Things to Know

- Jon Rahm and Ryan Palmer, set to play in Sunday's final pairing, were teammates at the 2019 Zurich Classic of New Orleans, the most recent PGA TOUR victory for both
- Rahm can become World No. 1 with a win or solo-second depending on Rory McIlroy's final position
- In sixth start at the Memorial Tournament, Tony Finau seeks second career PGA TOUR title 112 starts after his first at the 2016 Puerto Rico Open
- In first Memorial Tournament start since 2011, Palmer seeks first individual TOUR title since 2010
- Tiger Woods records second sub-par round this week, enters final round T37
- Zero bogey-free rounds were recorded on Saturday

- 20 Leaders/co-leaders going into what would be the final round of the Memorial Tournament have gone on to win 20 times (most recent: Bryson DeChambeau/2018); on two occasions, the tournament was shortened to 54 holes due to weather (1990, 1997)

Comparing the leaders

Jon Rahm (1st/-12)

- Records four consecutive birdies (Nos. 13-16) en route to 4-under 68, career best consecutive birdie streak at Muirfield Village
- 4-under 68 ties Brendon Todd for low round Saturday
- Hit 9 of 14 fairways, 13 of 18 greens and needed 27 putts; Ranks No. 1 in Strokes Gained: Off The Tee (5.086) and Strokes Gained: Tee To Green (14.448) through 54 holes
- With four, has recorded fewest bogeys of any player in the field
- Holds 54-hole lead/co-lead for the third time on TOUR, failing to convert the previous two into victory (2019 THE PLAYERS Championship/T12, 2020 Farmers Insurance Open/2nd)

- Projected to move to No. 8 in FedExCup standings with a win
- Becomes World No. 1 with a win (if Rory McIlroy finishes worse than 2-way tie for second) or solo-second (if McIlroy finishes worse than solo-30th and Justin Thomas does not win)
- Lone appearance at the Memorial Tournament before this week was 2017 (73-77/MC)

Ryan Palmer (T2/-8)

- After one bogey in the opening 36 holes, records four en route to third-round 1-over 73
- Ranks No. 1 in Strokes Gained: Approach The Green (8.475) through 54 holes
- Making his sixth Memorial Tournament start and first since missing the cut in 2011
- Fourth and most recent TOUR title came at the 2019 Zurich Classic of New Orleans paired with Jon Rahm; making 241st start since earning his most recent individual TOUR title at the 2010 Sony Open in Hawaii
- Seeks his fourth top-10 finish of the season and second since the TOUR's Return to Golf (T8/RBC Heritage)

Tony Finau (T2/-8)

- Held the lead at 12-under through 11 holes of the third round before closing with two double bogeys on the inward nine (Nos. 12 and 17)
- With 18, has the most birdies of any player through 54 holes
- Holed putt from 50 feet, 2 inches on No. 10 marks his longest of the season
- Is making his 112th start since earning his first and only PGA TOUR title at the 2016 Puerto Rico Open
- Seeks his fourth top-10 finish of the 2019-20 season and first since a playoff loss to Webb Simpson at the Waste Management Phoenix Open
- In four starts since the TOUR's Return to Golf, has finished no better than T23 (Charles Schwab Challenge)

Additional Notes

- With a back-nine 32, 2016 Masters Tournament champion **Danny Willett** (4th/-6) matched his low nine this week (32/front nine/R2); finished T27 in his first Memorial Tournament start in 2019
- Columbus resident Jason Day (T5/-5) seeks first win since 2018 Wells Fargo Championship, a span of 45 starts; that victory was also the last time he posted a top-three finish
- Henrik Norlander (T5/-5) seeks to become the eighth player to make the Memorial Tournament his first PGA TOUR title (most recent, William McGirt/2016), the 10th international winner and the third from Sweden (Carl Pettersson/2006, David Lingmerth/2015)
- In search of a record-breaking 83rd PGA TOUR victory, five-time Memorial Tournament winner Tiger Woods (T37/+2) sits 14 strokes off the lead after rounds of 71-76-71; was four strokes back through 54 holes en route to last two of five wins at Muirfield Village (2009, 2012); most strokes back through 54 holes en route to victory in his career – 5 (twice/2000 AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am/2009 Arnold Palmer Invitational presented by Mastercard)
- England's **Matt Wallace** (T7/-4) owns two top-10s in 25 starts on TOUR (T6/2019 Arnold Palmer Invitational, T3/2019 PGA Championship)
- Scottie Scheffler (T12/-2) and Viktor Hovland (T29/+1) are the leading rookies in the FedExCup standings seeking the Arnold Palmer Award as PGA TOUR Rookie of the Year at the end of the season; Hovland (No. 21) is currently 107 FedExCup points ahead of Scheffler (No. 26)
- Defending champion Patrick Cantlay (T9/-3) closed the third round with three consecutive bogeys; began the week sharing the low scoring average at the Memorial Tournament with Bryson DeChambeau (MC) 69.25/minimum 10 rounds
- With rounds of 72-68-79 this week, **Jim Furyk** is the player with the most rounds below par at the Memorial Tournament (52), surpassing Jay Haas (51); with 60, sits behind Haas (68) as the players with the most rounds of par or better at the Memorial Tournament
- After making the cut on the number, **Brendon Todd** (T18/-1), a two-time winner this season, notched five birdies and a bogey en route to a 4-under 68, the low score of the day, later matched by Jon Rahm
- The 2020 U.S. Open is offering an exemption to the two leading non-exempt players who finish in the top 10 (and ties) of this week's Memorial Tournament; through 54 holes, the two leading non-exempt players are **Ryan Palmer** (T2) and **Henrik Norlander** (T5)
- Most over-par thru 54 holes this season: +728/The Honda Classic, +585/Arnold Palmer Invitational, +522/the Memorial Tournament
