#### Things to Know

- For the first time in his career, Patrick Cantlay opens a PGA TOUR event with back-to-back rounds of 66 or better
- Kevin Na cards two eagles in the second round, recording his eighth score of 62 or better on TOUR
- Joel Dahmen becomes the third player to shoot a 28 on the back-nine at TPC Summerlin since 1992
- Chase Koepka makes the cut for the third time on the PGA TOUR, while brother and World No. 1 Brooks misses the cut
- · Amateur Jack Trent, who is a junior on the UNLV golf team, makes the cut in his PGA TOUR debut

# Patrick Cantlay (T1/-12)

- For the first time in his career, opened a PGA TOUR event with back-to-back rounds of 66 or better
- Through 10 rounds at this event, owns a scoring average of 66.9 at TPC Summerlin
- The 45' 9" eagle putt on No. 15 was the third longest putt made in his PGA TOUR career and seventh longest eagle putt made on that hole at TPC Summerlin in the ShotLink era
- Made 123' 4" of putts in the second round and only missed two greens in regulation through 36 holes
- Making third start at the event, finishing no worse than second in his first two starts (win/2017, runner up/2018)
- Making second start of the 2019-20 season, after finishing T40 at the Safeway Open

- The Las Vegas resident recorded eagles on No. 13 and No. 16, marking the fourth time in his career to have two eagles in one round (most recent: R2/2018 Shriners Hospitals for Children Open)
- Recorded his eighth score of 62 or better on TOUR
- Playing in his third start of the 2019-20 season (T14/A Military Tribute at The Greenbrier, MC/Safeway Open)
- Made 202' 1" of putts in the second round, marking his most feet of putts made in a round on TOUR since 2003
- Became the second player to make over 200 feet of putts at TPC Summerlin in the ShotLink era; Rickie Fowler made 215' 0" of putts in the second round in 2015

### Lucas Glover (T1/-12)

- Posted 8-under 63 for his second-lowest score in 24 rounds at the Shriners Hospitals for Children Open (61/R3/2018)
- Making eighth start at Shriners Hospitals for Children Open, owning two top-10s (3<sup>rd</sup>/2016, T7/2018)
- Seeking fourth career PGA TOUR victory and first since 2011 Wells Fargo Championship

### **Brian Stuard** (T1/-12)

- 36-hole total of 130 ties his career-low, previously set at the 2014 Sony Open in Hawaii
- Owns one top-20 finish in six previous starts at the Shriners Hospitals for Children Open (T15/2013)
- Seeking second career PGA TOUR victory; won the 2016 Zurich Classic of New Orleans in a playoff

#### **Additional Player Notes**

- Matt Jones (5<sup>th</sup>) posted an 8-under 63 and is in contention to post his second top-10 in just three starts this season (T10/A Military Tribute at The Greenbrier); Recorded two top-10s in 27 starts in the 2018-19 season
- **Joel Dahmen** (T21) shot a 7-under 64 and became the third player to shoot 28 on the back nine at TPC Summerlin since 1992 (John Daly/R2/2007, Phil Mickelson/R2/1997)
- Playing on a sponsor exemption, **Chase Koepka** (T35) made the cut for the third time in four career starts on TOUR at 7-under 135, while World No. 1 and brother Brooks missed the cut with 1-under 141 in his 2019-20 PGA TOUR season debut
- Collin Morikawa (T11) carded a 5-under 66 and made his 11<sup>th</sup> consecutive cut in 11 career starts as a professional on TOUR
- Defending champion **Bryson DeChambeau** (T21) sits four shots back of the 36-hole lead in his attempt to join Jim Furyk (1998-99) as the only back-to-back winners at the event
- **Jack Trent** (T50), a junior on the UNLV golf team and competing as an amateur this week, made the cut with a 36-hole total of 6-under 136, after earning a spot into the field by winning the Southern Highlands Collegiate in a three-hole playoff
- After an 8 on the par-3 fifth hole to fall to 2-under, James Hahn (T50) rallied with birdie-birdie-par-eagle to make the cut
- Isaiah Salinda (T60) holed out from off the green from 38' 11" on his last hole (No. 9) to make the cut on the number
