for the longest streak of first-time winners since the start of the ShotLink era (2003)
- Munoz joins Joaquin Niemann (T54/-4) as the second-consecutive first-time winner on the PGA TOUR
- Defending champion Cameron Champ finished T28 at 9-under
