Additional Notes

- A nine-month renovation (course reopened Nov. 23, 2019) included: New bunkers on holes 3, 5, 15 and 16; Capillary concrete liner system in all 93 bunkers; New tee boxes on holes 1, 3, 4, 7, 8, 9, 10 and 15; Added 5 acres of native rough; All greens rebuilt from the drainage up.
- The course was built on old pineapple fields. The irrigation system is pressurized and is run solely using force of gravity.
- Weather very dry March-November, wet leading into tournament.
- The leeward waters of Maui have the densest humpback whale population in the world during the winter months.
