Things to know

- Rickie Fowler cards his lowest round at The American Express with 8-under 64 and ties his lowest 36-hole total on PGA TOUR
- Fowler has converted for the win one of nine times on the PGA TOUR with the 36-hole lead/co-lead
- Scottie Scheffler posts 8-under 64 with a double bogey and seeks fourth top-10 finish in his rookie season
- Tony Finau ties his career-low round on TOUR with 10-under 62 and moves 45 spots up the leaderboard to fourth
- After missing seven of eight cuts this season, Andrew Landry sits one back after 8-under 64 at La Quinta CC
- Landry is the only player in the top five that has already played the Stadium Course
- Tournament host Phil Mickelson sits T110 at 2-under

Rickie Fowler - NT (T1/-15)

• Following his 7-under 65 at La Quinta CC, posted a bogey-free 8-under 64 at the Nicklaus Tournament Course for his lowest round at The American Express

- Tied his lowest 36-hole total on PGA TOUR with 129; either won or finished runner-up in the three previous instances (2019 Waste Management Phoenix Open/Won, 2017 BMW Championship/T2, 2009 Safeway Open/T2)
- Hit 10 of 14 fairways, 15 of 18 greens and required 26 putts in the second round
- Holds second-round lead/co-lead for the 10th time on the PGA TOUR
- In the nine previous instances holding a second-round lead/co-lead, has converted one into victory (2019 Waste Management Phoenix Open) and finished runner-up four times
- Is now 26-under par in his last 72 holes at The American Express (26 birdies and two eagles during that stretch)

- Making his third start at The American Express (2010/MC, 2014/T33)
- Finished T5 at the 2020 Sentry Tournament of Champions in his only other official start of the 2019-20 PGA TOUR season
- Chosen by Tiger Woods as Brooks Koepka's replacement at the 2019 Presidents Cup; finished with a 1-0-3 record in Melbourne

Scottie Scheffler – NT (T1/-15)

- In his first start at The American Express, carded an 8-under 64 with a double bogey on No. 18 for his lowest round on TOUR with a double bogey or worse
- Holds the second-round lead/co-lead for the third time on TOUR (2019 A Military Tribute at The Greenbrier/T7, 2019 Bermuda Championship/T3)
- Played the par-5s in five-under at the Nicklaus Tournament Course, making birdies on Nos. 4, 11, 15 and an eagle on No. 7
- Seeks his fourth top-10 in his eighth start this season (T7/A Military Tribute at The Greenbrier, T3/Bermuda Championship, T5/The RSM Classic)
- Made the most birdies and eagles (139) in the fall portion of the 2019-20 schedule to win RSM Birdies Fore Love competition
- PGA TOUR rookie secured fully-exempt PGA TOUR status after leading the 2019 Korn Ferry Tour in combined points earned in the Regular Season and Finals

Andrew Landry – LQ (3rd/-14)

- Finished runner up at The American Express in 2018, losing to Jon Rahm on the fourth extra hole of a sudden death playoff
- Missed seven of eight cuts in the 2019-20 season; only advancing to the weekend at the Safeway Open (T23)
- Owns one PGA TOUR victory: 2018 Valero Texas Open
- Is 58-under through 13 rounds at The American Express, which is his best score to par of any event on TOUR

Tony Finau – NT $(4^{th}/-13)$

- Carded 29 (-7) on the front nine (his second nine) of the Nicklaus Tournament Course for his best nine-hole score on TOUR
- Posted the round of the day with a bogey-free 10-under 62 at the Nicklaus Tournament Course (62/2019 Shriners Hospitals for Children Open/R3)
- At No. 15 in the Official World Golf Ranking, is the highest-ranked player in the field
- In 148 career PGA TOUR starts, owns one victory (2016 Puerto Rico Open and five runner-ups)

Miscellaneous notes

- Tournament host and World Golf Hall of Fame member **Phil Mickelson** (T110/-2/NT) mixed two bogeys and two birdies for an even-par 72 in his quest to become the winningest TOUR player in California since 1983
- In his eighth start at The American Express, **Bud Cauley** (5th/-12/NT) carded a bogey-free 8-under 64 at the Nicklaus Tournament Course, which included an eagle on No. 7 and six birdies

- **Ted Potter Jr.** (T6/-11/LQ) posted a 9-under 63 at La Quinta CC, posting his best score since a 63 in the third round of the 2018 Charles Schwab Challenge
- In his last event playing on a Major Medical Extension after a back injury, **Ben Martin** (T26/-8/SC) carded an 8-under 64 at the Stadium Course; He needs 59.072 FedExCup points to make the combined top 125
- Defending champion Adam Long (T68/-5/NT) carded a 2-under 70 at the Nicklaus Tournament Course
- Ben Crane withdrew prior to his second round with a torn labrum
