Things to Know

- Tiger Woods tied Sam Snead's TOUR record of 82 career victories with his three-shot win at the ZOZO CHAMPIONSHIP
- Woods has now converted 25 of 25 leads of three shots or more after 54 holes and 44 of 46 solo 54-hole leads
- In the first ever PGA TOUR event in his home country, Japan's Hideki Matsuyama (-16) finished solo second
- Making his season debut, 2019 FedExCup champion Rory McIlroy finished T3 (-13)
- Gary Woodland recorded his fourth consecutive top-five in Asia with a solo-fifth
- Woods' victory continues a streak of seven 54-hole leader/co-leaders going on to win this season. The last time the first seven events of the season were won by the leader/co-leader entering the final round was 1979 (9)
- Woods' 82nd career victory comes at age 43. Sam Snead's 82nd came at age 52

- Earns his 82nd PGA TOUR victory in his 359th start at the age of 43 years, 9 months, 28 days
- Collects 500 points to move to No. 8 in the FedExCup standings
- 14th career victory when leading or co-leading after each round, most of any player since 1983
- Japan is the seventh country where Woods has won a PGA TOUR event USA, England, Scotland, Spain, Canada and Ireland
- Owns the highest career winning percentage (minimum of 200 starts) in PGA TOUR history at 22.8%

- Has converted 44 of 46 times (95.6%) when holding the outright 54-hole lead. Only two times he has failed to convert the solo 54-hole lead were the 1996 Quad City Classic and 2009 PGA Championship
- Has converted 55 of 59 (93.2%) times he's held the 54-hole lead/co-lead including his last nine consecutive
- Fifth PGA TOUR winner (since 2003) to play their opening three holes in their opening round in 3-over or worse and go onto win. Ben Crane/2003 AT&T Classic, Vijay Singh/2004 RBC Canadian Open, Bubba Watson/2014 Genesis Open, Rory McIlroy/2016 Dell Technologies Championship are the only other players to do so
- Played the par-3s in 9-under, his career-best par-3 performance in an event on TOUR and best in the field by four shots. One of only six players since 1983 to play the par-3s in 9-under or better en route to victory
- Carded 27 birdies, seven more birdies than any other player in the field
- Has posted PGA TOUR wins in 19 different seasons, beginning in 1996
- Eight wins in his first start of the season 1997 Sentry Tournament of Champions, 2000 Sentry Tournament of Champions, 2003 Buick Invitational, 2006 Buick Invitational, 2007 Buick Invitational, 2008 Buick Invitational, 2013 Farmers Insurance Open, 2019 ZOZO CHAMPIONSHIP
- 19-under 261 ties the third lowest 72-hole score of his career. Best 72-hole career score is 257 (-23) at the 2007 TOUR Championship
- Ranked third in the field in greens in regulation hit with 55/72 (76%)
- Ranked T4 in putts per hole with 1.54
- Finished 13th in the final Presidents Cup rankings in August and has an opportunity to make himself one of four captain's picks when he decides which players will fill out his U.S. Team. If he is picked, Woods would be the second playing-captain in Presidents Cup history, joining Hale Irwin, who was a playing captain in the inaugural playing in 1994

PGA TOUR Commissioner Jay Monahan comments on Tiger Woods tying PGA TOUR all-time victories record

On behalf of the PGA TOUR, I would like to congratulate Tiger Woods for tying Sam Snead's all-time PGA TOUR victories record of 82 at the inaugural ZOZO CHAMPIONSHIP. Today, we celebrate both Tiger and Sam Snead as they share a record that, given how difficult it is to win just once on the PGA TOUR, should sit squarely alongside the greatest accomplishments in sporting history. Tiger has inspired us throughout his career with his talent, passion and the ability to shine in big moments, and he continues to defy even the most outsized expectations with performances like we saw this week. Our fans certainly have a lot to look forward to in the coming season as Tiger sets his sights on win No. 83 – and more, I would suspect -- competing against many of the players he helped inspire along the way.

Hideki Matsuyama (2nd/-16)

- Finished the highest of nine Japanese players in the field
- 16-under 264 ties the lowest 72-hole score of his career. Previously posted a 264 at the 2017 WGC-FedEx St. Jude Invitational
- Back-to-back top-three finishes after a T3 at THE CJ CUP @ NINE BRIDGES in his last start
- Five-time PGA TOUR winner is No. 9 in the FedExCup standings following his runner-up
- Finished ninth in the 2019 FedExCup standings with seven top-10s in 23 starts
- Qualified for the International Team for the 2019 Presidents Cup in Melbourne, Australia in December after finishing second in points

Additional Player Notes

- 2019 PGA TOUR Rookie of the Year **Sungjae Im** (T3/-13) posted his second top-three finish of the 2019-20 season
- **Xander Schauffele**, who finished No. 2 in the 2019 FedExCup standings, finished T10 in his first start of the 2019-20 season. Schauffele's mother, Ping Yi, grew up in Japan. Schauffele will attempt to defend his title at this week's World Golf Championships-HSBC Champions
- Corey Conners finished 13th in the final standings for the International Presidents Cup team with the top eight earning automatic bids in August but has posted three consecutive top-15s with a season-best T6 this week. International Team Captain Ernie Els makes his four captain's picks on November 7.
- Gary Woodland (5th/-12) finished 10th in the final standing for the United States Presidents Cup team with the top eight earning automatic bids in August. Woodland has never played in a Ryder Cup or Presidents Cup team but has recorded back-to-back top-fives (T3/THE CJ CUP @ NINE BRIDGES, 5th/ZOZO CHAMPIONSHIP) in his bid to impress Captain Tiger Woods in the final fall events before the captains pick selections are made on November 7
- Following his victory at THE CJ CUP @ NINE BRIDGES, **Justin Thomas** (T17/-7) finished with a final-round 65. The 2017 FedExCup champion is projected to move to No. 2 in the 2020 FedExCup standings

• **Byeong Hun An** (T8/-10) recorded his second consecutive top-10 and third of the 2019-20 season. An finished 15th in the final International Presidents Cup team standings and is looking to impress in advance of Captain Ernie Els selecting his four captain's picks on November 7
