Things to Know

- Xander Schauffele returns to defend his title; entered the final round in 2019 trailing by five shots before tying the tournament record with a final-round 62
- FedExCup leader Brendon Todd qualified for the event for the first time since 2015 and seeks his third victory of the season
- Two-time winner Dustin Johnson is making his first start of the 2019-20 season
- 15 players in the field are making their tournament debuts, second-most since the inaugural year and most since 2003 (19)
- Eight members of the victorious United States Presidents Cup team are in the field
- In 12 of the previous 13 seasons in the FedExCup era, the winner of the event has gone on to qualify for the TOUR Championship

- Seven of the top 10 in the FedExCup standings, including No. 1 Brendon Todd, No. 2 Sebastián Muñoz and No. 3 Lanto
- 13 of the 30 players that qualified for the 2019 TOUR Championship
- 13 of the top 50 in the Official World Golf Ranking, including three of the top five: Jon Rahm (No. 3), Justin Thomas (No. 4) and Dustin Johnson (No. 5)

FedExCup and the Sentry Tournament of Champions

- The Sentry Tournament of Champions is the 12th event of the 2019-20 PGA TOUR Season
- The winner has advanced to the TOUR Championship 12 of 13 years of the FedExCup era (only Daniel Chopra in 2008 did not)
- Each of the last three winners (Justin Thomas/2017, Dustin Johnson/2018, Xander Schauffele/2019) went on to finish in the top five in the FedExCup standings
- 2017 champion Justin Thomas went on to win the 2017 FedExCup

The top 10 in the FedExCup at the conclusion of the PGA TOUR Regular Season will be recognized through the Wyndham Rewards Top 10 program and be well-positioned entering the FedExCup Playoffs

A look back at the 2019 Sentry Tournament of Champions

- Xander Schauffele entered the final round five shots back of Gary Woodland; after opening with a bogey, Schauffele
 recorded two eagles and nine birdies over the last 17 holes to tie the course record of 11-under 62 and edge out Woodland
 by one shot for his second consecutive victory (won the 2018 World Golf Championships-HSBC Champions)
- Marked his fourth career PGA TOUR victory and fourth time coming from behind for the win
- Schauffele went on to a career-best second-place finish in the FedExCup following his victory at the Sentry Tournament of Champions
- Woodland held the 36-hole lead (3 shots) and 54-hole lead (3 shots) but failed to convert into victory

Player Notes

- 2013 and 2018 winner **Dustin Johnson** is making his season debut and has recorded seven consecutive top-10s at the event
- **Jon Rahm**, the top-ranked player in the field in the Official World Golf Ranking (No. 3), has finished in the top 10 in each of his first two appearances at the event (2nd/2018, T8/2019)
- **Justin Thomas** has a win (2017) and a third-place result (2019) in four starts at the event; Thomas enters No. 5 in the FedExCup
- Tyler Duncan is in search of his second consecutive win after winning The RSM Classic for his first career victory
- **Kevin Na**, who qualified with his victory at the Charles Schwab Challenge, is set to make his first start in the event since 2012; Na withdrew minutes before his tee time in 2019 due to a finger injury
- **Rickie Fowler** has never finished outside of the top six in three career appearances at the Sentry Tournament of Champions (T6/2013, 5th/2016, T4/2018)
