Things to Know

- Kevin Na edges out Patrick Cantlay in a playoff battle between past Shriners Hospitals for Children Open champions
- The playoff is the first at TPC Summerlin since Cantlay won in a playoff in 2017
- Na overcomes a triple bogey to pick up his fourth PGA TOUR win, joining Jim Furyk as the only multiple winners of the event
- Na sets a PGA TOUR record for most feet of putts made (558'11") in a 72-hole event (ShotLink era)
- In three starts at TPC Summerlin, Cantlay owns a win (2017) and two runner-up finishes (2018, 2019)
- UNLV's Jack Trent finishes T29 as just the second amateur to play in the event

Wins (4): 2011 Shriners Hospitals for Children Open, 2018 A Military Tribute at The Greenbrier, 2019 Charles Schwab Challenge, 2019 Shriners Hospitals for Children Open

- Earns his fourth PGA TOUR victory in his 399th start at the age of 36 years and 21 days
- Has now won three times in his last 30 starts
- Collects 500 points to move to No. 2 in the FedExCup standings
- 261 total falls one shy of the low winning score at the event (260: Ryan Moore/2012, Webb Simpson/2013)
- Improves to 1-3 in playoffs
- Victory marks the 24th TOUR title by a Korean-born player
- Made a PGA TOUR record 558'11" of putts this week (ShotLink era); Ben Martin held the previous record with 551'2" at the 2015 Charles Schwab Challenge
- Joins Johnson Wagner and Zac Blair as the only players to make 500 or more feet of putts in multiple events on TOUR during the ShotLink era (2009 Waste Management Phoenix Open, 2019 Shriners Hospitals for Children Open)
- Sets a PGA TOUR record (ShotLink era) for Most Total Strokes Gained: Putting in an event (+14.263); previous record was held by Kiradech Aphibarnrat (+14.044) at the 2019 AT&T Byron Nelson

- Becomes the first player to make a triple bogey in final round and go on to win since Rickie Fowler at the 2019 Waste Management Phoenix Open
- Set Shriners Hospitals for Children Open 54-hole scoring record (22-under 191)
- Has nine score of 62 or better on TOUR, including middle rounds of 62-61 this week; joins Steve Stricker as the only two players with multiple rounds of 62 or better in two different stroke-play events since 1983 (2018 Charles Schwab Challenge)
- Stats for the week: 40 of 56 fairways hit, 54 of 72 greens hit, total putts (105)
- Is now 3 of 7 when holding the 54-hole lead/co-lead on TOUR; went on to win the 2011 and 2019 Shriners Hospitals for Children Open and 2019 Charles Schwab Challenge
- Wins in his third start of the 2019-20 season (T14/A Military Tribute at The Greenbrier, MC/Safeway Open)

Additional Player Notes

- In three starts at the Shriners Hospitals for Children Open, **Patrick Cantlay** now has a win (2017) and two runner-up finishes (2018, 2019); he falls to 1-1 in playoffs
- Highlighted by a third-round 9-under 62, Pat Perez (3rd) now owns two top-10 finishes in 12 starts at the event (T7/2016)
- Defending champion **Bryson DeChambeau** closes with 8-under 63 to finish T4; has three top-10 finishes in four starts at the event (T36/2016, T7/2017, Won/2018, T4/2019)
- In his 500th round on the PGA TOUR, **Adam Hadwin** posts a bogey-free 8-under 63 to finish T4; opened the season with a runner-up finish at last week's Safeway Open and is currently No. 5 in the FedExCup standings
- Brian Stuard was bogey-free on the back nine at TPC Summerlin this week en route to a T4 finish
- **Jack Trent**, a junior on the UNLV golf team, finished T29; the only other amateur to compete at the Shriners Hospitals for Children Open was Charley Hoffman in 1999 (MC)
- Phil Mickelson finished 61st in his first start at the Shriners Hospitals for Children Open since 2005
- For the RSM Birdies for Love program, the top three players who accumulate the most birdies (or better), beginning with A Military Tribute at the Greenbrier, and concluding with The RSM Classic, will be awarded \$300,000, \$150,000 and \$50,000, respectively, for charitable donations to children- and/or family-focused charitable organizations of the players' choice. **Kevin Na**, with 28 birdies (or better) this week, edged out **Denny McCarthy** in a scorecard playoff to win \$50,000 for the charity of his choice.
